Fourth Sunday of Lent

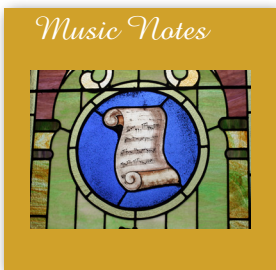

THE SOUNDS OF SILENCE

When visiting the Sistine Chapel in Rome, there are signs everywhere that tell you to be quiet, as it is both a holy place and a museum. While gazing at Michelangelo's famous ceiling, a Security Officer will intermittently bellow out, "Silenzio" to silence the crowd – which can often get quite loud! After a short silence, the chatter begins again and the cycle repeats itself (I have often wondered if they get tired of saying that all day long!). Try as I might, I, too, find it hard to be silent when looking at "The Last Judgement" in person. There is definitely a lot to talk about!

In music, rests and silence are sometimes more important than the notes. Rests are necessary – not only to allow the musician to physically breathe, but to allow the audience space to "hear" the music. Take the spiritual, "Calvary," for instance. After each musical phrase on the word, "Calvary," there is a rest. Imagining that road to Calvary, one can invariably hear the sound of a whip during that rest. And listen carefully after a pianist plays the final notes of a Chopin Nocturne. A great pianist will keep the pedal down until all the sounds dissipate, then lift their foot off the pedal and sit a minute or so more in silence allowing the audience to hear those final notes drift away. These musical moments of silence



can be very profound. The Church also calls for silence in our liturgies. At The Madeleine, our cue for silence is a combination of the gong which we hear three times, and the Lector's introduction – which allows us time to prepare our hearts before the Gathering Chant. Before each proclamation

of scripture, you will notice the lector or cantor will wait a minute or so (about the length of a Hail Mary) before they begin. This allows time for the congregation to hear and meditate on the words of the scripture, whether it is read or sung. After Communion, there is time to reflect and pray in silence before the final blessing. Even on Good Friday, there are several minutes of silence when the priest lies prostrate with arms outstretched on the altar. These can be powerful moments of silence - so resist the temptation to check your phone, read the bulletin, or write out your to-do list during these times and the liturgy will most certainly be a more fulfilling experience!

In a world where we are constantly bombarded with noise, I can't help but be reminded of that old Simon and Garfunkel tune, "The Sound of Silence" – for it is only in the sound of silence that we can truly hear God speaking to our hearts.

- ▶ Please do not come to Mass if you have any of the following symptoms: Cough, fever, headache, muscle aches.

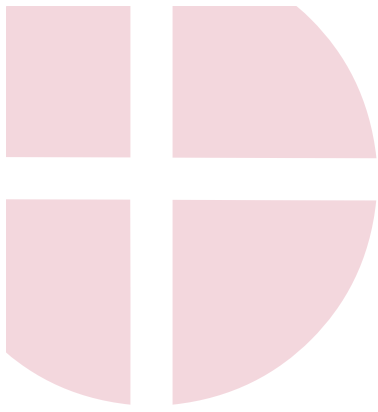
We will continue to livestream Mass on our YouTube channel until further notice.

