DISCERNING CATHOLIC: A QUIET AND PERSISTENT FAITH

Fed by a distant glacier, uncounted springs percolate up from the ground and invest the porous rock of a thousand-yearold lava flow. Filling voids and bridging fractures, the water flows clean and unfettered through the rock, seeking and examining spaces open to its measure. There are no river channels, no cathedrallike spaces to observe the water as it works. Above at the surface, there is only dark and unbroken lava rock stretching in every direction. Miles later, Hraunfosser, the "lava waterfalls", bursts clear and cold from the lava rock as a cascading string of strong and fully-formed falls almost a half-mile long. Here they join the blue waters of the Hvita River and continue their journey to the North Atlantic.

Is faith any different? Throughout the Gospels, Jesus winds his way through the

permeable matrix of Hebrew and Roman culture, investing them with healing and acceptance and love until the Word sprang clean and clear into the open air. Is it any different of us? Immersed in our modern society, perhaps we are called by our faith, not to carve up or move mountains, but to flow into them, become a part of them, quietly bringing comfort and healing where it is most needed.

Like the porous lava rock, our faith is imbibed with flowing waters, not least of all in the "one baptism for the forgiveness of sins." If you'd like wade to into such waters, come join in discussion with Discerning Catholics. We next meet on Tuesday September 5th from 6:30 to 8:00 PM in the church courtyard. SEASON OF CREATION— TURNING TOWARD GOD

A series: Part 1 of 4

September 1–October 4 marks the Season of Creation. Inspired by Pope Francis' encyclical, *Laudato Si*': On Care for Our Common Home," the Season of Creation provides a special emphasis on our call to ecological conversion and stewardship—a key pillar of Catholic Social Teachings.

In this powerful encyclical, Pope Francis notes individual self-improvement will not singly solve the challenges and complexities of today's world. Rather, a new creation is "experienced most effectively when done in communion with those of similar mind and heart" (*Creation at the Crossroads*, P. 91). Even so, we know that transformation begins internally and radiates externally.

Ecological conversions or "turnings" are interrelated, and when they grab our attention and are internalized, we are in solidarity with all of creation. It is then—and only then—that we work to counteract the world's environmental crises through actions of mercy, justice, and compassion.

What are these turnings, and why are they important? The first turning is toward God. Interior transformation flourishes when praying for a conversion of heart and in conjunction with God's grace.

How does one pray for a conversion of heart? It's as simple as saying a prayer before meals as a reminder of our dependence on God. Through mealtime prayer, we give gratitude for creation's sustaining gifts, give thanks and praise for the laborers who provide the gifts, and remember those who lack the basics to sustain life (Creation at the Crossroads, P. 90). This seemingly simple act globally connects all of God's creation.

The Season of Creation is the perfect time to begin "turning" both individually and collectively to breathe life into *Laudato Si*'. Let's get moving together to bring about an ecological conversion of our Common Home!


