Our "official" patroness is St. Mary Magdalene (July 22) the patron saint of converts and women, and a legendary example of God's mercy and grace. She was there at the foot of the cross when Iesus died-and said to be the first to encounter the risen Christ in the garden. It is fitting that St. Mary Magdalene first thought Jesus was

the "gardener." For Christ is the master gardener—bringing forth the first fruits of the Resurrection and cultivating new life in all who believe.

ABOUT OUR RECYCLING PROGRAMS

The Madeleine participates in a number of recycling programs through the support of the company, Terracycle. Terracycle embraces the model of manufacturers selecting packaging for their products should bear a greater responsibility for recycling the materials (especially hard-to-recycle materials) rather than placing the burden on the end consumer. Terracycle negotiates with manufacturers to encourage them to voluntarily pay the costs of recycling their packaging materials. Because the programs are voluntary, some participants are periodically added and some are occasionally dropped. That is why you may notice changes in our flyer and also in the recycling center. You can always find the latest list of items we collect for recycling at **www.themadeleine. edu/terracycle** The most current flyer can be downloaded at any time and placed in a prominent place in your home.

MUSIC NOTES

AMERICA, THE BEAUTIFUL

On July 4th, America celebrates our Independence. Although only formally recognized as a holiday since 1941, this celebration traditionally dates back to July 2, 1776 – when Thomas Jefferson's historic document, the Declaration of Independence was adopted.

As a distinctly American holiday, most celebrate with fireworks, parades, concerts, and family gatherings. One of my most memorable 4th of July celebrations was on a choir tour-seeing the Pointer Sisters perform at the annual Capital Fourth concert in Washington, D.C. Undeterred by a deluge of rain, they sang "I'm So Excited" in their stiletto heels under the biggest golf umbrellas I have ever seen! Afterwards, we saw the magnificent fireworks while the orchestra played John Philip Sousa's "Stars and Stripes Forever." Now that's American! Since then, Michael and I attend the St. Paul Rodeo every year - one of the best in the country and just good old-fashioned fun. Our eyes never fail to well up with tears when the Announcer (also a Christian pastor) begins the rodeo with a prayer; followed by the posting of colors on horseback and the singing of our National Anthem. It is a slice of Americana unlike no other I have ever experienced.

There is no doubt that music plays an important part of our 4th of July celebrations—a time for both patriotic and other familiar songs in our American folk heritage. Although "America the Beautiful" is not often considered a sacred hymn, I find there is no better Independence Day song that celebrates the beauty of God's creation more than this one. The song was based on a poem written by professor, poet, and writer, Katharine Lee Bates. Written in 1893, Bates was inspired to write the poem on a trip to Pike's Peak, Colorado Springs, Colorado, where she declared, "all the wonder of America seemed there, with the sea-like expanse." The poem first appeared in print in The Congregationalist, a periodical for Congregational churches in the late 19th century. For years, it was sung to popular or folk tunes that would fit with the lyrics-among them, "Auld Lang Syne". Referred to some as the unofficial National Anthem, today we sing "America the Beautiful" to Samuel A. Ward's hymn tune, "Materna."

There is no denying the immense (and oft overwhelming) presence of God in the beauty of our country "from sea to shining sea." And we experience that each and everyday living in the Pacific Northwest. Finally, at The Madeleine, we are committed to caring for all God's creation—from our prize-winning roses to our serene courtyard, and our welcoming spirit to everyone and more—we continue to live the words of St. Francis' "Laudato Si." Perhaps Katherine Bates summed it up perfectly when she wrote:

O beautiful for spacious skies, For amber waves of grain, For purple mountains majesties Above the fruited plain! America! America! God shed His grace on thee, And crown thy good with brotherhood From sea to shining sea!



THE MADELEINE FAMILY REMEMBERS

Tom Hughes

Funeral Mass–Saturday, July 8, 11:00 am

A Funeral Mass will be held for longtime parishioner Tom Hughes on Saturday, July 8, 11:00 am at The Madeleine. A reception will follow in The Old Madeleine Church.

Tom—parishioner, former Madeleine School parent (Thomas '13, Michael '16), former Pastoral Council Chair, 2008 Auction Chair and co-chair of our 2011-2012 Centennial Celebration—died on June 15. He was 58.

The son of Nancy and Tom Hughes, Sr., Tom grew up in Eastmoreland with his sister, Kathleen. He attended Jesuit High School, graduating in 1982, then went on to earn a BA in Communications from Pepperdine University in 1986.

Out of college, Tom worked for Anhueuser-Busch, then in 1989, got into the footwear business—ending up with adidas America when Rob Strasser and Peter Moore brought the headquarters to Portland in 1992.

It was during his 31 years at adidas that Tom developed his knack for helping others. To quote his LinkedIn bio:

I network. I build alliances and partnerships ... I am loyal to a fault. I value family, friends and community above all else.

With these core values, Tom was able and positioned to assist community organizations with his time, effort, business expertise and natural networking talents, and provide them access to adidas products and gear.

It was a perfect combination for Tom, as he became a fixture on boards and in the trenches of charitable causes throughout the region. His legacy remains on organizations such as New Avenues for Youth, Bald Faced Truth Foundation, the Portland Rose Festival, Project Lemonade, Stand for Children Oregon, Carlton Soccer, and many more.

Said Sean Suib, Executive Director of New Avenues for Youth, "Tom was a wonderful community connector ... who truly cared for the Portland community. He supported New Avenues and the at-risk youth we serve for the past 20 years."

John Canzano, founder and president of the Bald Faced Truth Foundation, recounts, "Tom would always pop up out of nowhere and do the kindest things. Whatever the charity needed. He got it done."

Canzano continues, "He sat on the charity's board, volunteered at events, and often said 'What more can I do to help?' once there. He was especially involved in Camp Exceptional, [the charity's] annual summer camp for special-needs and typical kids. His impact on the event was immeasurable."

At The Madeleine, Tom served two terms as Pastoral Council Chair, was a co-chair of the 2008 Madeleine Auction, and was instrumental in the early seedlings of The Old Madeleine Church restoration during the Centennial Celebration planning in 2011-12...he was involved in and helped spearhead the very first planning for a capital campaign, organized meetings and tours with potential donors up in the then-decrepit space, and much more.

Also, it was the Hughes family who first considered that, instead of bringing one or two extra sandwiches (as was the custom



then) for St. Michael's Lunches (now known as Nourish Our Neighbors), they would bring one or two DOZEN lunches for the hungry on their appointed week. Other families soon followed this example, and now the program contributes as many as 10,000 or more lunches to the hungry each year.

Tom was fiercely devoted to his sons, Thomas and Michael. A hands-on father, Tom's connections and networking also allowed him to treat the boys to special experiences— including Notre Dame football games. He especially loved a great afternoon of golf with the boys at their Sunriver home.

As a friend, Tom was there with whatever you needed, sometimes even before you knew you needed it. A set of golf clubs, a football helmet or autographed memorabilia for your kids, custom Oregon Ducks golf shoes...Tom's generosity was legendary.

And if you happened to mention your mom was in the Peace Corps, Tom was there as well. "Tom and I were chatting after school about the need for shoes and clothing for the very poor Roma families," remembers friend Mary Hoglund. "Next thing I know he had shipped two HUGE boxes of shoes and clothing to Satu Mare, Romania for my Mom to hand out to families. Once that supply dried up, he sent ANOTHER two huge boxes."

Mary sums it up perfectly, "Such a good, generous, kind man."

In addition to sons Thomas and Michael, Tom is survived by his sister Kathleen Hughes (Scott Williams), and cousins John Edward Hughes and Carol Ronningen.
