NOTE FROM FR. BONAVENTURE

Dear Madeleine Community,

December 1st marked five months since I've arrived here at the Madeleine. I've been so grateful for your warm welcome. I'm learning the ropes around here, and I look forward to the upcoming Advent and Christmas Season!

I'm grateful that the Archbishop sent me here, and I'm grateful that he didn't send me here by myself. Besides me, there are two other priests assigned to The Madeleine: Msgr. Tim Murphy and Fr. Nazario Atukunda. The three of us live here at The Madeleine in the Rectory and are all part of The Madeleine Community. Msgr. Murphy and Fr. Nazario have jobs elsewhere and so are "In-Residence" at The Madeleine, and I'm here in a full-time pastoral role for the community.

As members of the community here, Msgr. Murphy and Fr. Nazario also celebrate Masses and make themselves available for confessions. Between the two of them, they will usually celebrate one of the weekend Masses, and I celebrate the other two. The Mass schedule here at The Madeleine, even with three Masses on the weekend, is not too taxing,

but one thing about their sharing the Mass schedule with me that is really a benefit for me—and I think for you—is that it highlights the truth that priestly ministry is not about one particular personality, but it is a share in Jesus's priesthood. We priests share a fraternity in this ministry. And if we add Deacon Mike into the mix, the chorus of voices more clearly speaks the truth than one voice alone.

Msgr. Murphy, Fr. Tim, is well known in the Archdiocese of Portland, and has served for many years the community at Central Catholic High School. Fr. Nazario has been serving as a Canon Lawyer in the Tribunal of the Archdiocese since 2014. He moved here in September from St. John the Baptist, but he is from Uganda, and the Archdiocese of Portland is very fortunate to have him serving as a missionary to our Church. Most likely he will return home after a fruitful time in missionary service.

I thank you for welcoming all of us, and we—if I may speak for the other priests—consider it a privilege to serve you in priestly ministry!

The Madeleine Giving Tree Benefits Children of Incarcerated Parents &


Benetits Children of Incarcerated Parents & Community Transition School

The tradition of The Madeleine Giving Tree will continue this year and the need has never been greater. This year we will be supporting two worthwhile and grateful organizations.

Northwest Family Services Children of Incarcerated Parents—These children face countless barriers including abuse, neglect, homelessness and food insecurity, as well as having one or both parents incarcerated.

Community Transitional School—CTS serves students ages 4-14 from Multnomah County who live in homeless and domestic violence shelters, cheap motels, on the floor of a friend's home and even inside of their cars. Some are from families that are on the brink of losing their housing; others have just recently managed to move into permanent housing. All children are in situations where poverty and uncertainty dominate much of their young lives. Please read the tags carefully for this group...due to their mobile nature, the tags indicate specific needs. IMPORTANT NOTE: Each of these CTS tags has many gift ideas listed for each child, along with clothing and shoe sizes. Feel feel free to just choose a single item on the child's gift tag lists. If you wish more, that's OK too. Most important is that every child receives at least one gift.

Tags have been hung on the tree in the Parish Hall driveway. Get there early...they get claimed very quickly!





This special favor was conferred on her because of her role in God's plan for our salvation. 

The Magnificat (L£ 1:46-55)

And Mary said:

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me, and holy is his Name.

He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation. He has shown the strength of his arm, he has scattered the proud in their conceit.

He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty.

He has come to the help of his servant Israel for he remembered his promise of mercy, the promise he made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children forever.

Mary, Mother of the Church

Jesus gave Mary to the Church from the cross when he told his beloved disciple, "Behold your mother" (John 19:26-27). Mary was present in the upper room with the other disciples on Pentecost, when the Church was born (Acts 1:13-14). Over the centuries of Christianity, Mary has been sought out by the faithful who find in her support for their own lives of discipleship. As one whose own life of faith was not easy or simple, Mary is a companion who can show us a path in our everyday lives and in our suffering.

Mary is a wonderful example of what happens when one opens oneself to the life and power of God. As at the marriage at Cana, Mary always directs our attention to Jesus, saying "Do whatever he tells you." (John 2:5). Mary is not a goddess wielding power. Neither is she controlling and domineering nor cold and aloof. Mary is there for us whenever we need her.

Why Define This Doctrine?

The doctrine of Mary's Immaculate Conception affirms that through God's grace she was never separated from God by sin. Over the centuries Mary's freedom from original sin-the teaching that every human is born in the wrong relationship with God (this is what sin is and does) and so must be freed from this condition through God's grace (this is what salvation is and does)—was disputed by theologians who could not agree.

After consulting with the Bishops of the Church to confirm that almost all Catholics believed this doctrine, Pope Pius IX first solemnly proclaimed the dogma of the Immaculate Conception in 1854 in these words: We declare, pronounce and define that the doctrine which asserts that the Blessed Virgin Mary, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God, and in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, was preserved free from every stain of original sin is a doctrine revealed by God and, for this reason, must be firmly and constantly believed by all the faithful.

WHY DECEMBER 8?

December 8 is the liturgical celebration of Mary's Immaculate Conception, i.e., her being "adorned from the first moment of her conception with the splendors of an entirely unique holiness" (Vatican II, Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, #56). This date was chosen because it is 9 months (the time of a child's gestation in the mother's womb) before the traditional celebration of the feast of the Nativity of Mary on September 8.

APrayer for the Immaculate Conception

We thank you, O Mother, because in showing yourself to us You free us of all stain of sin; You remind us that what comes first is the grace of God, The love of Jesus Christ who gave his life for us, The strength of the Holy Spirit which renews all things. Let us not give in to discouragement, But, trusting in your constant help, Let us engage ourselves fully in renewal of self, Of this city and of the entire world. Pray for us, Holy Mother of God!


