

MUSIC NOTES

LITURGICAL HOSPITALITY

When Michael and I bought our current home, one of our main goals was to have a place that was suitable for entertaining one where everyone would feel welcome. The truth is, we love to have people over whether it is to share a Thanksgiving meal, a glass of wine on the deck, or a large, festive party. Our gatherings invariably include a song or two in the piano room, where our guests are known to belt out a tune or two-as they have spilled over into our foyer, up the staircase, or from the open loft above. It is surround sound at its finest! Add to that a home gallery of artwork filled with color, music and life and it makes for an atmosphere where everyone feels welcome. More often than not, our guests feel comfortable enough to search for an extra glass in the cupboard, open another bottle of wine, play a tune or two on the piano, and generally make themselves at home.

Here at The Madeleine, we go to great lengths to welcome everyone into our liturgical home. How many times have the aesthetics of our beautiful church grounds drawn people into our worship space? And then once inside, an atmosphere of hospitality is apparent in a smile or "hello" from parishioners, the words Fr. Mike speaks, even sharing wine and cheese after Mass—The Madeleine never fails to live up to our theme song, "All are Welcome."

In our worship, singing is a time when everyone can participate in the act of liturgical hospitality. How so? Singing together invites others to share their voices and actively participate in song—in itself an act of hospitality.

The marriage of sacred music and hospitality were inextricably linked in the reforms of Vatican II. Espousing the language, "full, active and conscious participation," the liturgies went from the Latin language to the Vernacular, and Sacred Music was

geared away from the elaborate motets sung by a highly trained Schola Cantorum, to more congregational singing that everyone could participate in. In 1967, the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council followed with a document that explained more fully the role of Sacred Music in the Church. In the document Musicam Sacram" (Instruction on the Music in the Liturgy), the Council exuberantly promotes actively singing the entire liturgy while at the same time laying out a strategy for how to achieve that ambitious task. The bulk of the document discusses varying degrees of singing in the liturgy—a type of musical and liturgical hierarchy outlining what parts of the liturgy to sing—with the ultimate goal of achieving greater participation in singing. In some fashion, this hierarchical approach to congregation singing are the Gospel's version of Martha—that is, in this document the Church is worried more about the rubrics of what to sing and when then the physical act of just singing. Conversely, as a congregation, we are much more like Mary—the more exuberant one participates in singing, the likelihood those around you will feel welcome—and will likewise do the same.

Like Mary and Martha, in our liturgical hospitality we are called to both pay attention to the rubrics of song as we are to participate. To that end, I would invite you attend our Music Enrichment workshop on August 3 at 6:30 pm. With a brief explanation of Church teachings, combined with a whole lot of singing, we will choose a new set of Mass Parts for our liturgies. Being part of this musical process is just one of the many ways that we at The Madeleine can further our goals of welcome and hospitality in our liturgies.
