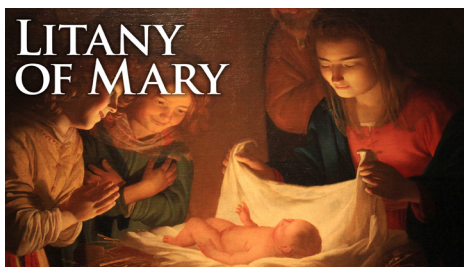
A May tradition at The Madeleine: celebrating the Month of Mary and Mother's Day in a special way!

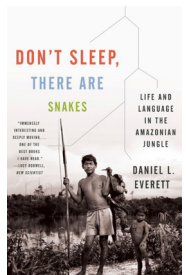
Several pregnant mothers who recently arrived in Oregon from Haiti, Afghanistan, and the Ukraine have also been helped in 2024.

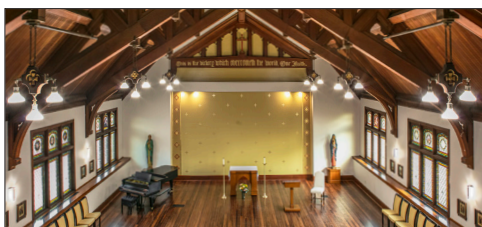
ARCHBISHOP'S CATHOLIC APPEAL

USCCB NATIONWIDE CALL TO PRAYER

On March 26, 2024 the U.S. Supreme Court heard oral arguments in a case that has the potential to make a major impact in the widespread accessibility of chemical abortion (abortion pills). Chemical abortions are now the most common form of abortion in the United States.

Archbishop Timothy P. Broglio, President of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, and Bishop Michael F. Burbidge, Chairman of the USCCB Committee on Pro-Life Activities announced a nationwide invitation to prayer. It's not too late to join in this prayer to St. Joseph, Defender of Life, daily until a decision is expected in June 2024:

LOIS IRENE WATTS

Funeral Mass—Friday, May 3, 11:00 am

A Funeral Mass for Lois Watts will be held on Friday, May 3, 11:00 am at The Madeleine. A rosary precedes the Mass at 10:30 am.

Lois Irene Watts (1926-2024) was born to Gordis and Agnes Watts. She lived on a farm outside of Canby, Oregon with her parents and older sister, Virginia. Lois graduated from Oaklawn Grade School in 1940 and Canby Union High School in 1944.

After graduating from high school, Lois worked as a clerk at the Woolen Mills in Oregon City, P & C Hand Forged Tool Co., and Swett and Crawford. She was on a bowling team in 1948 and 1949, and was the Secretary of the League. Lois married George Sykes in January of 1949, whom she met at the wedding of her cousin, Connie Learfield, to Lester Smith.

Lois was an initially a homemaker, who devoted her time to her children and their activities. Lois was a parishioner at Ascension Catholic Church for 60 years. She was a leader with Girl Scouts as well as Boy Scouts. She was involved in Ascension School's PTA as well as volunteering for charities. In 1969, when her oldest son, Gerry, was a Senior in High School, Lois went to work as a payroll clerk at David Douglas HS. She retired in 1980.

Lois was preceded in death by George, her husband of 64 years, in 2013; her two sons, Gerald in 2010 and Dennis in 2020; and her son-in-law, Michael McCary, in 2007. Lois is survived by her two daughters, Victoria McCary and Renee Sykes as well as her daughters-in-law, Ellen Otis-Sykes and Teri Sykes. Lois is also survived



by her five granddaughters: Heather Wilson (Mark), Michelle McCary, Devyn Lomax (Steve), Madelyn Harrison (Doug), and Brianne Sykes. Lois has four great grandchildren, Theodore, Francis, and Magdalena Wilson and Parker Lomax.

Lois really enjoyed family celebrations, especially when playing cards was involved. She was game for anything. Lois' fun-loving spirit, sense of humor, and love for her family will be greatly missed.

- ▶ More than **8.5 tons of electronic waste** was kept from our landfills, filling two trucks
- ▶ **7 large boxes of used, worn socks** were collected, to be recycled into new items
- ▶ **650 pairs of used, worn athletic shoes** filled 22 large shipping bags.

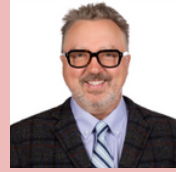

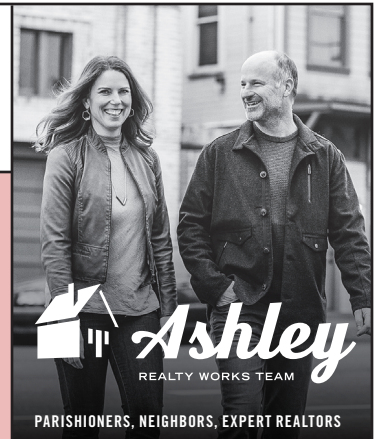

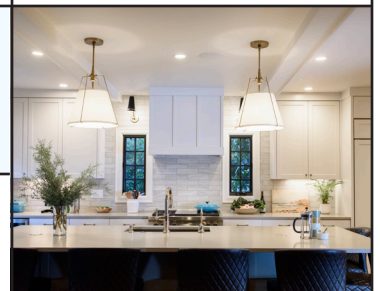
