ARCHBISHOP RESCINDS “DISPENSATION FROM THE OBLIGATION TO ATTEND MASS”

Effective Friday, July 16, 2021 Archbishop Sample rescinded the dispensation from the obligation to attend Holy Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation. Canon Law still allows those who are vulnerable, sick, or who have other grave reasons, to miss Holy Mass if necessary. Those unable to attend the Sunday Eucharist for such reasons

MIRACLES OF GRACE

This week, John's Gospel gives an account of the feeding of the five thousand. It is the only miracle recorded in each one of the four gospels, and the fourth of John's seven signs that Jesus performs. For John, these miracles are "signs" that point to a reality beyond themselves—and to the identity and truth of Jesus.

I can't help but think of this particular gospel when, for years, Michael and I accompanied my mother and her groups around the world to holy sites. Often, we found ourselves in the midst of great crowds—thousands of pilgrims packed into a church, on a mountaintop, or in a tiny village. And I always considered it a miracle that during Mass thousands of people could receive Holy Communion in the space of about 10 minutes (yes, I admit it—I have timed it)! And as an aside, perhaps because I am slightly claustrophobic (I attribute that to my small size and not being able to see overhead), I have also considered it a miracle that no one was ever trampled, acted rude, or panicked when in those massive crowds.

Of course, one does not have to witness the feeding of the five thousand or an expedient distribution of Holy Communion in order to experience God's miracles. In fact, we experience miracles every day that give us a glimpse of Jesus and the divine. Beginning with the miracle of Creation (the gospel of John begins with this discourse), we witness these miracles in the birth of a baby, the death of a loved one, stars that emerge from a darkened sky, the fruits of a well-tended garden, and a myriad of other outward signs that defy plausible earthly explanations. And although we often pray for miraculous healings, good fortune, and other tangible matters, it is most often the miracles that take place in our heart that truly reveal the abundance of God's mercy and love. I call these "miracles of

grace."

As a musician, I have found these "miracles of grace" when I give comfort to a grieving family with a favorite hymn; or when my choir is perfectly aligned on a beautiful chord (admittedly, sometimes a pretty big miracle); or that moment in a performance when Michael and I read each other's musical thoughts. It is that fleeting moment in time that you know, without a doubt, that God is there in your midst.

As Catholics, this "miracle of grace" is the Eucharist. It nourishes our hunger and fills our empty hearts. It is the source and summit of our faith—and, by its very action, connects us to the divine. During the next few weeks in our liturgies, you will hear more about Jesus as the Bread of Life, which means you will hear many songs about the Eucharist. A traditional favorite, "Panis Angelicus," composed by Cezar Franck, is often heard at weddings, funerals and liturgies that focus on the Eucharist. Translated as "Bread of Angels," this song is a verse (also referred to as a "strophe") from the hymn "Sacris Solemniis," which was written by St. Thomas Aquinas for the Feast of Corpus Christi in the 13th century. Throughout the years, it has been performed by tenors Andrea Bocelli, Luciano Pavarotti and others. It was also sung at the Requiem Masses for Robert F. Kennedy and his brother, Edward Kennedy.

In the meantime, I would encourage you to find those every day "miracles of grace" in your life—for they are truly a glimpse of heaven on earth.

RECYCLING PROGRAMS EXPANDED AT THE MADELEINE

Marked collection bins in the breezeway facing 23rd Ave.

The Madeleine's Laudato Si' Circle and Care for Creation Ministry have joined with USA-based recycler, Terracycle, to offer our parish, school, and community opportunities to responsibly recycle specific items (primarily plastics) not generally handled at curbside. Terracycle has added more manufacturers to its program, and in turn, we have expanded our recycling offerings. Here is a current listing of what we are collecting. Please keep this in mind:

- ▶ Do not include garbage or items not specifically mentioned in the descriptions.
- ▶ Empty containers of contents. No need to wash first; ensure packaging is dry.



STYROFOAM AND POLYSTYRENE

We have identified a local recycler of Styrofoam and Polystyrene (anything marked #6 like block packaging, meat trays, and to-go containers).

MARGARET C. BROSNAN SULLIVAN

A funeral Mass will be held for Madeleine High School alumna Margaret Brosnan Sullivan on Thursday, July 29, 11:00 am, at The Madeleine.

Margaret C. Brosnan Sullivan passed away peacefully July 4, 2021 at Hope Village in Canby, Ore. She was 96.

Mrs. Sullivan was born Jan. 21, 1925 in Portland, Ore. She graduated from St. Mary Magdalene High School (The Madeleine) and attended the University of Oregon. In the 1940s, as a young woman of independent spirit, she was one of the early flight attendants for United Airlines, but due to the rules of the time, she had to resign when she married her husband, Thomas D. Sullivan, in 1947.

Mrs. Sullivan was a long-time resident of Lake Oswego, Ore., and a member of Our Lady of the Lake Catholic Church. In later years, she lived at the Calaroga Terrance in Portland. Her love of travel never diminished and following her husband's retirement, they traveled the world together often by freighter. She also enjoyed spending time at the Oregon coast, especially in Arch

Cape and Cannon Beach.

Margaret is survived by her four children: T. Dennis Sullivan and his wife, Susan of Brooklyn, N.Y., Mary K. Lally and her husband, Brian of Canby, Ore., William J. Sullivan of Portland, Ore., and James P. Sullivan and his wife, Missy of Chicago, Ill.; her six grandchildren, David, Steve, Michael, Annie, Riley and Marlena; and her great-grandson, Henry.
