Green Tips for a More Sustainable Lifestyle

We seem to have a real obsession with our lawns. Indeed, all the time invested in lawn care and grooming reflects this: Laying down sod or seeding, removing weeds by hand (never with herbicides), mowing, watering, fertilizing...and do all these efforts produce a harvest? No. Lawns are only for decoration!

Here is an idea: Sow thyme or clover. These plants offer a very nice shade of green on your lawn. Furthermore, these plants are resistant to white worms and other parasites. They require no watering and you will never have to mow! You will be taking care of creation and you'll be able to rest a little more!

AMERICA THE BEAUTIFUL

If you travel to any city or village in most all of Italy, you will find at the heart of it a Catholic church adjacent to the Town Square. Historically, there, the lines that separate church and state are quite blurred, and Catholicism is as much a part of the culture as it is the primary religion. (I once asked my Italian rela-

tives if they were Catholic, since none of them go to church. They answered, "of course—we are Italian"!)

Several years ago, Michael and I found ourselves in the town of Assisi on the Feast of St. Francis. We followed the parade to the Basilica for Mass, which honored city officials as well as the requisite bishops and cardinals. At the end of Mass, doves were released and to our surprise, we heard in the distance a faint rendering of John Phillip Sousa's "Stars and Stripes Forever"—played by a visiting band from Naples! It was truly an unforgettable memory.

I am reminded of that day each Fourth of July, as Michael and I have traditionally attended the St. Paul

Rodeo with friends. The entire town of 400 or so people participate in the week-long celebration—and at the heart of the food court is the infamous chicken booth—a fundraiser for St. Paul Catholic Church. (Fr. Ed ALWAYS works down at the Bucking chute.) One of my favorite highlights is at the beginning of the Rodeo, when the capacity crowd sings the "Star Spangled Banner" as the flag bearer gallops around the arena with the American flag whipping in the wind. What St. Francis is to Assisi, the Rodeo is to St. Paul!

It is undeniable that our country, civic leaders and citizens need our prayers—and so it is fitting to acknowledge in music and prayer our country's Independence at this weekend's liturgies.

The hymn, "This is My Song," is also referred to as "The Song of Peace." The melody comes from a symphonic tone poem (a one movement orchestral piece inspired by a program or story) by composer Jean Sibelius entitled, "Finlandia." Sibelius

wrote "Finlandia" as a patriotic piece in 1899, performed as the last of seven musical pieces accompanying a series of tableaus reflecting portions of Finnish history. The text was composed by author Lloyd Stone in 1934 during the brief time of peace between the two world wars - as a song of hope for all na-

tions. In it, Stone acknowledges a love for his own country, while recognizing the love that others feel worldwide for their own nations. Methodist theologian Georgia Harkness wrote the last stanzas with religious overtones in the late 1930s.

Similarly, the hymn, "America, the Beautiful" was written at two different times by two who never met. The lyrics are credited to Katherine Lee Bates (1859-1929), an English professor at Wellesley College. Originally titled, Pikes Peak and later, America, Bates wrote the poem after visiting Pikes Peak in Southern Colorado (the lyrics, "purple mountain majesties" are a direct reference). First published in

1895 in "The Congregationalist, the original poem had four verses—essentially connecting America's glory and success to God and asking for continuing help from God in times to come. In 1882, Church organist Samuel A. Ward (1848-1903) originally wrote the tune, Materna, to be used alongside a hymn called "O Mother Dear, Jerusalem." Eventually, Materna was linked with the poem, America. The two were first published together as "America, the Beautiful" in 1910. Perhaps the most poignant performance of this hymn was by legendary singer, Ray Charles shortly after 9/11 at the 2001 World Series. Check it out on YouTube. If there was ever a time that a song united our country from sea to shining sea, it was at that moment. Happy Independence Day!

America, America, God shed his grace on thee, And crown thy good with brotherhood, from sea to shining sea.

Volunteers are needed as evening hosts, dinner preparers and overnight hosts. Training for this ministry with our Ascension Parish partners will be occurring in mid-July.



RECYCLING PROGRAMS AT THE MADELEINE

Marked collection bins in the breezeway facing 23rd Ave.

The Madeleine's Laudato Si' Circle and Care for Creation Ministry have joined with U. S. based recycler, Terracycle, to offer our parish, school, and community opportunities to responsibly recycle specific items (primarily plastics) not generally handled at curbside. Terracycle has added more manufacturers to its program, and in turn, we have expanded our recycling offerings. Here is a current listing of what we are collecting. Please keep this in mind:

- ▶ Do not include garbage or items not specifically mentioned in the descriptions.
- ▶ Empty containers of contents. No need to wash first; ensure packaging is dry.





DISCONTINUED: STYROFOAM/ POLYSTYRENE

Regrettably, we can no longer accept Styrofoam and Polystyrene materials. Although endorsed by Metro, we have recently learned (through an independent report) of major violations by the local recycler in the responsible handling and recycling of these materials.


