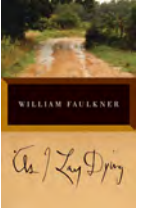

The Saint Kateri Habitats Program inspires the restoration and management of homes, yards, gardens, parishes, schools, farms, parks, forests, rivers, and wetlands as healthy habitats for people

Saint Kateri Habitats maintain a religious expression on the land and serve as a gentle reminder of God, of his presence

Saint Kateri Tekakwitha is the patroness saint of Indigenous People, and we celebrate her feast day on July 14.

Saint Kateri and the Indigenous People have extensive knowledge of natural

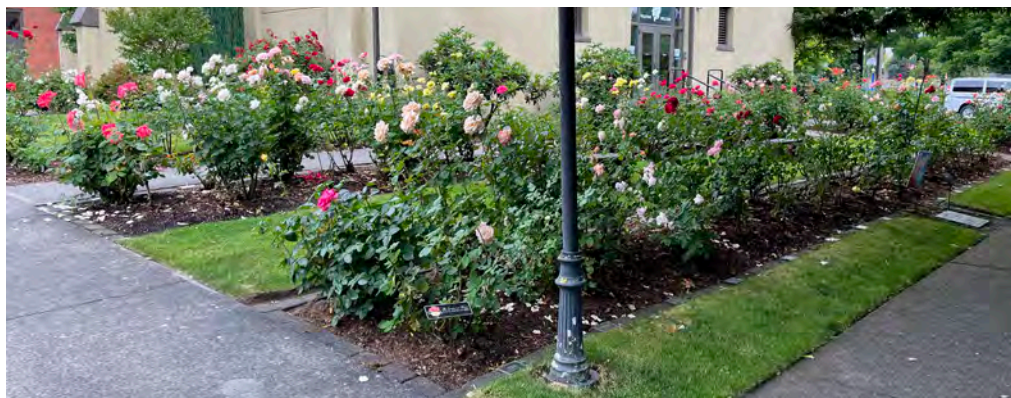

FAITH INTO ACTION

In this week's Gospel, when asked by a scholar of law, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus responds with a question: "What is written in the law? How do you read it?" Jesus goes on to tell the parable of the Good Samaritan—reminding us that it is not enough to recite the law—we must put words into action. And even though we may not always like it, we must love our neighbor as ourselves in order to love God. If we don't live our faith, we will never understand it.

When I was a young child studying piano, my teacher always assigned me one piece from the Baroque, Classical, Romantic, and 20th Century piano repertoire, as well as the requisite music theory and sight-reading each week. I dutifully practiced my lessons (well, most of the time), loved the symmetry and order of Baroque and Classical pieces (I never got tired of playing Bach and Mozart), longed to play Chopin, Brahms and Rachmaninoff (even though my small hands struggled with anything over an octave), but absolutely abhorred playing Stravinsky, Bartok or any other 20th century repertoire—they just didn't make sense to my analytical mind! When I would complain or make excuses for not practicing these pieces, she would say, "You don't have to like everything you are playing—but if you don't learn it, you will never understand it." Like many, of course, I only wanted to play that which was familiar and comfortable to me. Eventually, because of my wise teacher, I learned not only to appreciate, but to thoroughly enjoy playing the music of Stravinsky, Bartok and many other 20th century composers!

As a Church musician, the lessons learned from my piano teacher became indelible life lessons when choosing music for liturgies. Yes, contrary to popular belief, choosing music for the liturgy is based upon much more than just what you "like." Similar to learning music fundamentals, the Church has codified

various documents that give us a framework to define sacred music and its place in the liturgy. As early as 1903, Pope Pius X issued a "motu proprio" (an unofficial papal document) called "Tra le Sollecitudini." In this document, Pope Pius X laments that sacred music has gotten "off track," yet acknowledges the many factors that may have contributed to this, such as changes in taste and habits, the influence of theatrical art, or that music is not easily contained with right limits. Sound familiar? He goes on to outline the general principles regulating sacred music in the liturgy, including that sacred music should be holy, true art, and must be universal.

