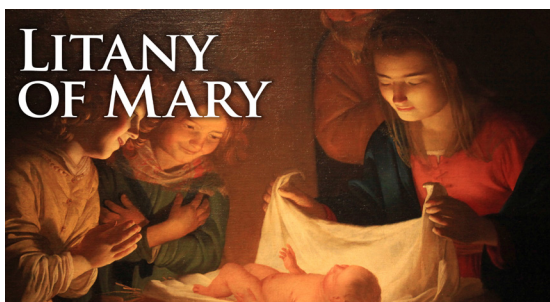
A May tradition at The Madeleine: celebrating the Month of Mary and Mother's Day in a special way!

FIRST COMMUNION CONTINUES

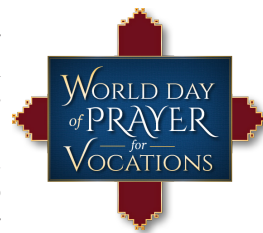

FULL, ACTIVE AND CONSCIOUS PARTICIPATION

Now what? So far, it is Jesus that has done the “heavy lifting”—suffering, dying and rising from the dead for our sins. Now it is up to the disciples. For the next 40 days Jesus continues to appear to the disciples—preparing them for their role in the story of the resurrection. He



very nature of the liturgy. Such participation by the Christian people as “a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God’s own people” (1 Pt 2:9; see 2:4-5), is their right and duty by reason of their baptism.

There you have it! The textbook version of what “good” liturgy is

in our Vatican II liturgies. In the interest of the pandemic, those four words have taken on a new meaning altogether. In Music Ministry, where choirs have been silenced and singers are muted, we have been forced to look “inward” to accomplish those objectives. So, although outwardly we are not able to sing robustly and participate fully, I like to think that our inward selves are still “belting” out the hymns—and actively “listening” to the melodious sounds of the human voice in our minds! Jesus reminds us that we are ALL missionary disciples—and yes, even in the midst of a pandemic we are called to full, active and conscious participation—if only in our hearts.

spends a great deal of time just getting them to believe that it is really him in the flesh—showing the disciples the wounds in his hands and feet. Just when they thought their work was done, Jesus reminds them their work—and ours—as missionary disciples has just begun!

HELP BEAUTIFY OUR CITY ... ONE BLOCK AT A TIME

Adopt One Block is a local nonprofit encouraging local residents to adopt and care for our environment one block at a time. Participants choose a location and commit to weekly walking the public portion of the block, picking up litter and debris, and properly recycling or disposing of the trash. Anyone, any age, can participate (when and how you do this is your choice). Here's how to become a Block Ambassador:

- ▶ Select a block anywhere in the local area you would like to adopt.
- ▶ Submit the block to the organizer at www.adoptoneblock.org
- ▶ Request collection supplies you may need
 - ▶ – trash grabber, gloves, trash bag.
- ▶ Begin weekly walks of your adopted block.
- ▶ **Let us know what block you have adopted**, and share your stories and photos with us at bulletin@themadeleine.edu with subject line "Adopt One Block."
- ▶ Spread the word with friends and family about how they can become Block Ambassadors too.

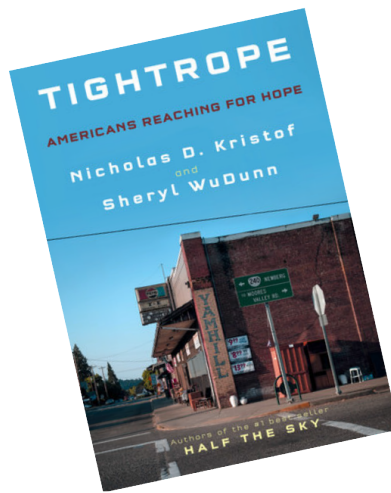
CATHOLIC HOME MISSIONS APPEAL

RECYCLING PROGRAMS EXPANDED AT THE MADELEINE

Marked collection bins in the breezeway facing 23rd Ave.

The Madeleine's Laudato Si' Circle and Care for Creation Ministry have joined with USA-based recycler, Terracycle, to offer our parish, school, and community opportunities to responsibly recycle specific items (primarily plastics) not generally handled at curbside. Terracycle has added more manufacturers to its program, and in turn, we have expanded our recycling offerings. Here is a current listing of what we are collecting. Please keep this in mind:

- ▶ Do not include garbage or items not specifically mentioned in the descriptions.
- ▶ Empty containers of contents. No need to wash first; ensure packaging is dry.



STYROFOAM AND POLYSTYRENE

We have identified a local recycler of Styrofoam and Polystyrene (anything marked #6 like block packaging, meat trays, and to-go containers).



LATE JULY® SNACKS

All Late July® snack packaging as seen in these examples. Limited to Late July brand only.



GILLETTE® AND VENUS RAZORS AND RAZOR BLADES

All brands of blades and razors (systems and disposable units, and replaceable-blade cartridge units), rigid plastic packaging, and flexible plastic bag packaging.



BIC WRITING INSTRUMENTS AND PACKAGING

All brands of empty writing instruments, glue sticks, water-color dispensers, highlighters, paint sets, and flexible packaging.
