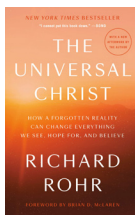

Due to scheduled travel, we have an extra-early deadline for the Thanksgiving Weekend (November 28) parish bulletin.

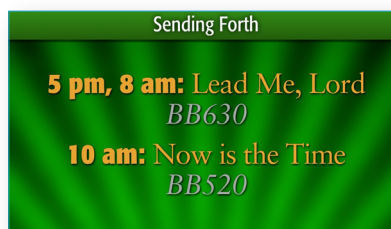

THE MYSTERY OF TIME

One of the most difficult and complex chamber music pieces that I have performed is the “Quartet for the End of Time,” written by French composer, Oliver Messiaen (1908-1992). Messiaen composed the music while a prisoner in a concentration camp in World War II. He wrote the piece for clarinet, cello, violin and piano—the musicians and instruments that were available to him at the time, and premiered it alongside his colleagues for 400 fellow prisoners on January 15, 1941 in Stalag VIII-A.

While the surrounding circumstances are unique, it was Messiaen’s faith and a penchant for birdcalls that really brings it to life. A devout Catholic, Messiaen believed that he was living in the end times, and was inspired by text from the Book of Revelations (Rev 10:1-2, 5-7). Each of the eight movements is a musical reflection of some aspect of the text. In his preface to the score, Messiaen describes the opening of the quartet as this; “Between three and four in the morning, the awakening of birds: a solo blackbird or nightingale improvises, surrounded by a shimmer of sound, by a halo of trills lost very high in the trees. Transpose this onto a religious plane and you have the harmonious silence of Heaven.”

Paradoxically, the most distinct musical characteristic of this piece is that it is written entirely without rhythmic meter—there is not one time signature to be found! As a performer, this can be quite disconcerting. We are used to seeing a written time signature, an indicator of how to organize notes and create musical structure. In fact, rhythm organized by time is one of the most basic and natural aspects of music. Without that visual aid, it is incumbent the musicians think

far beyond the written notes—creating a sense of time with rhythmic patterns that make musical sense. If that is achieved, it is a composition in which the concepts of time and eternity stand still—at least for a few, brief moments. Without it, the piece devolves into nothing more than a random series of notes - creating instead musical “chaos” for both the performers and the audience!

I am always reminded of the “Quartet for the End of Time” when I read this week’s gospel from Mark. In it, Jesus talks about the end times to his disciples—vividly describing that the natural order of things in life will be turned completely upside down. He says, “The sun will be darkened, the moon will not give us light, stars will fall from the sky, and the heavens will be shaken.” He goes on to say, “But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father.”

Though Christ’s early followers believed his return was imminent, Biblical scholars have debated these words for centuries—and the exact timetable remains a mystery. Still, Christ reminds the disciples—and us—that even though the end times as we know it might not come in our lifetime, we should all prepare instead to face our own end times. After all, in the grand scheme of things, our time on earth is short—but our time in heaven will last an eternity.

ADVENT CANDLES AND WREATH RINGS AVAILABLE AFTER MASSES ON NOVEMBER 20-21 AND 27-28

November 28 marks the first week of Advent and the tradition of the Advent Wreath. After Masses on November 20-21 and 27-28, the parish will again offer candles for purchase (\$5/pack while supplies last) and free brass rings. To complete your Advent wreath, we encourage collecting your own greens. Celebrating Advent in your home is an excellent way to prepare your mind and heart for Christmas.

The Deep Symbolism of the Advent Wreath

The Advent wreath and candles are full of symbolism tied to the Christmas season. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life we find in Christ.

