ANOINTING OF THE SICK SERVICE

Saturday, February 11, 6:15 pm • Main Church

We offer this sacrament on February 11 in observance of the World Day of the Sick and the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. In 1992, Pope John Paul II established February 11 as the World Day of the Sick, urging people to pray for the ill and those who care for them. People all across the world take the opportunity to pray for the sick and those who labor tirelessly to alleviate their pain.

Before the Second Vatican Council, "Extreme Unction," meaning "last anointing," was only performed on the dying. Today, known as the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, it is more broadly administered. The Anointing of the Sick is not a sacrament only for those who are at the point of death. Rather, a priest may anoint any baptized Catholic whose health

is seriously impaired by sickness or old age. Sickness includes anyone experiencing a life-threatening operation or in danger of death because of illness or old age. During the sacrament, the priest anoints the forehead and the palms of the sick, while praying that God will save and raise them up. The anointing accompanies a prayer for physical and spiritual healing. The sacrament, through the power of the Holy Spirit, unites the sick person to Christ's suffering, and effects include a strengthening, peace, and courage to overcome the difficulties associated with serious illness or old age. The sacrament is a gift of the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of sins, restoration of health if it is conducive to the salvation of the soul, union with the passion of Christ, and a share in the saving work of Jesus.

COMMUNAL PENANCE SERVICE

Thursday, February 16 • 6:30-8:30 pm • Main Church

After a couple years without due to the pandemic, we are pleased to again offer our Communal Penance Service.

This service provides a unique opportunity for Catholics to confess sins and find forgiveness. Communal reconciliation

reminds us that our sin affects others and that we can be forgiven for the wrong we've done. Occurring just before Lent, on February 16, this Communal Penance is open to all parishioners. Additional priests will participate in hearing confessions.

Fifth Sunday in **Ordinary Time**

What does it mean to be salt, light, a city built on a mountain? Today's readings remind us that, as baptized Christians, we can't hide. God — who is a God of justice and mercy — had expectations of Israel. The Israelites weren't off the hook regarding how they were to act, and neither are the followers of Jesus. 

THE MADELEINE FAMILY REMEMBERS

ALAN GRAHAM MORRILL, JR.

A Funeral Mass will be held for parishioner Alan Morill on Friday, February 10, 11:00 am, at The Madeleine. Rosary will precede the Mass at 10:30 am.

Alan was born February 1, 1930, in Olympia, WA to Alan G. Morrill, Sr. and Elsie Knosher Morrill. Alan's father was employed with General Motors (GM) in Seattle and when the depression hit, GM closed its Seattle office and offered Alan Sr. a job in Detroit. Preferring to remain in the NW, the family moved to Portland where Alan's father bought a restaurant/coffee shop in a downtown office building. Alan was a depression era child, which taught him to not be wasteful and to be happy with what he had. Alan worked all through high school in his father's coffee shop, along with some of his best friends. He attended Beaumont Elementary School and graduated from Grant High School. He spent a summer driving across country with friends before attending Oregon State University (OSU) where he earned his degree.

Upon graduating from OSU, Alan enjoyed a summer of fun with all of his best buddies, never thinking about a career until his parents finally urged him to get a job. He applied to Bonneville and was accepted but couldn't envision a life sitting behind a desk. He then took the U.S. Department of State Foreign Service exam and passed, and from there he embarked on a satisfying career that took him around the world. He served as a political officer in Japan, Taiwan, Spain, Argentina, Venezuela, Italy, and Brazil. He was fluent in both Spanish and Italian. While he was on his first tour in Spain, he sent his parents \$1,000 to use as a down payment on a beach front property in Cannon Beach. He then took a hiatus from the State Department to try living simply at the beach along with his first wife and son Kenneth Alan (Kam). To make ends meet, he rented half of the house, but when that did not pay the bills, he got a job for a year as a Spanish teacher at Roosevelt High School (the principal told him he had never hired a teacher who actually spoke the language fluently). Not finding teaching his forte, he was able to be rehired by the State Department, and never looked back. Alan and Brenda met on his second tour in Spain, and they were married in 1976.

While he and Brenda were on a 5-year tour with the Embassy in Rome, Italy, they befriended two priests, both of whom later became Cardinals: Fr. Jorge Mejia and Fr. Leonardo Sandri, both of Argentina. Their two children, Michael and Laura, were born in Rome, and Fr. Mejia baptized both at

St. Peter's. After their daughter Laura married and had children, Cardinal Sandri graciously agreed to baptize them, and they were baptized in 2010 and 2012 at the baptismal font in the Fontana Chapel in St. Peter's.

