WHY WE SING

To sing or not to sing? That has been the question these past several months. And while our choirs and congregations have been virtually silenced, it seems that it is finally time to raise our voices in song once again. That being said, it is a good time to remind us why we sing at all.

At its primal level, we sing because God gave us the gift of the human voice. We were born with it and because of that, it can never be taken away—even in a pandemic. A baby “sings” even before they speak. Throughout history, human beings have looked to song to inspire, to pray, and to express human emotion. In times of war and peace, in joy and in sorrow, we sing! In our secular world, we sing “the blues,” of love and lost love, and everything in between. And most of all, as Christians we sing our praise to God.

Throughout scripture, there are numerous references to music and song. In Ephesians 5:19 where Paul says to (address) one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and playing to the Lord in your hearts. And in Chronicles 16:9 where David says, “Sing to Him; sing praise to Him; tell about all His wonderful works!” And in Psalm 40; “He put a new song in my mouth, a hymn of praise to our God.”

And so it is no wonder that In the church document, “Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship Chapter I: Why We Sing,” it says: “God has bestowed upon his people the gift of song. God dwells within each human person, in the place where music takes its source.”



Indeed, God, the giver of song, is present whenever his people sing his praises.

Therefore, it stands to reason that if God is present in those who sing—singing builds the kingdom of God. And at The Madeleine, whether in the pew, on the altar, or in the choir loft, there are many opportunities to do just that!

PARISH STEWARDSHIP COMMITMENT LETTERS ARE IN THE MAIL

Our Parish Stewardship Letters for the 2021-22 fiscal year are in the mail. If you have not yet received your letter, you will receive it soon.

Since we did not run a Stewardship Campaign last year due to the pandemic, we thought a review of what you might expect would be a good idea.

The feature most folks are drawn to

is the graph in the middle of the page that shows your past 5-years' giving in comparison to parish averages.

This letter, and the graph, show giving for our Parish Offertory, Second Collections and our Capital Repair Fund (used for maintenance and repairs on campus). **This graph does NOT include Old Church Capital Campaign gifts.**

By The Numbers

1 Giving History. We heard from some people that they didn't always remember how much they had been giving—so when it came time to pledge for the new year, they would have to dig through bank records. These green bars show how much you've given each year, averaged by month for simplicity—in Parish Offertory, Second Collections and Capital Repair gifts—for each of the past 5 years. **These bars do NOT include Old Church Capital Campaign giving or pledges.**

2 Parishioner Average Giving. We also thought it would be helpful to know, for context, the average monthly contribution per contributing parish family over each of the past 5 years.

3 Contact information. We have included what we hope is your current contact information. See an error or a phone or email missing? Just make the correction when you send in your commitment card!

4 Suggested 2021-22 monthly amount. This is an amount for you to consider for your 2021-22 giving. It reflects the greater of your prior year monthly average plus our requested 6% increase, or the parish average. It's just a suggestion...we are grateful for any amount.

5 Your Commitment. Here, we list the commitments for the coming year.

▶ **Combined Monthly Commitment.** The amount here is intended to cover not only your Parish Offertory, the main fund that our parish runs on, but Second Collections and Capital Repair Fund also. **This does NOT include any gifts to our Old Church Project Capital Campaign.**

▶ **Additional Gifts:** If you did not include Capital Repair Fund and Second Collections in the past, please consider including a monthly amount here.

▶ **Total Per Month:** If you included Additional Amounts, please total all the lines above for your total monthly commitment.

6 Method of payment: We are really hoping people will experience the convenience of automatic electronic payments this year. Complete instructions are on the back of your commitment card.



Dear John & Jane,

Thank you for your support of The Madeleine! Every family, every person in the parish benefits from your generosity. Your ongoing support is critical to the ministries and mission of The Madeleine.

As you know, the pandemic has been difficult to navigate. Most of our supporters have been steadfast, but not everyone has been able to support the parish at their previous levels. And, due to the physical, emotional and economic hardships imposed by the pandemic, we did not pursue a Parish Stewardship Campaign last year. Which leads me to ask for your help this year.

With increased costs for 2021—including a planned cost-of-living pay increase for your parish staff who received none last year—I am asking all parishioners to consider a 6% or greater increase over their prior giving amounts. Or, if possible, to increase giving up to our parish average amount, as noted on the Stewardship Commitment Form below. I know I can count on your generosity, and I remain very grateful for your support of our journey.

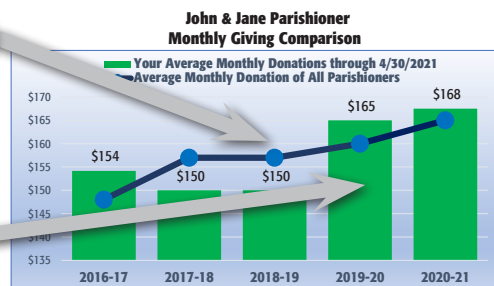

THE MADELEINE FAMILY REMEMBERS

MARY MACKIN

A Funeral Mass was held for longtime parishioner Mary Mackin on Thursday, June 10 at 10:00 at The Madeleine.

