DISCERNING CATHOLIC: EXPECTATIONS OF AN APOSTOLIC SPIRIT

Before we ever met, I had mentally settled the man inside a space confidently prepared for him. What I didn't know seemed inconsequential when compared to impressions created from remarkably few details: austere in belief and spirit, he intentionally set himself apart from the rest of "us," as deliberate a delineation as the white picket fence that split his scrupulously kept yard apart from the anonymous street. Planted here and there among the ornamental shrubbery glared obvious signs of a political stance I neither accepted nor valued; my expectations further diminished. When he offered my companions and I a guided tour of his yard, my doubts preceded me through the gate.

When Mary Magdala arrived at the tomb, she didn't come expecting the Risen Jesus. Overcome with grief and doubt, she saw only death and emptiness, so much so that angels couldn't shake loose her vision. Even Jesus, at first glance, appeared a simple gardener.

"Mary!" Jesus said to her, "Stop holding on to me!" Jolting loose the expectations she had carried to the tomb.

The man guided us through his yard quietly, with much pride and great courtesy,

sharing the stories and experiences behind the found objects and the hand-made signs, all meticulously placed, every one of them adding considerable dimension to otherwise empty space. Inside the gazebo he crafted with his own hands, the man pointed to a small, slatted-wood platform fitted with casters hanging on the wall.

"Can you tell me what that is?" he asked. "A mechanic's creeper," I replied.

He seemed pleased at my answer. And then I told him how much I admired the ancient bar clamps hanging ornamentally above the windows, heavy iron beasts still appearing bone-crushingly capable, despite their age. We basked a few moments more among our common interests before parting ways. Realizing that I'd been freed from the place I had prepared for myself, I gratefully shook his hand.

Rabbouni, I thought. Teacher.


