RECYCLING & ADOPT ONE BLOCK NOTES

► **Recycling:** We collect #6 plastic such as Styrofoam, Polystyrene (no black), and clear clamshell. All items must be clean and dry. No dirty materials, please. Other items we collect for recycling are handled by our partner, Terracycle, who can accept recycling with minimal residual food waste, but materials must be dry for shipping.

► **Adopt One Block:** Please keep in mind we can recycle fully extinguished cigarette

butts, ashes, and all associated packaging. Help us collect more of this waste for recycling when you perform your weekly clean up.

Finally, our collection bins are not trash cans. Please refrain from including items not specifically mentioned (see signs with bins for what we can accept).

CONTEMPLATIVE LITURGY IN SOUND AND SPACE

Last Sunday evening, we began a new Contemplative Liturgy in the Old Church. Now, in all the years I have worked in music ministry, I had never really experienced a Contemplative Liturgy. I have been involved in raucous Youth Masses, reverent Latin Masses, and mostly—blended liturgies that reach a wide swath of parishioners. But, helping to create a Contemplative Liturgy—one that focuses on hearing the word of God in quiet and silence—was a new musical and spiritual adventure.

First, it is important to understand that all liturgy, as a whole, IS contemplation. We enter into contemplative prayer from the minute the liturgy begins until its conclusion. The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes the word, “contemplation,” as a “gaze of faith, fixed on Jesus” (2715). The catechism goes on to say that “contemplative prayer is hearing the Word of God” (2716).

Now, with all that contemplation, one might surmise that a Contemplative Liturgy is passive—a quiet respite on a Sunday evening in an otherwise chaotic world. And while on the surface that may be tempting, it could not be further from the truth. The Mass is still the Mass—and always calls for outward “full, active, conscious participation” (another key phrase from The Catechism of the Catholic Church). However, since the main ingredient in a Contemplative Liturgy is silence, much of that participation comes in the form of what I call, active listening. Here, sacred silence does not mean the absence of sound. It merely allows us to hear the word of God in an uncluttered

way. Set against the backdrop of the Old Church, surrounded by candlelight, and punctuated by simple, chant-like melodies, thoughtful proclamations and intentional actions, the liturgical stage is set for a truly meaningful worship experience.

Finally, it is fitting to conclude our Contemplative Liturgy with the singing of the ancient chant, “Salve Regina.” You might know it by the English translation, “Hail, Holy Queen” which is often said at the end of every rosary (not to be confused with the rendition from the movie, “Sister Act”). This Latin chant, sometimes attributed to the 11th Century German monk Hermann of Reichenau, is often regarded as anonymous by most musicologists. Traditionally, Marian antiphons have been sung at the close of Compline (the final church service of the day in the Liturgy of the Hours) since the 13th Century. In the monastic community, tradition has it that the monks chanted the “Salve Regina” on the way to their sleeping quarters whereby they observed silence until morning. In the 18th Century, it was set in its current form and added to a series of prayers said at the end of Low Mass by Pope Leo XIII.

If you are looking for a worship experience that emphasizes silence and encourages “hearing” the word of God in sound and space, I would encourage you to attend the Contemplative Liturgy at 7 pm on Sunday evenings in the Old Church. In the words of Psalm 46; “Be still and know that I am God.”

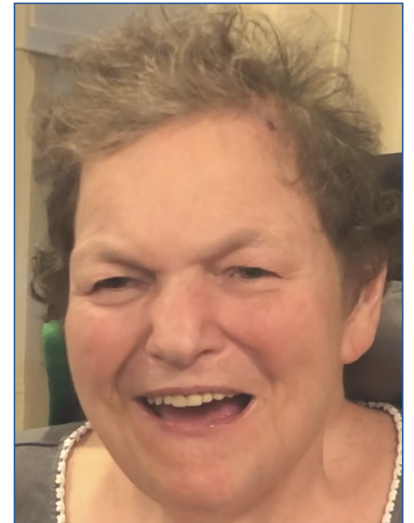

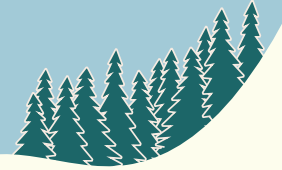

Refresh the Dream. Replace the Turf.

For this year's Madeleine Auction, November 6, the committee has chosen to use their Paddle Raise donation item to replace the aging turf on the Field of Dreams. Below is their writeup. There will be opportunities to donate at the auction, or online at www.themadeleine.edu/turf

The Madeleine Field of Dreams needs a refresh! After 15 years of kids running, kicking, sliding, dodging, and wrestling, the original turf has been completely worn down and is far beyond its intended lifespan. Just as a previous generation of parents, parishioners and friends invested years ago, we need to maintain what has been entrusted to us.

A Brief History of the Field

Back in the 1960s, the entire field was paved in asphalt. Then in the early 2000s a group of devoted Madeleine parents and parishioners had an ambitious, seemingly unattainable dream: replace the cracked, slippery, crumbling, knee-skinning, clothes-tearing, bruise-inducing asphalt playground and create a multi-use field our community could be proud of.