Mary Annette Hanover was born December 11, 1922 in Dubuque, Iowa to Helen Pearl and Henry Joseph Hanover. Mary was soon joined by her two beloved sisters, Harriet and Joan.



Faith. Mary was a Roman Catholic. Through her participation in church activities, her career, and her way of life Mary lived her faith as a woman for others. She graduated from Mercy Catholic Hospital's Nursing School in 1944. While ministering there she met Bill Mackin who was a patient recovering from a battle wound received during WWII. The two were married in the Church in 1948 and moved west. Bill attended the University of Portland, and Mary continued her career at Providence Hospital. For nearly four decades, she provided comfort, care and love to countless patients in the respectful manner of her Catholic faith. Mary and Bill were founding members of Portland's St. Mary Magdalene (The Madeleine) Parish, where she attended religiously until the pandemic. She was a Church choir member for many years and her five children all received Catholic school education through high school.

Family. Mary was the eldest of three daughters and learned traditional skills from both her father and her mother. Women were typically not taught how to use tools, or how to maintain and fix things around the house, but her father shared this expertise with her. Her mother taught Mary other keen domestic skills that were manifest in her famous pies, cakes, gardening skills, and fastidious house cleaning. She grew bountiful produce in a tiny garden plot and canned the extra fruits and vegetables. Her 2021 vegetable garden continues to flourish.

Mary's family was central to her life and she was central to our family. She leaves behind five children—Patrick, Timothy, Cherril, Mary (Mark) and Martha (Stein)—as well as 12 grandchildren (John, Kevin and James Mackin; Kerry Decker-Cohen, Margaret and John Decker; Kate, Daniel and MaryRose Zipse; Erika, Stein W. (Will) and Natalie Nielsen) and two great granddaughters. When her first granddaughter was learning to speak, she could not say grandma. She called Mary "Gigi."

Fun. Gigi celebrated her 90th birthday by taking a busload of friends to Chinook Winds Casino. Mary Annette would never turn down a chance for a trip to a Casino, including just 8 weeks ago in Palm Springs! But don't count the card games she played as FUN. That was serious business. She was a wicked card player.

Mary led the way into life for her two beloved sisters, Harriet and Joan, but in death she would trail them, as well as her parents, her loving husband, William D. Mackin, and grandson Thomas Mackin.

ROBERT (ROBBIE) RENOUARD

A Funeral Service was held for Robbie Renouard on Saturday, June 12 at The Madeleine.

Our beloved Robbie tragically passed away in an automobile accident on June 3. He was 19 years old. He attended Alameda Elementary, Beaumont Middle School, then graduated from Grant High School in 2020.



From Day 1, he absolutely adored music. He was dancing to the soundtracks of musicals (Chicago!) as soon as he could pull himself up, going to music festivals in bicycle carriers as a toddler, and ultimately developing an appreciation and encyclopedic knowledge of virtually every style of music. He also loved playing music. He started with piano, then excelled at trumpet in middle school, thanks to lessons from his Bapa Ron. In high school he gravitated to guitar, both acoustic and electric—self taught. He had a wonderful ear for music. His ability to hear a song and then replicate it on piano or guitar was truly a sight (and sound) to behold.

Many of Robbie's early years were spent traveling with his family, fostering a love of adventure he never lost. He and his younger brother Matthew did everything together through summer-long home exchanges in Europe, and while living for two years in Auckland, New Zealand. The strong bond they formed through so much shared time and adventure gifted Matthew and Robbie a closeness that was wonderful to see.

Robbie loved activities with action and a hint of danger. If there were rocks to climb, skateparks to conquer, slopes to shred—he was all in. He had one of the sharpest, wittiest, most creative-think-outside-the-box brains. He wrote beautifully. He loved to sketch. He was a deep thinker. In conversations we were constantly amazed by the unique way he could connect the dots. His intense desire to learn about—and debate—things from all angles contributed to his plans to study philosophy in college.

Robbie had a huge heart. He wanted so much for those around him to be happy, and he worried about his family, his friends, even strangers. He literally gave the coat off his back to a person he felt needed it more. He was a sensitive soul, and sentimental. His bedside table was jammed with cards from his grandparents, special photos, notes, and little mementos from things he'd done.

There is now a gaping hole in our lives we will never fill. We believe our wonderful Robbie is looking down on us all with his million-dollar smile, wearing Dad's old fishing hat, and playing beautiful guitar riffs.

Robbie is survived by his parents, Doug and Pattie, brother Matthew, his grandparents Ed and Bunny Renouard and Ron and Pam Tobias, as well as his extended family of aunts, uncles and cousins, and dog Chelsea.

You'll be in our hearts forever, Robbie. Thank you so much for the wonderful gift of 19 years.