Throughout the 20th century, the Church has published several more documents reflecting sacred music in the liturgy, including: "Musicam Sacram; Instruction on Music in the Liturgy" (1967) by the Second Vatican Council; the "General Instruction of the Roman Missal" (GIRM) in 2003; and a more up to date 2007 document entitled, "Music in Catholic Worship"; followed by "Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship."

For the next several weeks, we will examine the highlights of these documents. Then, on Wednesday, August 3 at 6:30 pm—armed with your newfound knowledge of sacred music—you will have the opportunity to participate in choosing a new set of Mass parts for The Madeleine. This is where the fun begins! We will listen to and sing (yes, sing) through three—five possible Mass settings. At the end of the evening, we will collectively choose a new Mass setting for our parish. I encourage you to put your faith into action by attending this workshop. Who knows? You just may like it!

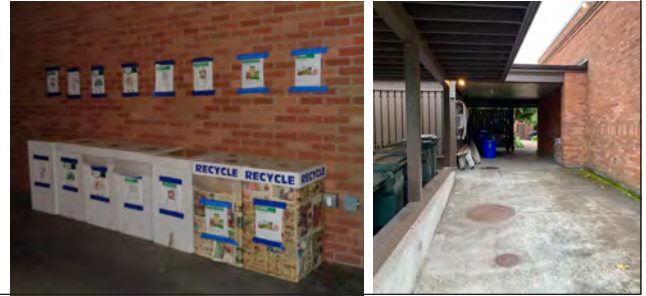


RECYCLING PROGRAMS AT THE MADELEINE

Marked collection bins in the breezeway facing 23rd Ave.

The Madeleine's Laudato Si' Circle and Care for Creation Ministry have joined with U. S. based recycler, Terracycle, to offer our parish, school, and community opportunities to responsibly recycle specific items (primarily plastics) not generally handled at curbside. Terracycle has added more manufacturers to its program, and in turn, we have expanded our recycling offerings. Here is a current listing of what we are collecting. Please keep this in mind:

- ▶ Do not include garbage or items not specifically mentioned in the descriptions.
- ▶ Empty containers of contents. No need to wash first; ensure packaging is dry.



DISCONTINUED: STYROFOAM/ POLYSTYRENE

Regrettably, we can no longer accept Styrofoam and Polystyrene materials. Although endorsed by Metro, we have recently learned (through an independent report) of major violations by the local recycler in the responsible handling and recycling of these materials.

LATE JULY® SNACKS

By The Numbers

1 Giving History. So you don’t have to dig through your bank records, these green bars show how much you’ve given each year, averaged by month for simplicity. Parish Offertory, Second Collections and Capital Repair gifts are used here. **These bars do NOT include Old Church Capital Campaign giving or pledges.**

2 Parishioner Average Giving. For context, we’ve provided the average monthly contribution per contributing parish family over each of the past 5 years.

3 Contact information. We have included what we have for your current contact information. See an error or a phone or email missing? Just make the correction when you send in your commitment card!

4 Suggested 2022-23 monthly amount. This is an amount for you to consider for your 2022-23 giving. It reflects the greater of your prior year monthly average plus our requested 6% increase, or the parish average. It’s just a suggestion...we are grateful for any amount.

5 Your Commitment. Here, we list the commitments for the coming year.

▶ **Combined Monthly Commitment.** The amount here is intended to cover not only your Parish Offertory, the main fund that our parish runs on, but Second Collections and Capital Repair Fund also. **This does NOT include any gifts to our Old Church Project Capital Campaign.**

▶ **Additional Gifts:** If you did not include Capital Repair Fund and Second Collections in the past—or wish to add more—please consider including a monthly amount here.

▶ **Total Per Month:** Please TOTAL ALL THE LINES ABOVE for your total monthly commitment.

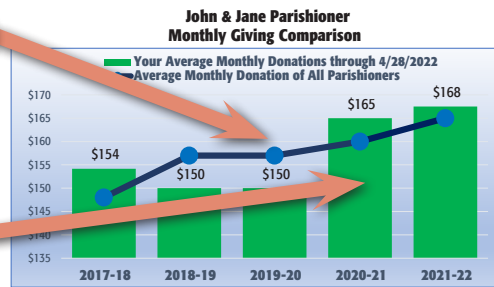