The entire community gathered together...parents, grandparents, parishioners, alumni and friends. They raised money, they donated professional services, they got grants and foundation donations...and they turned that broken-down asphalt patch into a green, fun, beautiful oasis: the Field of Dreams. Their investment of time, talent and treasure made possible the many activities our kids enjoy on the field today: recess, gym class, CYO practices, Jogathons, school field days, epic kickball tournaments, and so much more.

The Field of Dreams is the backyard of our community, where kids drift in to burn off energy before homework and parents chat along the sidelines. Many teens who graduated from The Madeleine return to the field on weekends just to hang out or for extra practice time.

And now, in a time when our children must be physically distanced from one another, the Field of Dreams is where they get a "brain break" to run and reset so they have the capacity to learn.

Our Team Goal

Whether this is your child's last year at The Madeleine or your child's first, it is time to come together. Regardless of whether you're paying it forward or investing in your future, here are the stats you need to know so we can reach our goal together:

- ▶ Thanks to steady field rentals fees through the years, we're starting with a nest egg of \$60,000.
- ▶ The Field of Dreams Replacement Project is estimated to cost \$170,000 (including complete turf replacement and maintenance for the first few years).
- ▶ Our goal is to raise at least \$90,000 during the paddle raise, with the remaining balance being raised through generous donations from the larger community.

Fifteen years ago, The Madeleine community dreamt big and built the field that our children and the entire community enjoy today.

Refresh the dream. Replace the turf!



St. Joseph

Faithful Protector of Mother and Child

The infant Christ “came into our world in a state of great vulnerability. He needed to be defended, protected, cared for and raised by Joseph” (PC 5). The humble and often hidden carpenter of Nazareth accompanied Mary in her pregnancy, assisted at the birth of the Messiah in a stable, presented Jesus in the Temple, fled with his family far from their homeland to protect them, and lovingly raised Jesus as his own son in the years to come.

While the angel of the Lord appeared to Mary to announce that she would bring forth the Savior of the world, it was revealed to Joseph in a series of dreams how God’s plans would be brought to fulfillment. As Pope Francis highlights, “God trusted Joseph, as did Mary, who found in him someone who would not only save her life, but would always provide for her and her child” (PC 5).

Dear St. Joseph,
help us to
imitate your
faithful trust and
courage.

Like every other human family, the Holy Family had to confront real and concrete challenges. Yet, “in every situation, Joseph declared his own ‘fiat’” (PC 3). His “yes” to the Lord meant that regardless of the hardship and personal sacrifice to himself, he consistently chose to put the needs of Mary and Jesus before his own. Joseph’s devotion helps reveal to us our own call to show special care for the lives of those whom God has entrusted to us.

During this Year of St. Joseph, each of us can find in him “an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble” (PC, Intro). Joseph shows us how to say “yes” to life, despite our own fears, frailties, and weaknesses. For it is Joseph who was “chosen by God to guide the beginnings of the history of redemption. He was the true ‘miracle’ by which God saves the child and his mother” (PC 5).

May we, too, be miracles in the lives of those who are most in need, especially at the beginning and end of life. Dear St. Joseph, you who were “able to turn a problem into a possibility by trusting always in divine providence” (PC 5), help us to imitate your faithful trust and courage.

RECYCLING PROGRAMS EXPANDED AT THE MADELEINE

Marked collection bins in the breezeway facing 23rd Ave.

The Madeleine's Laudato Si' Circle and Care for Creation Ministry have joined with U. S. based recycler, Terracycle, to offer our parish, school, and community opportunities to responsibly recycle specific items (primarily plastics) not generally handled at curbside. Terracycle has added more manufacturers to its program, and in turn, we have expanded our recycling offerings. Here is a current listing of what we are collecting. Please keep this in mind:

- ▶ Do not include garbage or items not specifically mentioned in the descriptions.
- ▶ Empty containers of contents. No need to wash first; * ensure packaging is dry.



STYROFOAM AND POLYSTYRENE

We have identified a local recycler of Styrofoam and Polystyrene (anything marked #6 like block packaging, meat trays, and to-go containers).



*Please thoroughly wash and dry food containers.

LATE JULY® SNACKS

All Late July® snack packaging as seen in these examples. Limited to Late July brand only.



GILLETTE® AND VENUS RAZORS AND RAZOR BLADES

All brands of blades and razors (systems and disposable units, and replaceable-blade cartridge units), rigid plastic packaging, and flexible plastic bag packaging.



BIC WRITING INSTRUMENTS AND PACKAGING

All brands of empty writing instruments, glue sticks, water-color dispensers, highlighters, paint sets, and flexible packaging.



RB HEALTH & NUTRITION

All brands of vitamins, minerals, and supplements; cough, cold, flu, sore throat, and nasal care; infant formula and child nutrition; personal care and foot care (all associated packaging including blister packs, tubes, bottles, caps, lids, cans, boxes, spray bottles, and plastic). No prescription bottles.


