DISCERNING CATHOLIC: ONE HOLY CATHOLIC AND APOSTOLIC CHURCH

Why Catholicism? I posed this question at a recent Discerning Catholic meeting and the folks attending turned it around and posed the question back to me. Why Catholicism, Dan? Why did you come back to the Church? My reply, though genuine, always felt superficial, as if I was that guy at the basketball game throwing T-shirts to the crowd at half-time. Tangible, but not worth much.

Why Catholicism? The sudden expansion of Christianity from obscure sect to central pillar of Western Civilization baffles historians. From the perspective of the faithful, we can say "God's will" but in my own mind I see Christ as a shepherd with a staff and not a cattle reiver with a whip. We are culpable in our faith; this is what gives value to our commitment to God: we give ourselves freely, without fear or coercion. And so, whatever the will of God, the human element inherent in Christianity necessarily held magnificent appeal. Some elements of it inspire us to action. In my limited reading, scholars suggest the Christian imperatives on mercy, forgiveness, and showing your love for God by loving your fellow human, without regard to sex, ethnicity or social status, were revolutionary, and offered both hope and security in a cruel and uncertain age. The

Gospels suggest the same, Christ instructing us in His Word and more importantly, I believe, demonstrating it through His actions.

Why Catholicism? The Roman Emperor Constantine called together the Christian faithful at the Ecumenical Council of Nicaea in 325 A.D. to resolve differences and help ensure the unity of the Church. We echo that same unity today around the globe and across 1,700 years of faith when each Sunday we recite the Nicene Creed.

Why Catholicism? Handing out small "Life Packs" of food to the homeless, I'm always greeted with genuine surprise and gratitude. Most immediately begin eating. Can the Beatitudes be any less compelling today than they were to the first Christians? What does a society look like where the first is last and the last, first?

State Representative Barbara Smith Warner • September 1, 2022, 12:00 pm •via ZOOM

Francois Baur Riesling Herrenweg 2020, Alsace, France

Alsatian wines have big, explosive aromatics; they whet the appetite; and have great acidity, perfect for washing down rich, full-flavored food. This wine is dry and crisp with citrus, honeysuckle and mineral complexities. The enduring myth that all Alsatian (and German) wines are sweet is one of the region's great problems. Coming to love, enjoy, and appreciate Riesling is a very necessary step in the evolution of every wine lover. Alsatian Riesling is right up there with other great whites of France like Chardonnay from Chablis, Chenin Blanc from Vouvray, and Sauvignon from Sancerre. Be Encouraged

II Thess. 2:16-17

"May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, ...encourage your hearts and strengthen them in every good deed and word."

re you feeling a bit weary and discouraged as the summer begins to come to an end? Could you use some encouragement and strengthening of your heart?

I recently spent a relaxing week with my brother and sister-in-law at their home in Spokane. The weather was "summer perfect". We enjoyed breakfast on the patio, often lingering over a second cup of coffee. Each day we would take short trips to favorite places. In the evenings we would sit in the rockers on their front porch and talk about the lifetime we had shared. For the most part, our conversations were delightful and upbeat, but often they would turn to our worries about health issues and thoughts about nearing the end of our lives. We also shared deep concerns about our planet and its inhabitants.

We have lived long enough to remember growing up with fear and respect for

Polio, which had killed our father, and being quarantined in a hot, dark house the summer we both had measles. As school children, we were accustomed to crawling under our desks as we practiced for a nuclear attack. We have seen prices rise and fall, and watched our savings diminish and grow. My brother had obeyed the request of our government and experienced the war in Vietnam. We had seen our country shaken by riots, threatened by corruption, and saddened by the death of its leaders. But we agreed that the condition of our world today seems very insecure. The climate is changing with horrific fires, floods and storms, but no one seems to care. The focus is inward, totally self-centered. People turn to their electronic devices for answers and help. They no longer turn to God or each other, and often, when they turn to each other they are met with opposition, anger, greed or misunderstanding.

It is easy to be discouraged.

Perhaps now is the time to hear and take to heart the words of St. Paul to the Thessalonians? "May our Lord Jesus Christ himself, and God our Father, who has loved us and given us everlasting encouragement and good hope through his grace, encourage your hearts and strengthen them in every good deed and word."

That puts the work in our hands. Can God encourage us in this 21st Century to say the right words and do the right things to encourage and strengthen each other and those who pass through our lives?
