Feast of St. Mary Magdalene

JULY 22 MARKS THE FEAST DAY of our patroness, St. Mary Magdalene. Mary Magdalene was a friend of Jesus who stood by his side all the way to the cross. All four Gospel accounts say that Mary Magdalene accompanied Jesus to his crucifixion. She was, according to these texts, the first person, or among the first, to witness the empty tomb. Both Mark and John say that Jesus not only first appeared to Mary Magdalene after he rose from the dead, but also that he commissioned her to be the first to announce the Good News. This is one reason why she is known as the "Apostle to the Apostles."



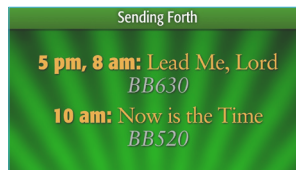

MARY MAGDALENE IN THE GARDEN

This weekend we are celebrating the Feast of St. Mary Magdalene. Besides being patron saint of The Madeleine, St. Mary Magdalene is known as the patron saint of converts, of women, contemplative life, and even hairstylists (although I'm not really sure about the last one). Suffice to say, she is a very busy saint!

One of the characteristics of Mary Magdalene was her fierce loyalty to Jesus after her conversion to Christianity. And so it makes sense that she represents those that are converts to the Catholic Church. It is often the converts (including my husband Michael) that make the best Catholics—like Mary Magdalene, they are loyal defenders of their faith and ardent disciples of Christ.

The story of Mary Magdalene serves as a model for all the rest of us. Known as a grave sinner, she was forgiven, converted to Christianity, and thus, became a devoted follower of Christ. She is probably most famous for being an eyewitness to Jesus's death on the cross. When the disciples were gone, Mary Magdalene stayed at the foot of the cross and wept. And she was the first to see Jesus in the garden after his Resurrection.

Because of her unwavering faith, the Church has always revered Mary Magdalene—called a “witness of Divine Mercy” by St. Gregory the Great and an “Apostle of the Apostles” by St. Thomas Aquinas. If you journey to Assisi, Italy, you can see frescoes of her life dating back to 1320 (attributed to Giotto, and recently restored) in the Magdalen Chapel—located in the lower chapel in the Church of St. Francis. Pope Francis recently recognized her as

a model of women's role in the Church, and elevated her from Memorial status to the rank of a Feast. In the eyes of the Church, that is a very big deal!

Although there is not a great deal of music written about St. Mary Magdalene, one of my favorites is the famous Gospel song, “In the Garden.” Written by C. Austin Miles in 1912, this song was recorded by everyone from Roy Rogers and Dale Evans to Perry Como, Rosemary Clooney and Elvis Presley. By his own account, Miles opened his bible to the Gospel of John 20 and became lost in the story of Mary Magdalene when Jesus appeared to her in the garden after the Resurrection. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, Miles wrote the lyrics to the song—writing the tune later that day. It is a simple, yet poignant song viewed through the eyes of Mary Magdalene. The hymn remains intact with both the original words and melody, as it was in 1912.

Perhaps it is the words of Pope Benedict XVI that best sums up the importance of St. Mary Magdalene in all of our lives. He said: The story of Mary of Magdala reminds us all of a fundamental truth. A disciple of Christ is one who, in the experience of human weakness, has the humility to ask for his help, has been healed by him and has set out following closely after him, becoming a witness of the power of his merciful love that is stronger than sin and death.

Please help us celebrate St. Mary Magdalene in our own Courtyard Garden on Saturday, July 22—Happy Feast Day!

Celebrating the Patronal Saint

Catholics often identify themselves by the name of the parish to which they belong. To say “I worship at St. Catherine,” or “My church is St. Boniface,” expresses a connection not only to the parish community but to the patron saint for which the church is named.

According to the *Code of Canon Law* and the *Order of the Dedication of a Church and an Altar*, every church that is dedicated must have a title or a name. In some cases, the names are derived from a particular title associated with Jesus, such as Christ Our Savior or Christ the King. In other cases, churches may be named for the Blessed Trinity, the Holy Spirit, or the Blessed Virgin Mary, but most are named for particular saints.

The practice of adopting the name of a saint can be traced back to the time of the Roman Empire, when church buildings were constructed over the graves of martyrs. The church was named for the martyr who was expected to intercede for all who worshipped there.