After retirement, Alan's diplomatic and language skills were used in a series of kidnap/hostage negotiations in Mexico,



Guatemala, Colombia, Venezuela, and Brazil. He never lost anyone to the perpetrators.

Alan and Brenda were lifelong lovers of classical music and opera. In Rome, they had box seats at the Rome Opera. In Portland they were longtime subscribers to the Portland Symphony.

Alan did not grow up with any religious background, but he once remarked that most of his best friends over the years were Catholic. Coincidentally, he discovered after the renovation of The Old Madeleine Church that he had been best man at his childhood friend's wedding (Jack Smith and Shirley Isaacs) in the old church in the early 50's.

Alan was received into the Catholic Church in 2015 and was confirmed with the confirmation name of Pio (St. Padre Pio of Pietrelcina), with whom his son-in-law Michael has a family connection.

Alan and Brenda were devoted to each other and enjoyed a long and happy marriage of 47 years. Alan cherished his children and grandchildren beyond measure, and his grandchildren in particular brought him so much joy in his later years.

Alan is survived by his wife Brenda, his beloved children Kam (Mary Shea), Michael (Tara), Laura (Michael), beloved grandchildren Alexander, Sebastian, Henry and Hazel, nephew Scott Bowes (Catherine) and family. His sister Marianne Bowes predeceased him.



Anointing of the Sick

Joined to Christ, Witnesses of Hope and Healing

Anointing of the Sick is the sacrament that is received by those who are ill or suffering. By the sacred anointing and the prayer of the priest, the whole Church commends those who are sick to Christ. The sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gifts of strength, faith, peace, and courage, and his or her suffering is united with the suffering of Christ for the building up of the Church (Catechism of the Catholic Church [CCC], nos. 1520-23).

Through the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, the Church carries out Jesus' mission of compassion and healing for the sick. The one who is ill can also be a minister to others. By uniting their suffering to Christ, those who are sick can be signs of faith and witnesses of Christ's Resurrection to the entire community (Pope John Paul II, Christifideles Laici [The Vocation and the Mission of the Lay Faithful in the Church and in the World], no. 54).

A Communal Celebration

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is both "a liturgical and a communal celebration." In the family home, hospital, or church, members of the Body of Christ gather for the sacramental rite led by a priest. The Penitential Rite followed by the Liturgy of the Word and sacramental anointing of the sick can inspire and comfort both those who are ill and their family and friends who are gathered (CCC, nos. 1517-18). Many parishes have communal celebrations at which many persons receive the sacrament. These sacramental celebrations are a "source of strength amid pain and weakness, hope amid despair" and a "joyful encounter" for the entire community (Christifideles Laici, no. 54).

Connection to the Communion of Saints

Anointing with sacred oil is a sign of blessing by the Holy Spirit of the one who is sick. Oil of the Sick, which receives a different blessing from the Chrism oil used during Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders, recalls the community's sharing of the Holy Spirit and the sick person's connection to the entire Body of Christ and Communion of Saints.

Imitation of Christ's Compassion

In the Gospels, Christ's great compassion toward the sick is expressed in the miraculous healings he performs, which heal the entire person, both body and soul. Parables such as the Good Samaritan (Lk 10:29-37) and

the Judgment of the Nations (Mt 25:31-46) urge Christ's followers to share his ministry of compassion and healing and to imitate his "preferential love for the sick" and all who suffer (CCC, nos. 1503, 1506; Pope Benedict XVI, Sacramentum Caritatis [Sacrament of Charity], no. 22).

Solidarity with All Who Suffer

We care for the sick because we see them as children of God and part of our human family. When one part of the Body of Christ suffers, we all suffer (1 Cor 12:26). The suffering of one impacts everyone. Thus, we are called to solidarity, which is responsibility on the part of everyone with regard to everyone (Pope John Paul II, Sollicitudo Rei Socialis [On Social Concern], no. 38; Pope Benedict XVI, Caritas in Veritate [Charity in Truth], no. 38).

By our compassion, we remind those who are sick that "[the Church] shares your suffering. She takes it to the Lord, who in turn associates you with his redeeming Passion" (Synod of Bishops, *Per Concilii Semitas ad Populum Dei Nuntius*, no. 12). We are called to comfort, pray for and with, and be in solidarity with all who are sick or suffering.

Caring for those who suffer is not a burden, but a gift. Those who care for the sick do holy and important work; they walk with Christ's suffering people and in doing so, serve Christ himself (Mt 25:31-46). Those who minister to the sick and who work to secure decent health care for all become "the living sign of Jesus Christ and his Church in showing love towards the sick and suffering" (Christifideles Laici, no. 53).




