

## WAS BLIND, BUT NOW I SEE

Music Notes

This week, we are challenged to look beyond what is visible with our own eyes

to that which is unseen. In Mark's gospel, the blind man Bartimaeus, scoffed by others, asks Jesus to restore his sight. Jesus, recognizing that he already sees with "eyes of faith" replies, "go your way; your faith has saved you."


The well-known hymn, Amazing Grace

mirrors this week's gospel message. It was written in 1772 by Englishman John Newton, a former slave trader. Blind from sin, Newton's conversion to Christianity was prompted at sea, when he called out for God's mercy during a particularly violent storm. Saved by God's "amazing grace," Newton gave up his former life, and eventually became a popular Anglican minister and prolific composer. Amazing Grace continues to have widespread crossover appeal in both the secular and sacred worlds. Estimated to be performed 10,000,000 times annually, it has been recorded by everyone from Gospel Singer Mahalia Jackson to Johnny Cash, Judi Collins and opera singer Jessye Norman, and is heard at funerals, rock concerts and in concert halls world-wide. The meaning behind the words of this song have become as individual as the singer or the listener. Gospel singer Marion Williams summed it up by saying, "it is a song that gets to everybody."

A few years ago, Michael and I brought our good friend jazz vocalist Diane Schuur (Deedles, as she is known) to our Jazz Festival in Dubrovnik, Croatia—truly one of the most beautiful cities in the world. Now, there is a certain point as you travel the windy road from the airport to the city, that you see a view of the Old City for the first time—with its iconic red tile roofs, stone walls against a backdrop of the crystal clear Adriatic—it

is truly breathtaking! And so, without thinking I said to her, "wait until we go

around this corner and you see the view of the Old City"! Well, Deedles is blind and I was immediately mortified at what I said—and sad that she couldn't see the physical beauty of this city. As the week went on, I decided that the perfect gift for Deedles would be a medal of St. Blaise.



Finally, one of the common themes in our liturgies the last few weeks is taken from Pope Francis' encyclical, *Laudato Si'*. It reminds us that we are connected to all of creation. Accordingly, we should not turn a blind eye to the destruction of our planet. Rather, like Bartimaeus, we are called to come forth with courage, to see with eyes of faith, and to work together to make positive change in our world.

A Funeral Mass was held for Patrick Sweeney on Saturday, October 23, 11:00 am at The Madeleine.

Patrick fought a six year battle with congestive heart failure, chronic pneumonia and vascular dementia before his passing. We miss him terribly, but our family celebrates the fact that he is now at peace and free of pain.

Born in Portland, Oregon, he was the third child of Edmond and Florence Sweeney. He was a proud native Oregonian. Raised in a strong Irish Catholic home in N.E. Portland, he attended Madeleine and Irvington Grade Schools and graduated from Grant High School. He was honorably discharged from the Navy after six years of service and then went on to attend PSU where he earned a Masters in Speech.






