

A NOTE FROM FR. BONAVENTURE

Dear Madeleine Community,

I want to firstly thank you all for being so kind and welcoming over this last month. It seems like longer than a month already! You must know that it will take a few more months before I begin to piece together a memory for your names—if only you would wear name tags!



Partly because you have been so kind and welcoming, I feel the transition is going well—the staff have been so accommodating. I hope you are keeping them in your prayers because Fr. Mike was their friend, mentor, and father, as he has been for you.

You will already begin to notice some differences here in the life of the parish, and that is inevitable, as you can well imagine.

Rectory: New residents need their space

One difference that I would like to draw your attention to is the reality that I am living in the Rectory. For me, the physical nearness also expresses the spiritual nearness. But at the same time, I am a human being with a physical nature, with human physical and psychological needs. So I am working to find some healthy boundaries for the Rectory.

You may not know, but there will be three priests living in the Rectory beginning in September. Joining me in residence will be Msg., Murphy, who has lived here for years and Fr., Nazario, who works in the Chancery of the Archdiocese.

Rectory Dining Room and Kitchen: Meetings and event prep to move

In order to create a space that is healthy and human for the three of us to live in.

the use of the Rectory Dining Room and kitchen will be limited, especially during the evenings and on weekends. Those are times when a priest will want to cook a meal, maybe sit quietly or have a friend over, and recover from a typically busy and often emotionally charged day.

I'm not sure what that will mean for parish life entirely, but one thing is that coffee and donuts and other events that used the kitchen or dining room to prepare or clean up will have to make use of the parish kitchen in the hall. Meetings that plan the use of the rectory dining room will have to be moved to another common space on the property.

I am ever grateful to you for welcoming me and to the Archbishop for assigning me to The Madeleine and for supporting me in the transition. Please pray for the Archbishop as he leads a group of young people to World Youth Day!

LAUDATO SI' NEWS

Wednesday, August 2, 2023, is known as "Earth Overshoot Day," the date on which humanity depletes all the natural resources that the Earth can regenerate in the year. This day serves as a reminder of the unsustainable impact that we have on the planet. However, it can also serve as an inspiration for action. Individual actions make a difference! What you can do to help:

• Cut consumption and recycle more. Your first steps on this mission should be to reduce unnecessary purchases, opt for sustainable products, and reuse items

whenever possible. The Madeleine's year 'round recycling programs, in partnership with TerraCycle can help meet this goal by providing opportunities to recycle trash that can't be recycled curbside.

> Turn food waste into planet fuel with a home compost. Organic material that ends up in landfills produces harmful methane gases as it decomposes at a snail's pace. But when you compost things like banana skins and eggshells alongside "brown" materials (like leaves, straw, and paper), they break down faster and become plant fertilizer.

THE MADELEINE FAMILY REMEMBERS

DEBORAH (CAPPARELLI) BARSOTTI

Funeral Mass-Saturday, August 12, 10:00 am

A Funeral Mass will be held for longtime parishioner Debbie Barsotti on Saturday, August 12, 10:00 am at The Madeleine. A reception will follow.

Debbie died on August 2, after living a year with the complications of a bone marrow transplant for leukemia. Her faith and love of God guided all the days of her life and provided peace through the very end of her life.

She is survived by her children, their spouses/partners, and grandchildren: Benj & Jennie Barsotti (Bruno and Thomas), Sadie & Peter Hjorth (Samson, Elsie, and Greta), Peter & Tara Barsotti (William, Caroline, and Edward), Beth Barsotti & Herbert, and connected by love Jessie & Rob Wimer. Deb's legacy will live on in her community and all those they touch. She is survived by her husband, Richard, and her brother and sister-in-law, Doug and Bonnie Capparelli.

Debbie grew up in southeast Portland, attended Franklin High School followed by Marylhurst and Oregon State (go Beavs!). Dick and Debbie lived in Corvallis, Portland, Los Angeles, and then Northern Maine before returning home with the family to Portland in 1982. She and Dick married in 1970 and welcomed Benj, Sadie, Peter, and Beth into the family. She felt strongly that her house was meant for everyone who needed a place to be.

She lived her values every day of her life. At the beginning it was babysitting her cousins, being a Girl Scout, and even working as Girl Scout counselor. Then in early marriage before children, she worked at the White Shield home for Unwed Mothers. As her family grew, she volunteered in her children's schools and parish (Madeleine and Central Catholic), and eventually became an employee of Central Catholic where she was the Main Office Manager (MOM). She lived an unbroken thread of caring for children and families throughout her entire life.

She made sure that everyone (seriously, everyone!) knew that they had a place in the Barsotti home. All of her children knew that no matter how many people they brought home unexpectedly, they would all be welcomed and fed. These friends learned that they could come study here even when there were not any Barsotti children present.

With her first grandchild she claimed the title of "Nonna," Italian for grandmother. This loving, welcoming, nurturing role defined this stage of her life for her grandchildren and

anyone else who wanted or needed it. Her granddaughter, Caroline had asked Debbie to be her confirmation sponsor. When asked why, Caroline responded that not only was she her own Nonna, she was "a Nonna to everyone else, too."

Debbie, her family, and friends were fortunate to have a



period where she was home on hospice. She had so many friends and family stop by to see her and share her final moments. Her visitors brought countless stories of generosity, openness, faith, and role modeling. Even from her deathbed, Debbie ensured that her visitors were treated to her special "Nonna" hospitality. She made sure her helpers had the main bathroom wiped down and Dick had it stocked with clean hand towels. She insisted everyone be offered something to eat and drink. This was an easy task as, due to the generosity of visitors, the abundance of food already present had somehow increased by the end of the day—a true "fishes and loaves" phenomenon. If you were fortunate enough to visit the Barsotti home during Debbie's last days, you would see parents playing with their children in the same basement playroom still filled with the same toys they played with as children. (Some of the parents also checked out Deb's well-stocked pantry as they had so many times before.) People shared memories of their interactions with Debbie; she had the opportunity to hear how even the smallest moments with her made positive lifetime impacts.

The family is eternally grateful for the care and support from Dr. Migdady, Bone Marrow Transplant Team and the marvelous and caring staff on 14K at OHSU.


TIPS FOR GREEN LIVING (A)

Find a Family Farmer

Do you have a family farmer yet? The issue is about buying most of your vegetables directly from a local farmer. Imagine having baskets full of organic vegetables (delicious, fresh and pesticide-free) that could be conveniently dropped off close to your home. Thanks to Community Supported Agriculture (CSA), there is most likely an outlet in your area (even your church could become one!) which would provide you with fresh fruits and vegetables, even meat, on a weekly basis. Registration usually takes place in February and March, so look for "Community Supported Agriculture" in your area.

Save a Forest: Use a Towel or Rag

In North America, we cut down millions of trees each year in order to produce paper towels. To reduce our paper product consumption, save an old piece of clothing and use it as a rag to wipe up messes. By reusing materials, we decrease the pressure on our forests. This helps save forest ecosystems, which are an important part of the biodiversity of our planet.


