REVISED COVID-19 PARISH GUIDANCE FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE

These new guidelines, approved by Archbishop Sample and effective June 30, 2021, replace all previous pandemic protocols established by the Archdiocese.

Dispensation from the Obligation to attend Mass

Effective Friday, July 16, 2021 Archbishop Sample rescinds the dispensation from the obligation to attend Holy Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation. Canon Law still allows those who are vulnerable, sick, or who have other grave reasons, to miss Holy Mass if necessary. Those unable to attend the Sunday Eucharist for such reasons are asked to honor the Lord in another way that day by watching a livestreamed Mass, praying the rosary, reading sacred Scripture, or otherwise setting aside time to be with the Lord.

General Principles—All indoor liturgical celebrations and faith gatherings are allowed to take place without capacity limitations, social distancing, sign-up systems, or segregation between those vaccinated and those unvaccinated.

- Masks may be worn but are not required.
- Implementation of these guidelines is left to the prudential judgment of the pastor.

Parish Ministry—Pastors and their staff and volunteers are encouraged to foster the life and activities of the parish with renewed enthusiasm. This applies to all faith gatherings and parish activities, including sacramental preparation programs, faith formation, bible studies and vacation bible schools.

Liturgical Practices—All previous liturgical restrictions are lifted, except for the following:

- The Precious Blood will not be offered to the faithful.
- The Sign of Peace will not be exchanged through physical contact.
- It is up to the pastor to determine if there will be a presentation of the gifts. It is up to the pastor to determine how the collection will be taken.
- Holy water may return to fonts.

Cleaning—Cleaning after Masses and gatherings is no longer required.

Ventilation—Good ventilation in churches and gathering spaces is encouraged.

Social Gatherings—Social gatherings such as coffee and donuts and wedding and funeral receptions may take place so long as sensible health precautions are taken. This is left to the discretion of the pastor, in consultation with his leadership team.

Livestreaming—Livestreaming of Masses continues to be encouraged.

DOORS—THE GATEWAY TO HEAVEN

The front door of our house is oversized, painted blue and surrounded by a half circle of stained glass on either side. When you open the door, we have the words from St. Francis, "make me a channel of your peace," surrounding the

arched entrance-welcoming all who enter. And taped on the inside of door we have the following excerpt from this week's Gospel; Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and

shake the dust off your feet-a reminder to us as we leave each day to do His work in our lives.

In Church architecture, doors often figure prominently. Often referred to as the gateway to heaven, they symbolize Christ as THE door. The most magnificent doors I have ever seen are the bronze doors to the Baptistry of Florence (Battistero di San Giovanni), located in front of the Duomo (Santa Maria del Fiore). Called The Gates of Paradise (Porta del Paradiso in Italian), they were created by Florentine goldsmith and sculptor Lorenzo Ghiberti between 1425 and 1452. The doors portray scenes from the Old Testament, from Creation to Solomon-and are massive-measuring over 17 feet tall and weigh a total of 3 tons. Known for their vivid illusion of deep

space in relief, this bronze masterpiece is considered one of the most famous works of art in the world. Moreover, through the Porta del Paradiso, some biblical stories were told to the public for the first time after many centuries. These doors

have survived wars, floods, vandalism and pollution. After being dismantled in 1990 for total restoration, they were replaced with a copy. In 2012, 26 years later, the restored doors were encased in plate-glass and displayed in the city's Museo dell'Opera dell

Duomo where they currently remain.

While you don't need an oversized blue front door, or the magnificence of Ghiberti's bronze doors to remind us, as Catholics we enter the gateway to heaven every time we go through the front doors of the church. It is there that we are fed by the word of God, nourished by the Eucharist, and then sent out by way of those same doors to proclaim the good news of Christ. Perhaps the song, "As Christ Is For Us," composed by Janet Sullivan Whitaker, says it best: In the bread we share with the hungry, in the help we give to the poor, in the kindness we show to the stranger we find Christ the open door.

Recycling Programs Expanded at The Madeleine

The Madeleine's Laudato Si' Circle and Care for Creation Ministry have joined with USA-based recycler, Terracycle, to offer our parish, school, and community opportunities to responsibly recycle specific items (primarily plastics) not generally handled at curbside. Terracycle has added more manufacturers to its program, and in turn, we have expanded our recycling offerings. Here is a current listing of what we are collecting. Please keep this in mind:

• Do not include garbage or items not specifically mentioned in the descriptions.

• Empty containers of contents. No need to wash first; ensure packaging is dry.



STYROFOAM AND POLYSTYRENE

We have identified a local recycler of Styrofoam and Polystyrene (anything marked #6 like block packaging, meat trays, and to-go containers).



LATE JULY[®] SNACKS

All Late July[®] snack packaging as seen in these examples. Limited to Late July brand only.



GILLETTE® AND VENUS RAZORS AND RAZOR BLADES
