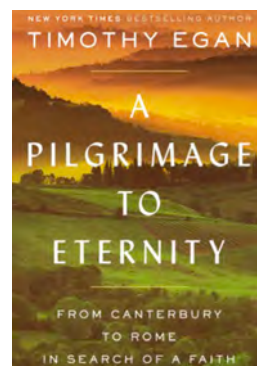
FAITH SHARING WITH THERESE

LENTEN FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Every year, we get questions about the fasting requirements for Catholics during Lent. And, sometimes, those discussions can get animated with family histories, special exceptions and imaginative definitions of fasting. So, we thought we'd publish what the Archdiocese sent us. Enjoy (or don't, if it's a Friday!). To quote:

All Catholics 14 years and older must abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

All Catholics between the ages 18 and 59 are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

To fast means to eat one full meal; the other two meals that day should be less than the normal amount unless they are already at a minimum for good health. Eating between meals is not permitted; however, liquids including coffee, milk and fruit juices are allowed.

MUSIC NOTES: THE HEALING BALM OF GILEAD

This week, Luke reminds us about the “transfiguration” of Jesus. Transfiguration is really just a fancy word for a change in appearance. As Jesus was praying upon the mountaintop and his clothes became dazzling white, he showed the disciples a glimpse of the divine light of heaven.

There is no doubt that during this pandemic, that glimpse of the heavenly light has become dim over time—enveloping our world into a spiritual darkness brought on by physical illness, fear and anxiety, social isolation, and a weary spirit. By now, we are all in need of the healing power of Christ—body, mind, and soul.

In the Catholic Church, that healing power of Christ is given to each of us through the Anointing of the Sick, one of the seven Sacraments instituted by Jesus in his earthly ministry. Essentially, the Sacraments are an outward sign—or rite - that is performed by the priest to convey God’s grace to those who receive it. Early on, this Sacrament probably got a “bad rap” because of its former name, “Extreme Unction,” which means “final anointing” (sometimes referred to as “the Last Rite”). That name, alone, understandably deterred many from wanting to receive it! Luckily, the Catechism of the Catholic Church cleared that up for us, stating: “The anointing of the sick is not a sacrament for those only who are at the



point of death. Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age the fitting time for him to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived” (CCC1514).

It is, of course, the hope that when the Anointing of the Sick is given, it is God’s will that the person be physically healed of illness. And it is true that many miracles have indeed been received! But, even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the gifts of God’s grace—of peace and courage, and a renewed confidence and faith to endure the challenges that accompany serious illness or just plain old age.

The Spiritual, “There is a Balm in Gilead” mirrors both the

acknowledgement of pain and suffering in our lives, and the hope and healing of God. The Gilead of this Spiritual is that region east of the Jordan River—a place that is famous for a balsamic resin (balm) that was believed to have healing properties. As the song suggests, while the balm of Gilead may heal our physical wounds, it is Christ who ultimately heals our “sin-sick soul” through his Holy Spirit—he is our Gilead.

As we begin to emerge from the spiritual darkness of the pandemic, we all need that Gilead in our lives—the restorative healing power of Christ in our body, mind and soul. For it is only then that we may be able to see that bright, heavenly light once again.

I would encourage you to attend our communal Healing Service at The Madeleine on Tuesday, March 15 @ 6:30 in the Main Church.

What is Anointing of the Sick and Who May Receive the Sacrament?

Contemplative Healing Service, Tuesday, March 15, 6:30 pm

Before the Second Vatican Council, “Extreme Unction,” meaning “last anointing,” was only performed on the dying. Today, known as the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, it is more broadly administered. The Anointing of the Sick is not a sacrament only for those who are at the point of death. Rather, a priest may anoint any baptized Catholic whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age.

Sickness includes anyone experiencing a life-threatening operation or in danger of death because of illness or old age. During the sacrament, the priest anoints the forehead and the palms of the sick, while praying that God will save and raise them up. The anointing accompanies a prayer for physical and spiritual healing. The sacrament, through the power of the Holy Spirit, unites the sick person to Christ’s suffering, and effects include

a strengthening, peace, and courage to overcome the difficulties associated with serious illness or old age. The sacrament is a gift of the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of sins, restoration of health if it is conducive to the salvation of the soul, union with the passion of Christ, and a share in the saving work of Jesus.

St. Patrick

Everyone knows when St. Patrick’s Day is. But in the world of Catholic trivia, March 17 is often something else.

St. Patrick served as archbishop of Armagh in the fifth century. He brought Christianity to Ireland, where it continues to flourish. Today, Patrick has advanced far beyond most other saints, into the world of secular calendars, parades, greeting cards, table decorations, and parties. Not even the Twelve Apostles can boast such a festive following.

However, because of our quirky church calendar, many March 17s come and go without a mention of Patrick at Mass.

Our Church ranks saints’ days by their

importance. The principal days are called “solemnities.” Christmas and Easter are the two most important. Next are the celebrations called “feasts.” Here is where we find, among others, the apostles. Then there are “memorials,” the saints of general interest on the universal calendar like Francis of Assisi, Therese the Little Flower, and some of our newest saints like Maximilian Kolbe and Andrew Dung-Lac and companions. They show the multiculturalism of the communion of saints.

Then there are “optional memorials.” These saints have limited or local interest, and your community may opt in or opt out of celebrating them. These include Nereus and Achilleus, Maria

Goretti, Turibius de Mogrovejo, and believe it or not Patrick. Consequently, a parish could skip over Patrick every year and celebrate something like “Tuesday of the Fourth Week of Lent.” When March 17 falls on a Sunday, Patrick drops out for a year. Sundays take precedence over optional memorials.

However, the principal patron of a diocese, parish or country takes the status of a solemnity. When March 17 falls on a Sunday in Lent, locales under Patrick’s patronage may celebrate his day on March 18.

The liturgical color for Patrick is white, as for other saintly bishops who were spared a martyr’s death. We reserve green vestments for ordinary time.