The candles also have their own special significance, representing the four weeks of Advent, and one candle is lit each Sunday. Three of the candles are purple because the



color violet is a liturgical color signifying a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. The first candle, which is purple, symbolizes hope. It is sometimes called the “Prophecy Candle” in remembrance of the prophets,

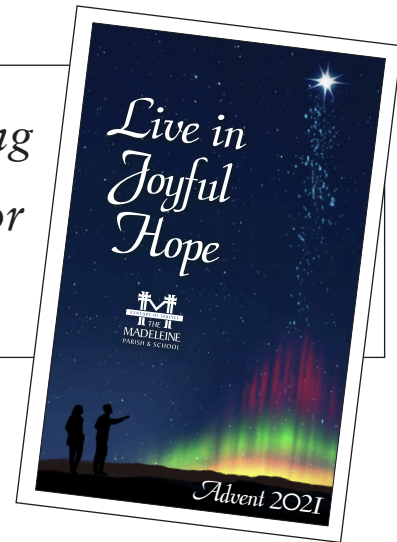
especially Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. It represents the expectation felt in anticipation of the coming Messiah.

The second candle, also purple, represents faith. It is called the “Bethlehem Candle” as a reminder of Mary and Joseph’s journey to Bethlehem.

The third candle is pink and symbolizes joy. It is called the “Shepherd’s Candle,” and is pink because rose is a liturgical color for joy. The third Sunday of Advent is Gaudete Sunday and is meant to remind us of the joy that the world experienced at the birth of Jesus, as well as the joy that the faithful have reached the midpoint of Advent.

On the fourth week of Advent, we light the final purple candle to mark the final week of prayer and penance as we wait for the birth of our Savior. This final candle, the “Angel’s Candle,” symbolizes peace. It reminds us of the message of the angels: “Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men.”

SCAM ALERT

Another email fraudulently claiming to be from Father Mike has been received by some parishioners and staff asking them to get in touch with him.

Email and text message scams such as this are proliferating not only in our Archdiocese, but nationwide.

First, the victim receives a fake email or text from a fraudster impersonating Fr. Mike saying, “I need a favor from you,” or similar.

If the victim replies to the email, the fraudster sends a response asking for iTunes or Google Play gift cards or other difficult to trace/easy to redeem methods.

Each time the victim replies, the fraudster responds with even more sympathetic and urgent requests.

A few ways to know it’s fraud:

- ▶ **The email address is wrong.** Fr. Mike’s email is fathermike@themadeleine.edu. The fraud emails generally come from a gmail.com or yahoo.com address.
- ▶ The email may use bad grammar.
- ▶ Father Mike—or anyone on your parish or school staffs—**will never ask you to purchase gift cards and send them the numbers.**
- ▶ Also note: sometimes these emails are faked to be from other people you may know...parishioners, friends, etc.

If you are ever in doubt as to whether a request for money or assistance is legitimate, call the School or Parish office during work hours.

World Day of the Poor

WHO LIVES IN POVERTY USA?

All those who make less than the Federal government's official poverty threshold... which for a family of four is about \$25,700. People working at minimum wage, even holding down multiple jobs. Seniors living on fixed incomes. Wage earners suddenly out of work. Millions of families everywhere from our cities to rural communities.



Poverty does not strike all demographics equally. For example, in 2018, 10.6% of men, and 12.9% of women lived in Poverty USA. Along the same lines, the poverty rate for married couples in 2018 was only 4.7% - but the poverty rate for single-parent families with no wife present was 12.7%, and for single-parent families with no husband present was 24.9%.

In 2018, the poverty rate for people living with a disability was 25.7%. That's nearly 4 million people living with a disability—in poverty.

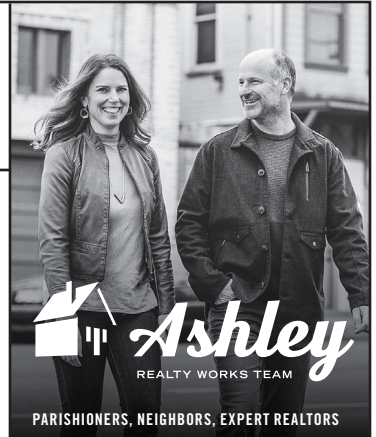

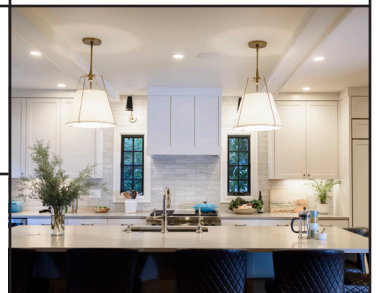
