Adoration: Divine Help For 2 Millennia

"Ever since Pentecost, when the Church, the People of the New Covenant, began her pilgrim journey towards her heavenly homeland, the Divine Sacrament has continued to mark the passing of her days, filling them with confident hope," Pope St. John Paul II wrote in his April 17, 2013 encyclical letter on the Eucharist. Even though Eucharistic Adoration developed slowly in the church, writings of the first Christians tell us they already believed that Jesus truly was in their presence in the consecrated bread and wine.

Tuesday Adoration begins after the 8 am Mass, ends at 2 pm.

CELL PHONES & CHILDREN, BEST PRACTICES

February 8, 7:00-8:30 pm presented by Liberty House Prevention Team.

This training combines factual information of the risks to our children's mental health, and usable tools that you can implement to safely navigate the digital world with your family. Participants will learn through child-focused activities how our self-worth can be influenced by devices and how external factors can affect what we do on online. Other Best Practice items discussed in this training include: boundaries and why we need to set them, modeling healthy behaviors early on, apps to be aware of, creating your own family digital media contract, and the 5 questions to ask your child when they go online. About the facilitator:

Liberty House is the Child Abuse Assessment Center serving Marion and Polk Counties, in Oregon. The Prevention Department provides trainings and education to the community to keep children safe.
