
A May tradition at The Madeleine: celebrating the Month of Mary and Mother's Day in a special way!

## THE MC EXPERIENCE: A CALL TO SERVICE

PARISH LIFE

Good Friday. During the first reading Father Bonaventure caught my eye and mouthed a few words I wasn't adept enough to understand. In the shuffle of the lector and cantor as the reading ended, I walked over and knelt beside the presider's chair.

"Did you need something?" I asked.

"The Monsignor has arrived," Father B. replied.

In the sacristy, Monseigneur Murphy looked up as I approached, smoothing the purple stole draped over his shoulders.

"I can't find a red stole," he said simply. I smiled and shrugged, not really knowing where to look either. "We have a chair prepared for you near the presider's chair," I said, extended a hand in that direction, and followed him into the sanctuary.

Good Friday and no chance to rehearse the procession of the cross. Rather than risk the uncertainty and confusion of the altar servers, I followed them and Deacon Mike down the aisle. Cross uncovered and candles lit, we processed forward, pausing three times for the proclamation and adoration of the cross. At the altar, together we positioned the candles where they would light the cross in its resting place. "Good job," I whispered as they filed past, "well done."

Easter Vigil. The altar server sat alone near the presider's chair, visibly nervous, the missal closed in her lap.

"When do I go back to the other side?" she whispered.

"We have seven readings and seven prayers for which you'll need to hold the book for Father B. After the seventh prayer, you can go back to where you'd normally sit."

We opened the missal to the readings. I opened my notebook, cross-referenced the correct passage, pointed to the prayer in the missal. She nodded.

By the fourth prayer, we had reversed roles; she pointed, and I nodded. The missal lay open in her lap. I quickly placed a finger on the last three prayer passages.

"Three more and you're done. I need to go now," I told her, "You've got this."

Her eyes blazed with confidence: "Thanks," she said, and smiled.

In ancient Greece, "liturgy" described a duty performed voluntarily in service to the people. As a liturgical minister, the Master of Ceremonies fits this description well.

Several pregnant mothers who recently arrived in Oregon from Haiti, Afghanistan, and the Ukraine have also been helped in 2024.


Mother & Child Education Center, located at 1515 NE 41st, also welcomes donations of gently loved children's clothing from zero to 5, maternity cloth-

## ADORATION: "HE IS WITH US! BE NOT AFRAID!

Ten years after Pope John Paul II was declared a saint, "Countless stories are told of his devotion to the Eucharist," says Father Jeffrey Kirby, pastor of Our Lady of Grace parish in Indian Land, South Carolina. On the anniversary of the pope's canonization, April 27, Father Kirby included one of those stories about the pope in a commentary for the National Catholic Register: . . . " His personal staff were looking for him in the Apostolic Palace and grew alarmed when they couldn't find him. They had checked the chapel but he wasn't there, or so they thought. Only after a few other sweeps of the palace did an aide actually walk into the chapel, rather than just opening the door and visually scanning the room...Walking in, he discovered the pope lying prostrate, arms extended in cruciform, and in deep contemplation before his Eucharistic Lord." Father Kirby concludes: "If there had been no Eucharistic devotion in the man, then there would never have been a Pope St. John Paul II. From the beginning of his pontificate, he directed the Church to her Eucharistic Lord. The love and homage of the man for the Blessed Sacrament wanted to yell from the rooftops, "'The Lord is with us! Trust in him. Be not afraid!'"

Tuesday Adoration begins after the 8 am Mass, ends at 2 pm.



A Funeral Mass for Patti Dryden will be held on Saturday, May 11, 11:00 am at The Madeleine.

Patti Elizabeth Dryden, a beloved member of the Portland and Milwaukie communities, passed away on April 2 at age 74 after a courageous battle with ALS. Patti will be remembered for her dedication to her family, her profession and her joy for life.

Patti grew up with five siblings in Portland's Irvington neighborhood. She attended The Madeleine Catholic School and St. Mary's Academy in Portland.

Patti's compassion and determination were evident throughout her 38 years as a Neonatal Intensive Care nurse at OHSU's Doernbecher Children's Hospital. She attended to high-risk labor and deliveries and cared for premature, ailing, and terminally ill infants, offering them hope and healing. Patti's commitment to her work impacted countless families, who will forever be grateful for her kindness and expertise.

Patti was also a devoted mother to her children, Erik, Lisa, and Scott, and her late son Michael. As a single mother, they were her greatest loves.

Patti had an adventurous spirit and loved to travel. Her journeys took her to many countries, including China, Turkey, Estonia, and much of Western Europe, giving her unforgettable memories.

Patti died peacefully at home with her three children and youngest sister Kathy Dryden by her side, surrounded by love. She is survived by her children as well as her brothers Jack and Richard, and sister Kathy. Patti was preceded in death by her son Michael, sister Peggy, brother Robert and her parents, Alfred Earl and Kathryn Dryden.
