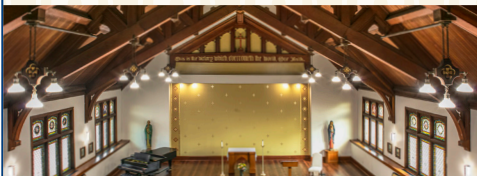

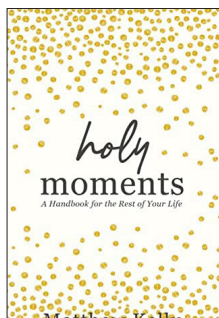

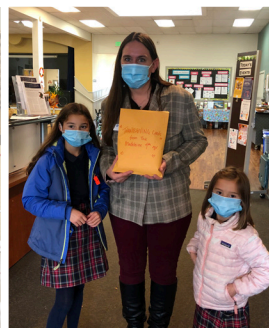


## The Haitian Project

Leslie Lee, founder of the Soul Box Project was the featured speaker at a November 18 open house, and a demonstration and opportunity to make soul boxes was planned for November 20.



## Care for our Common Home *Laudato Si*

Our initiatives to follow Pope Francis' lead and care for our common home has really taken off in 2022...and this is just the start. Here are a few of the activities/events from the year:

**Annual E-Waste Recycling Event (below left)**—Joined by parishioners from Holy Redeemer, St. Charles, and St. Andrew's, we had the largest collection in the history of this multi-year event.

**CLEAN Club (below center)**—Students in this Catholic Leadership Environmental Action Network club meet weekly to discuss things we can all do to protect our climate and environment. They also had a booth at The Madeleine Marketplace, where they sold items to raise money to plant trees in the Amazon rainforest.

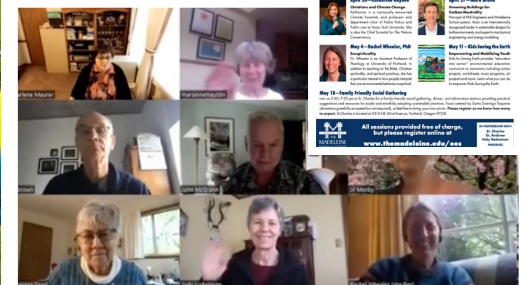
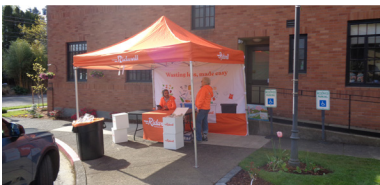

# Refugee Relief Program: Outreach Fund at work

As Catholics and as members of The Madeleine Community, we are all aware of our obligation to the world around us. Catholic Social Teachings, common sense as good stewards, and exhortations by Father Mike—these all ask us to look beyond ourselves to help those in need. Below, we have two examples of The Madeleine doing just that.

## REFUGEE FAMILY REPATRIATION

Recently, as we were working with Catholic Charities to adopt families for our annual Giving Tree, Father Mike asked, “Is there some more we can do?” Catholic Charities, of course, responded that they are working with a refugee family in need of some additional help.

The family was brought to the United States under false pretenses, then subjected to human trafficking here for years. Thankfully, the individuals who were causing the abuse were eventually caught, and the family was freed. Their next problem: How could they get back to their native South American home. That’s where Catholic Charities asked us to help.

Father Mike authorized use of our parish’s Outreach Fund to write a check to Catholic Charities to help pay the cost of airfare for this

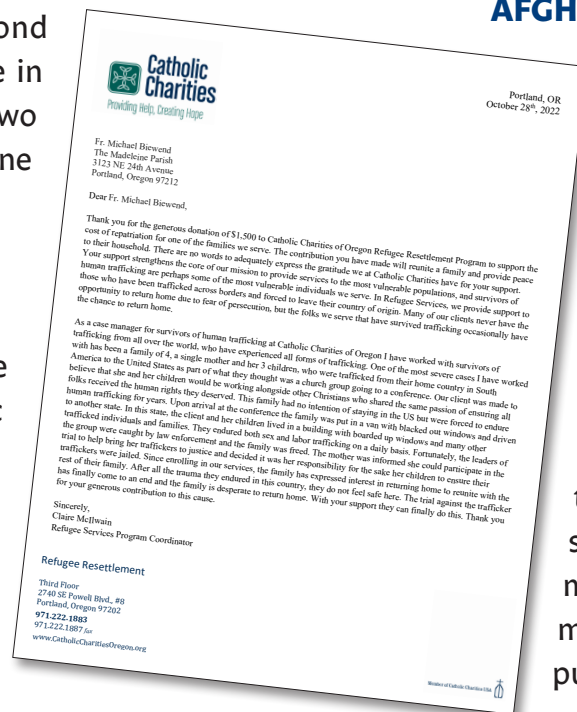

## AFGHAN SISTERS

Parishioner Catherine Glavan has been working with Catholic Charities’ Refugee Resettlement program for years, and brought to us another situation: Two Afghan sisters who were evacuated by the US military and are being resettled in Portland by Catholic Charities. After hearing of their story, Father Mike authorized parish funds to pay the security deposit on a new apartment for the sisters that will be much safer for them and closer to public transportation.

## REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT FUND

These are just two stories among hundreds of refugees in our community—people who need help paying for rent, utilities, food, and clothing. 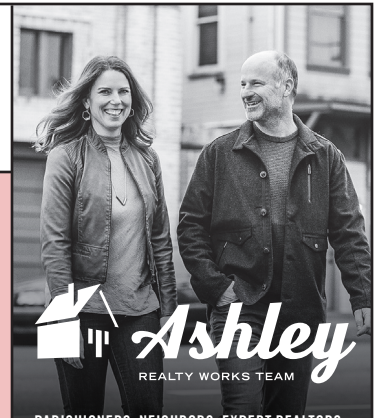

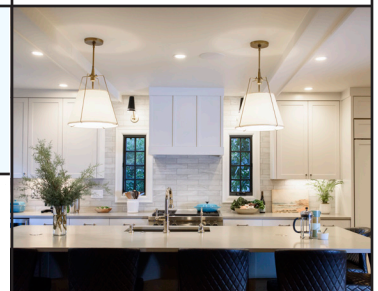