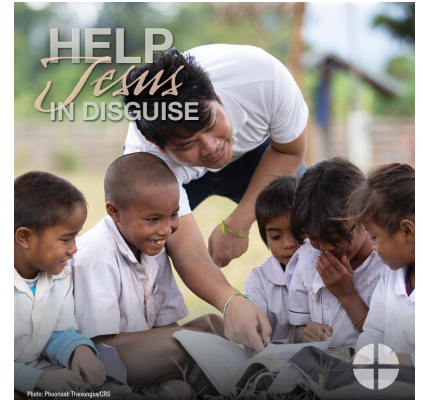
The Fourth Sunday of Lent

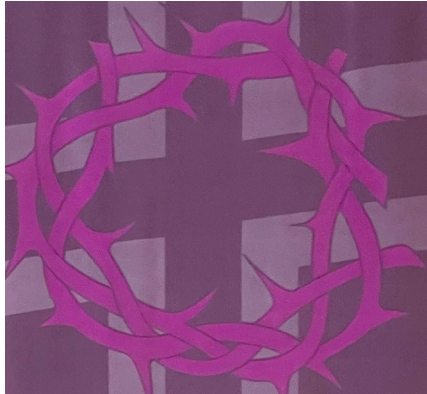

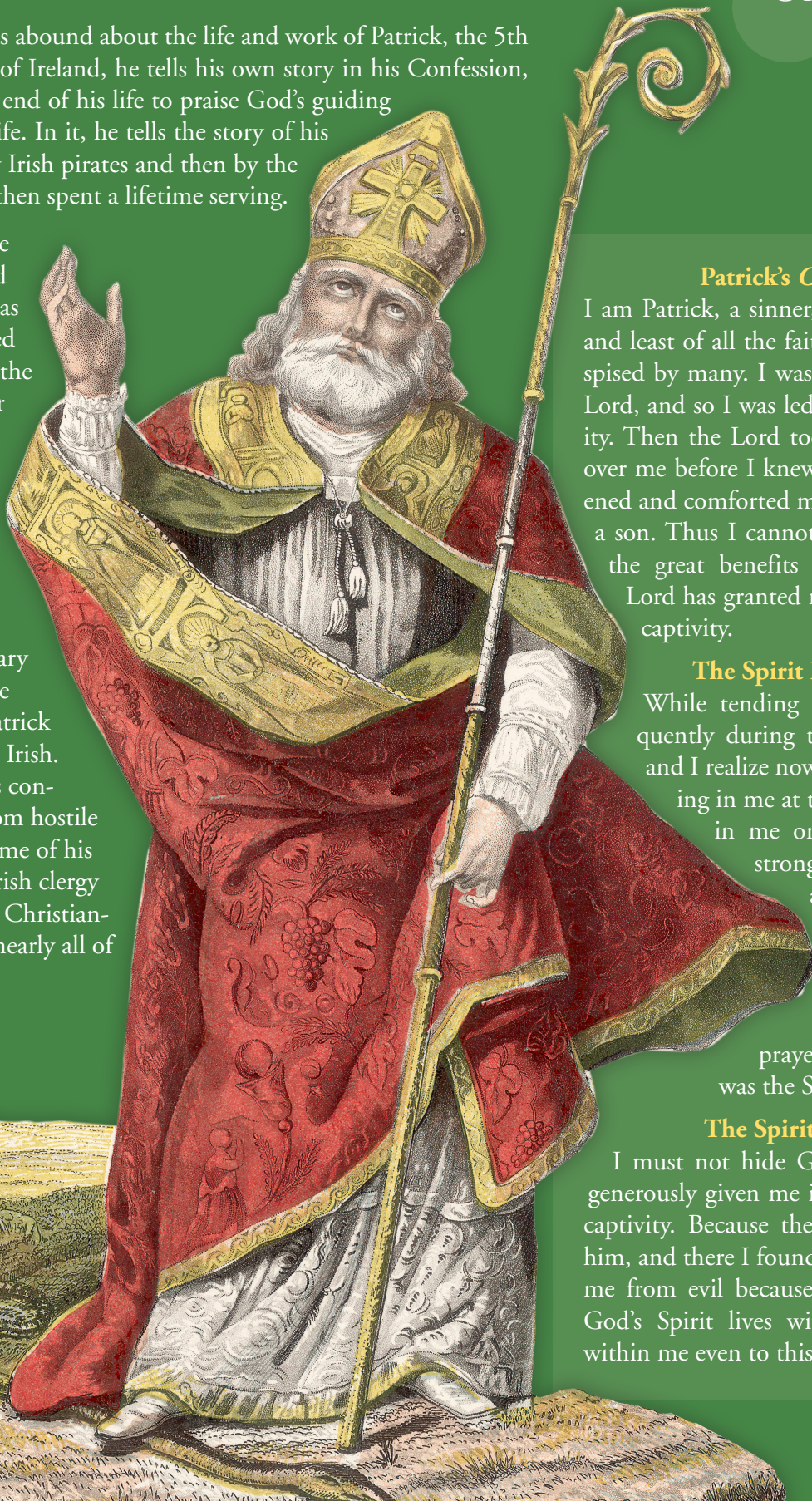


ST. PATRICK

THE APOSTLE
OF IRELAND

Although legends abound about the life and work of Patrick, the 5th century Apostle of Ireland, he tells his own story in his Confession, written near the end of his life to praise God's guiding presence in his life. In it, he tells the story of his captivity, first by Irish pirates and then by the Lord, whom he then spent a lifetime serving.

