NOTE FROM FR. BONAVENTURE: CONFIRMATION AND YOUTH GROUP

Dear Young People Seeking Confirmation and Their Parents,

There are a few developments for upcoming Confirmation classes we want to inform you of.

The first is that the Archdiocese has decided to offer Confirmation regionally instead of parochially (in individual parishes) beginning with this upcoming year. They will schedule a number of opportunities in the region which The Madeleine Parish can attend for youth receive the sacrament of Confirmation. We don't know that schedule vet.

At The Madeleine, we've also decided to do our Confirmation preparation a little differently than in past years. After moving Confirmation to the seventh grade, we've had a relatively small number of people receiving the sacrament here in the parish. Similar to many of our neighboring parishes, we will be offering Confirmation every other year for anyone seventh grade and older. In spring 2024, we year we had 14 or so seventh graders confirmed, so with no Confirmation occurring in 2025, we anticipate that we will have around 30 or so seventh and eighth graders in the

spring 2026 class.

Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns on this plan.

At the same time, we are hoping to begin a middle school youth group here at The Madeleine, which sixth, seventh, and eighth graders may attend. The youth group will be an opportunity to grow in faith and fellowship and develop the habits necessary to navigate the world with Christ. We are currently considering using LifeTeen's Edge Nights for a curriculum for this group...a program I used in the Bronx and found to be dynamic and engaging. Of course, we had to make it Boogie Down Bronx style there, so we'll see what character Portland youth groups take on.

Lauren Craig, who is our new Faith Formation and Sacramental Prep Coordinator will be planning and coordinating both the Youth Group and next year's Confirmation class. Keep your eyes open for more information from her!



A Funeral Mass will be held for Madeleine parishioner George Miller on Saturday, September 14, 10:00 am at The Madeleine.

George Joseph Miller, Sr. passed away on August 24, 2024, in the presence of his loving family. George was born on February 11, 1937 at Quincy City Hospital in Massachusetts to Vincent and Helen (Breen) Miller. George attended the Benedict Fenwick School, the Quincy School, and North Quincy High School.

At the age of 16, he enlisted in the U.S. Air Force. His military service took him to Sampson Air Force Base; Lowry Intelligence School; the Aeronautical Chart and Information Center; and the U.S. Army Language School. George shipped out to Osan Air Force Base in South Korea, and after a shrapnel injury, was hospitalized at Tokyo Army Hospital in Japan. He was then stationed at Sharoi Air Intelligence Base; the 6004th Air Intelligence Service Squadron; and the Tachikawa Air Force Base.


Following his military service, George completed his high school equivalency at Boston's Newman Preparatory School. He joined VISTA (Volunteers In Service to America) in 1964 as the 51st volunteer to serve in the program. George attended Portland State University and earned his Bachelor of Science in History. At PSU, George met his future bride, Jean Laughlin. George and Jean were married in 1974 at Holy Redeemer Catholic Church, and moved to Vancouver, WA in 1977.

George worked as director of the Work Release Program and Prosecutorial Services, and founded the Victim Witness and Drug Awareness programs in Clark County. In 1978, George was elected Clark County Clerk, and was elected to a second term in 1982. As president of the Washington Association of County Clerks, he was named Clerk of the Year in 1985. George attended Judicial College at the University of Nevada, and was a Graduate Fellow of the Supreme Court at the University of Colorado Law School. He earned a Certificate from the Institute for Court Management in 1986.

George rounded out his career as District Court Chief Executive, head of probation, court magistrate, and Superior Court Chief Deputy. After his 2007 retirement, his "hobbies" included a position in Operations with the Portland Center for the Performing Arts; and chairmanship of Vancouver's Civil Service Commission.

George loved family reunions, vacations, cooking, and dining out. His annual Thanksgiving buffet was legendary, and his sense of humor, storytelling, and ukulele skills a delight to all. On May 11, 2024, George and Jean celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary. A reliable and steadfast individual, his memory will live on in the many lives he has touched.