Other churches were named because of some connection to a saint who may have lived, preached, or died nearby, or whose relics were transferred there. As the number of Christian churches grew, it became common to name a church for the saint whose relics were housed there or whose name was associated with or venerated by the church’s founders.

Still today, the name of a new church is chosen by the clergy and the faithful. Churches named for days ranked as solemnities on the liturgical calendar, such as “Assumption,” “Annunciation,” and “St. Joseph” are celebrated as such by the universal Church. But according to the *Universal Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar*, the title of a particular church is also celebrated as a solemnity in that parish. That means that the Optional Memorial of St. Rose of Lima becomes a solemnity in parishes named St. Rose of Lima, and that the Feast of the Transfiguration can be marked as a solemnity in parishes named Transfiguration.

A parish may move its feast day to the closest Sunday in Ordinary Time. In this way, more people will be able to honor and celebrate their patron saint. The Lectionary readings from that saint’s feast day can be chosen along with the prayers designated for that saint in *The Roman Missal*.

Celebrating Mass is only one way to honor the patron saint of a parish. Consider offering activities related to the saint. For example, a church that is named after St. Ignatius might host a retreat on Ignatian spirituality. A church that is

named after St. Francis of Assisi might plant and maintain a garden to accent his care for nature. Create ways to teach children about the saint; invite them to draw pictures of or write essays on the life of the saint. Fill the bulletin with fun facts, crossword puzzles, or word searches related to the saint.

These and other activities can help today’s parishioners better relate to someone who walked the earth long ago and inspire them to live like their patron saint as a prophetic witness to the love of God.

READINGS AND GOSPEL FOR WEEKEND OF JULY 22–23, 2023

This weekend, we celebrate the feast day of our patroness, St. Mary Magdalene. In doing so, our Masses will use different readings than shown in the Breaking Bread books.

FIRST READING Zephaniah 2:3, 3:12-13

Seek the Lord, all you humble of the earth, who
have observed his law;
Seek justice, seek humility; perhaps you may be
sheltered on the day of the Lord's anger.
But I will leave as a remnant in your midst a peo-
ple humble and lowly,
Who shall take refuge in the Name of the Lord:
the remnant of Israel.
They shall do no wrong and speak no lies;
Nor shall there be found in their mouths a deceit-
ful tongue;
They shall pasture and couch their flocks with
none to disturb them.

SECOND READING 2 Corinthians 5:14-17

Brothers and Sisters:
For the love of Christ impels us, once we have
come to the conviction that one died for all;
therefore, all have died.
He indeed died for all, so that those who live
might no longer live for themselves but for
him who for their sake died and was raised.
Consequently, from now on we regard no one
according to the flesh; even if we once knew
Christ according to the flesh, yet now we
know him so no longer.
So whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old
things have passed away; behold, new things
have come.

GOSPEL John 20:1-2, 11-18

On the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene
came to the tomb early in the morning, while
it was still dark, and saw the stone removed
from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon
Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus
loved, and told them, "They have taken the
Lord from the tomb, and we don't know
where they put him."
Mary stayed outside the tomb weeping. And as
she wept, she bent over into the tomb and
saw two angels in white sitting there, one
at the head and one at the feet where the
Body of Jesus had been. And they said to her,
"Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to
them, "They have taken my Lord, and I don't
know where they laid him." When she had
said this, she turned around and saw Jesus
there, but did not know it was Jesus. Jesus
said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?
Whom are you looking for?" She thought
it was the gardener and said to him, "Sir,
if you carried him away, tell me where you
laid him, and I will take him." Jesus said to
her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in
Hebrew, "Rabbouni," which means Teacher.
Jesus said to her, "Stop holding on to me, for I
have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to
my brothers and tell them, 'I am going to my
Father and your father, to my God and your
God.'" Mary Magdalene went and announced
to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord," and
then reported what he told her.

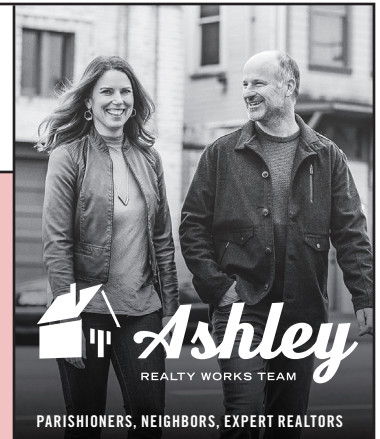