Kidnapped at age 16 by pirates and taken to Ireland as a slave, he worked as a shepherd in the mountains. After 6 years, he escaped and, after many adventures, returned to Britain and eventually became a priest. When a missionary was needed, Pope Celestine sent Patrick to evangelize the Irish. Although he was constantly at risk from hostile pagans, by the time of his death, a native Irish clergy was in place and Christianity had reached nearly all of Ireland.



Patrick's Confession

I am Patrick, a sinner, the most unlearned and least of all the faithful, and utterly despised by many. I was ignorant of the true Lord, and so I was led to Ireland in captivity. Then the Lord took pity and watched over me before I knew him. God strengthened and comforted me as a father consoles a son. Thus I cannot remain silent about the great benefits and graces that the Lord has granted me in the land of my captivity.

The Spirit Prays within Us

While tending sheep, I prayed frequently during the day and night—and I realize now, the spirit was burning in me at that time. Once I saw in me one who was praying strongly, with sighs. I was amazed and astonished, and pondered who it was who prayed in me; but at the end of the prayer, it was clear that it was the Spirit.

The Spirit Lives in Us

I must not hide God's gift, which was generously given me in the country of my captivity. Because then I sincerely sought him, and there I found him. God protected me from evil because, I fervently believe, God's Spirit lives within me and works within me even to this day.

ST. PATRICK: COMPASSION IN ACTION

St. Patrick is a good model for our lives today as we struggle to put our compassion into action to make our world more like the way God wants it to be.

Attuned to God's Presence

As Patrick's *Confession* reveals, his life was grounded in a deep trinitarian awareness of God's presence in himself and in the world around him. We too learn to discover Christ's presence in ourselves and our world. We look out at the world through eyes of faith to discover the meaning of our history and our situation in the context of God's plan to reorder our world into right relationships (justice). We scrutinize the signs of the times to discover "what may be genuine signs of the presence or the purpose of God" (Vatican Council II, *Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World*, #11).

- *What can you recall about your "call" or invitation to follow Jesus in a more adult way?*
- *How have you experienced God inviting you to a deeper prayer life both as an individual and as a member of your parish?*

Acting with Compassion and Justice

Becoming more keenly aware of God's presence moves us to act to continue Jesus' works of compassion and justice.

Compassion calls on us to aid the victims of social evil by providing more immediate assistance to those who are poor, hungry and in need food and shelter by doing the corporal works of mercy (see the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, #2447).

Justice calls on us to change the structures of society to eliminate their sinfulness and conform more closely with Jesus' vision of rightly ordered relationships (justice). Since the institutions of society are so complex, their structural evil is often so hidden and so tenacious that it cannot be eradicated by a single individual. Consequently, working for social justice to eliminate this social sin involves joining with others to change the societal structures that conceal their corrosive evil.

- *In what ways are you experiencing God's bringing you to a new awareness of God's values?*
- *How can you act more justly and establish right relationships in your household? at your work? in your parish? in your community?*



ST. PATRICK'S PRAYER

This popular prayer attributed to St. Patrick is often called his "breastplate" because in the first part he imagines God's protection like battle armor to protect him from all the dangers he might face that day. In the second part he then calls on Christ to be with him and in him and for the grace to recognize Christ in others as he goes about his day.

I arise today through
God's strength to pilot me,
God's might to uphold me,
God's wisdom to guide me,
God's eye to see before me,
God's ear to hear me,
God's word to speak for me,
God's hand to guard me,
God's way to lie before me,
God's shield to protect me,
God's host to secure me—
against snares of devils,
against temptations and vices,
against inclinations of nature,
against everyone who shall wish me
ill, afar and anear,
alone and in a crowd.
Christ, be with me,
Christ before me,
Christ behind me,
Christ in me,
Christ beneath me,
Christ above me,
Christ on my right,
Christ on my left,
Christ where I lie,
Christ where I sit,
Christ where I arise,
Christ in the heart
of everyone who thinks of me,
Christ in the mouth
of everyone who speaks of me,
Christ in every eye that sees me,
Christ in every ear that hears me.
Salvation is of the Lord.
Salvation is of the Christ.
May your salvation,
O Lord, be ever with us. *Amen.*



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
