

Aside from the terrifying act of violence, learning about gun violence can elicit sadness for the victims, fears about personal safety and general anxiety. In today's culture with the omnipresence of media, it can be difficult to filter what information children see or hear. When we prepare to talk with children about gun violence, it is important to consider the child's developmental level and use language and concepts that meet that level of development. Here are some guidelines to help families navigate the conversation.

GENERAL TIPS

- Clarify your own thoughts and feelings around gun violence. Know the facts and where you stand on the issue. This is an opportunity to share and reinforce your beliefs and values.
- Start with what your child already knows.
 This assures that you are not providing more details than is necessary and it also gives the opportunity for you to correct any misinformation that the child may have heard/read.
- Use age-appropriate language. Speaking in a manner that is direct and using words that your child knows makes it easier for your child to understand.
- Encourage questions as they arise. Let your child know that you are always available for questions and if you don't have the answer you will do your best to seek one out.
- Assure your child that the adults in their life work to keep them safe.

CHILDREN UNDER AGE 6

For very young children, gun violence is not a subject that needs be raised unless the child witnesses or learns about it from another source, for example seeing a news story or overhearing a conversation. In these situations, providing only enough information using words they understand is best. Always end the conversation by reassuring your child that you and the other adults in their life work to keep them safe at home and school. Use a formula of simply stating the facts, acknowledging the feelings and offering assurance.

CHILDREN IN ELEMENTARY

For elementary aged children, more questions might arise. It is best to answer their questions honestly and provide enough information so that they don't have to fill in the blanks with their imagination. Remind them of the ways that adults work to keep them safe. Remind them of how they can promote safe schools by following safety rules and reporting any threats or rumors they see or hear.

ADOLESCENTS

For adolescents, gun violence may elicit strong emotional responses, opinions and/or a desire to get involved and take action. Use this as an opportunity to acknowledge their feelings and share your values with your adolescent. Provide accurate information, answer questions honestly and follow their lead if they express interest in activism. When initiated by the adolescent, working toward a cause can help them feel they are making a difference.

In Memorial

THE MADELEINE FAMILY REMEMBERS

KATHLEEN GAITAN

A Funeral Mass will be held for longtime parishioner Kathy Gaitan on Friday, November 11, 1:00 pm at The Madeleine. A reception follows in The Old Madeleine Church.

When it came to needlepoint, Kathleen O'Brien Gaitán believed it was important for both sides of her work to be equally beautiful. To Kathy, what others could see was just as important as what they couldn't. She dedicated her life to solving problems others often overlooked, and her attention to detail and caring nature manifested in environments where everyone felt valued.

Kathy died Oct. 17 at her Northeast Portland home, surrounded by her four daughters and husband of 40 years. After being diagnosed with gastric cancer in January of 2021, Kathy tried every treatment possible with the goal of being able to retire and travel the world with her husband, Ramiro, and watch her daughters grow older. She fought hard to live but grew to be at peace with her death. She spent her final months enjoying time with family and loved ones and was cracking jokes with her characteristic hearty wink until the end.

Her death has ripped holes in the hearts of her family, neighbors and friends. She will be forever remembered for her loving heart, sense of humor, vast talents and sharp wit. Kathy was passionate, determined and humble. Kindness to others—strangers and friends alike—was deeply important to her.

Kathy was born March 22, 1955, in Heppner, Oregon and grew up in The Dalles. She was the second of eight children, and her parents—a nurse and a crane operator—instilled in her an indefatigable work ethic. She attended Mt. Hood Community College and finished her bachelor's degree at the University of Oregon. She waited tables and worked in cherry orchards to support herself and pay for school.

Prior to graduating, Kathy and her older sister Kirsten embarked on a 45-day journey through Europe, her first experience outside of the United States which sparked a lifelong love of travel. She was fascinated by exploring new cities by foot, meeting people from around the world and learning about their history, architecture and cuisine.

This passion led her to accept a teaching position in Bogotá, Colombia, where she met Ramiro. The couple married in 1982 and moved to San Antonio, Texas where Kathy earned a teaching certificate from the University of Texas and became a high school U.S. history teacher. She fondly remembered her time as a teacher and brought her joy of working with children into her role as a mother to four daughters: Liliana, Jeanine, Gabriela and Catalina.

Kathy was a remarkable mother. She instilled a love of reading, crafting, cooking and family in her daughters, and made their home a colorful, nourishing refuge.

When her youngest was school-age, Kathy became a substitute teacher for Portland Public Schools, often teaching her daughters' classes at Ainsworth Elementary School. She later became a teacher on special assignment and earned a master's degree at Portland State University.

In 2015, Kathy became assistant director of funded programs for Portland



Public Schools, and later was appointed the department's director. Her priority was making public education more equitable, particularly for the children of migrant workers, students experiencing homelessness and children for whom English wasn't their first language. She worked tirelessly throughout the COVID-19 pandemic to ensure families did not slip through the cracks and retired only two weeks before her death.

Sadly, Kathy did not live long enough to accept the Larry Tucker Lifetime Achievement Award, an honor from the Oregon Department of Education that will be presented to her family in November in Salem. She died knowing she had a lasting impact on the communities she sought to serve, which was what truly mattered to her.

Kathy and Ramiro remained deeply in love after four decades together and took advantage of any opportunity to travel together. The couple explored cities around the country and world, and Kathy loved to regale her children and friends with stories of their adventures.

She was a lifelong learner and loved reading mystery novels and hosting parties and dinners for her community. Kathy was known for speaking expressively with her hands, and mesmerizing others with her beautiful blue eyes and cheeky smile. She loved listening to and telling stories, sometimes getting so carried away she'd forget half the words. She had dozens of "Kathyisms"—sayings and mannerisms that were unique to her and beloved by her family.

In addition to her family, Kathy leaves behind a large group of cherished friends who loved and supported her every day of her illness. Kathy will be forever remembered and loved for exactly who she was: a talented, bright, funny, kind and loving person, wife, mother, mentor and friend.

In loving memory of our mother, Janette Lucile "Jan" Sheahan (Bunker), who passed away peacefully, on October 25, 2022, at the age of 98. She was preceded in death by her beloved husband, Bill, and her son Danny. She is survived by her loving sons: Michael (Kathy), John (Joyce), Tim and Kelly, as well as her brother, Howard Bunker. She has four beloved grandchildren: Chris (Lauren), Molly (Aaron), Maddie and Maren and four beloved great grandchildren: Anna, Julia, Charley and Asher.

Our mother was born on August 8, 1924, to Hugh and Cora (Auger) Bunker in Bemidji, Minnesota. After high school, she moved to Portland and began assisting in the war effort, by working as an electrician at the Kaiser shipyards. Later, she served in the US Navy as a WAVE, spending the final two years of the war serving as a Yeoman in Washington DC. After her military service, she returned to Portland, where she met Bill at a Catholic Veterans' dance and was immediately swept off her feet by his big smile and warm Irish charm. 
