GOODBYE CHURCH CARPET!

Over the next few weeks and several months, you will begin seeing some changes to the main church worship space. On Monday, May 17, we will begin removing the green carpeting from the church. This will be a process of removing the carpet, removing the glue, and then polishing and repairing the hard floors underneath. The sanctuary/altar area is a light colored marble



floor with brown trim, and the rest of the church is the terrazzo that you can see in the vestibule or under the pews. This in turn will lead to necessary changes in the acoustic tiles in the large window bays overhead, and then painting of the interior of the church later in the year. We are excited about bringing back some of the elegant features of the church as originally designed.

How to Pay

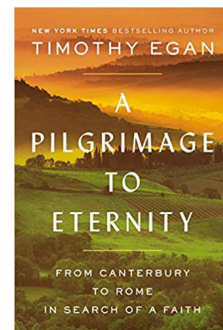

THE MONTH OF MARY

If there is one thing that I have learned after 25+ years of Music Ministry, that no matter what is going on in our temporal world, music is and remains constant—it cannot be silenced. A familiar song is often more than just a catchy tune. Heard again and again, it is an anchor that can lift us up in joy and sorrow, bring comfort to our soul, and help us to pray, think and to experience God in our lives.

That being said, there are certain songs that have become part

of the fabric of our Catholic liturgies and, year in and year out, they help define our worship. For example, no one can fathom a Christmas liturgy without “Silent Night.” And what would Easter be without “Jesus Christ is Risen Today.” The same can be said for other liturgical seasons and events we experience each year, such as singing the “Litany of the Saints” during the month of November or hearing a chorus of “Morning Has Broken when celebrating Care for Creation.

This month we honor Mary, the mother of God. The idea of honoring Mary can be traced back to the Baroque period, while its roots actually go back as far as the Ancient Greeks. Although it didn’t always appear in May, in 1945 Pope Pius XII solidified May as a Marian month; years later, the Second Vatican Council “sealed the deal” when May 31 became the Feast of the Visitation of Mary. In

our present day, the month of Mary often dovetails with the pageantry of May crownings and the tradition of celebrating Mother’s Day.

From a musical perspective, it is considered obligatory to sing an Ave Maria or two during the month of May. This ancient prayer has been set to music for centuries—as far back as the medieval period. I have my favorites, of course, which include that of Schubert (the one most everyone knows)

and Gounod (based upon the Bach prelude in C), as well as one by Russian composer Sergei Rachmaninoff (that I personally consider the most beautiful one ever written). Fragments of the prayer also appear in many contemporary Catholic songs. You may recognize the Litany of Mary with the words “ora pro nobis” (pray for us), followed by the refrain of “Ave Maria” (reminiscent of the hymn, “Immaculate Mary”) that we have begun singing this month. It is more than just a fitting backdrop for the photos of our own mothers. Rather, with its simple beauty, it is the musical glue that joins our earthly mothers to that of Mary in heaven—and will no doubt become part of the fabric of our worship at The Madeleine for many years to come.

THE MADELEINE FAMILY REMEMBERS

JOHN DEBENEDETTI

A Funeral Mass was celebrated for longtime parishioner John DeBenedetti on Saturday at The Madeleine.

John Albert DeBenedetti, 85, passed away peacefully on Thursday, April 29, 2021.

He was born in Portland, Oregon, to Joseph and Elva DeBenedetti, early owners of F.H. Steinbart Co.

He attended Benson High School, class of 1952. Following graduation from the University of Portland, he began his career as an accountant.

He was blessed with a large and loving family. He celebrated 58 years of marriage to the love of his life, MaryKay DeBenedetti.

An expert and pioneer in the craft beer making industry, together with his wife, John was owner of F.H. Steinbart Co., the nation's oldest home brewing and wine making supply company, located in S.E. Portland for 103 years.

An avid and competitive sail boat racing enthusiast, John's passion for sailing began while participating in the Sea Scouts at age 13. Known as Father Lightning, John was a charter member of the Vancouver Lake Sailing Club (VLSC), and enjoyed fostering an interest in sailing in others.

A devout Catholic his entire life, and member of the St. Mary Magdalene Parish, John served as President of



the Parents Club for several years. He worked tirelessly as a volunteer in support of Maddie's Cart to feed the hungry.

He is survived by his wife MaryKay, five children, five grandchildren, and his sisters, Arlene, Harvey, and Judy DeBenedetti. He will be greatly missed for his humorous, silly side, and remembered for his love of the Oregon Coast and enjoying a good game of Bocci Ball.

A celebration of his life and sharing of stories is planned for an outdoor location in Portland this summer.

NORTHWEST FAMILY SERVICES PROGRAMS

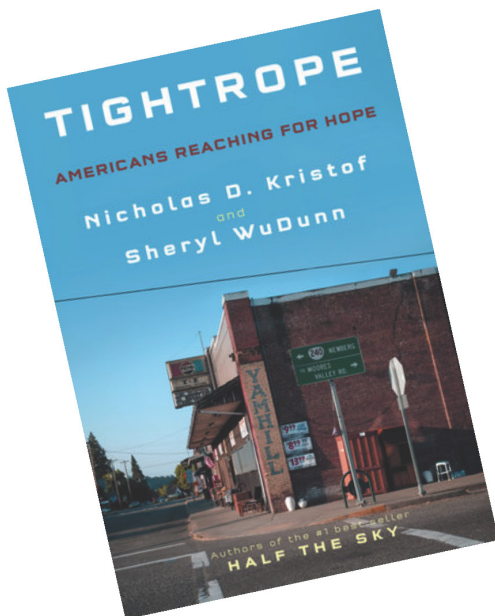
Northwest Family Services will present Mother-Daughter and Father-Son Adolescent Development Programs on Sunday, May 16, 2021 from 3-5 pm.

Our Lady of Fatima

We celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima on May 13.



Mary appeared to three peasant children near Fatima, Portugal, six times between May 13 and October 13, 1917, and asked for prayers for world peace and an end to World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia. She entrusted the children with three secrets, regarding devotion to her Immaculate Heart, a vision of hell, and a "bishop in white" shot by soldiers firing bullets and arrows. Many connect the third secret to the attempted assassination of Blessed Pope John Paul II on May 13, 1981, and the pope thanked Mary for guiding the bullet and saving him. At the Vatican, Pope Francis has stood before the statue of Our Lady from the Fatima shrine and formally entrusted the world to Mary.

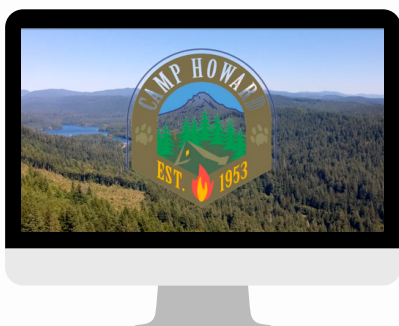
