Green Tips for a More Sustainable Lifestyle

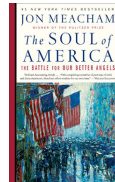

RECYCLING PROGRAMS AT THE MADELEINE

Marked collection bins in the breezeway facing 23rd Ave.

The Madeleine's Laudato Si' Circle and Care for Creation Ministry have joined with U. S. based recycler, Terracycle, to offer our parish, school, and community opportunities to responsibly recycle specific items (primarily plastics) not generally handled at curbside. Terracycle has added more manufacturers to its program, and in turn, we have expanded our recycling offerings. Here is a current listing of what we are collecting. Please keep this in mind:

- ▶ Do not include garbage or items not specifically mentioned in the descriptions.
- ▶ Empty containers of contents. No need to wash first; ensure packaging is dry.



DISCONTINUED: STYROFOAM/ POLYSTYRENE

Regrettably, we can no longer accept Styrofoam and Polystyrene materials. Although endorsed by Metro, we have recently learned (through an independent report) of major violations by the local recycler in the responsible handling and recycling of these materials.

- ▶ **Madeleine Parish Choir:** The Madeleine Choir is the heart and soul of the Music Ministry program. Rehearsals are weekly and the choir sings regularly at the 10:00 am Mass every Sunday, as well as for special musical programs and feast days throughout the year. This choir is a vibrant, supportive faith community that sings, prays, and plays together!
- ▶ **The Madeleine Chimes Choir:** Hand chimes are instant musical gratification—an accessible way to make music as a group. Rehearsals are on Wednesdays as scheduled. A basic knowledge of rhythm is helpful, but not required. Ask any “chimer.” Playing hand chimes is just plain fun!!
- ▶ **Parish Cantors:** The Parish Cantors lead the singing at liturgies,

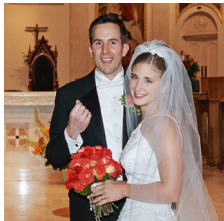
and sing in our Madeleine Choir. If you are an experienced singer, and looking for an extra musical challenge, consider being a Parish Cantor. This is an auditioned ministry.

- ▶ **The Madeleine Children's Choir:** All children love to sing! Our Parish Children's Choir is open to all parishioners and school children, grades three–five (grade two by permission only). The Children's Choir rehearses on Wednesdays, sing at the Family Masses, Grotto, and other special parish activities.
- ▶ **The Madeleine Youth Singers/Jr. Cantors:** NEW this year, The Madeleine Youth Singers is open to ALL middle and high school youth. Rehearsals are on Thursdays. Youth will sing every other month at the 5 pm Mass on Saturday; and be trained as Cantors for the monthly Family Masses. In 2023-24, plans are to be part of the Pueri Cantores Festival Choir, with opportunities to sing either in the U.S. or abroad. Please note: Confirmation Candidates will receive Service Credit for singing in this ensemble and/or being a Jr. Cantor.

WINES

▶ **Adega Monte Branco Alento White 2020, Alentejo, Portugal**

Monte Branco is tucked neatly into the rolling hills that flank the famous marble quarries of Estremoz (in Portugal's center east). This wine is blended from 50% Arinto, 40% Antão Vaz, and 10% Roupeiro. It is built to drink young, while it's nice and primary and refreshing. We love the citrine color and the super fruit aromatics that leap from the glass. This is a go-to for something to sip while we prepare a meal, talk with friends on Zoom, or take a socially-distanced apéro across the fence. List \$17 **SALE \$15**

▶ **Francois Baur Riesling Herrenweg 2020, Alsace, France**

Alsatian wines have big, explosive aromatics; they whet the appetite; and have great acidity, perfect for washing down rich, full-flavored food. This wine is dry and crisp with citrus, honeysuckle and mineral complexities. The enduring myth that all Alsatian (and German) wines are sweet is one of the region's great problems. Coming to love, enjoy, and appreciate Riesling is a very necessary step in the evolution of every wine lover. Alsatian Riesling is right up there with other great whites of France like Chardonnay from Chablis, Chenin Blanc from Vouvray, and Sauvignon from Sancerre. Here's one to try that will be as surprising to you as it will be delicious. List \$21. **SALE \$18**

▶ **Puits Compostelle Pinot Noir 2019, Burgundy, France**

This is where the Loire meets Burgundy. The Côtés-de-la-Charité is one of the tiniest appellations in France and only received its AOC status in 2009. Previously all the wines were sold as Burgundy. This is a very pretty, super quaffable Pinot. It's up on the taster. This wine is by the river of that name. It's just like Burgundy. There's a lot of grape. It gives red wines much needed depth and complexity. There's some surprising soft tannin richness in this wine, and an almost 'dustiness' that really offers a lot of structure and length. List \$27. **SALE \$23**

▶ **Vadio Tinto 2017, Bairrada, Portugal**

Originating from several vineyards of Baga planted exclusively in clay-limestone soils, it expresses the Atlantic character of Bairrada wines and the typical texture of limestone-grown Baga. Each plot of vineyard is harvested manually at different periods in order to reach optimum maturation levels. As soon as they reach the cellar, the grapes are destemmed

and it ages in used barrels for a minimum period of 18 months. The nose shows the classic elegance of Baga and the freshness characteristic of Bairrada. The palate is delicate where the acidity shines and persists accompanied by very soft and polished tannins, almost like a Pinot, but with warmer fruit tones. List \$24. **SALE \$20**

▶ **Alema Barbera d'Asti 'Augusta' 2015, Piedmont, Italy**

Alema (a Piemontese slang for "You're CRAZY!"), is pretty darn impressive. This Barbera is hands down an amazing wine, filled with richness and structure. But, it also has a silky, fine tannin component that gives remarkable complexity. We wouldn't hesitate to bury this one for 5-10 years! List \$25 **SALE \$20**

▶ **Laura David Cot 2019, Loire, France**

Fasten your seat belts here. There's a new grape in town and it's called Côt. Known elsewhere around the world as Malbec, in the Touraine it yields brilliantly purple-colored wines, with major aromatic fireworks of black cherries, ripe figs, and a little whiff of smoke. This wine is best served slightly cool, to keep all that dark fruit nice and bright, and served alongside a charcuterie pic. List \$25 **SALE \$20**

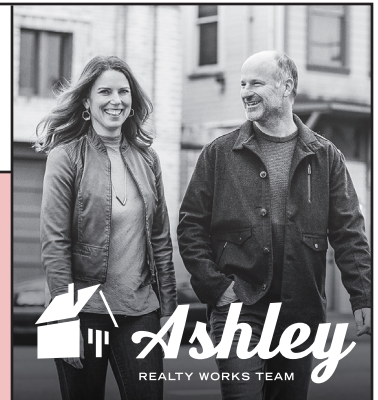
