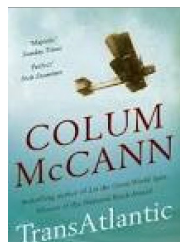

Why Serve as Master of Ceremony?

Easter Vigil. Two neophytes, newly baptized, process up the main aisle relighting the congregations' processional candles from the flames of their baptismal candles. Candle by candle, row by row, a shimmering tide of light rises, earnestly flowing from the baptismal font forward to the steps of the sanctuary where the Pascal Candle stands, burning singular and bright. As a spectacle of faith, this is a magical moment, the many becoming one in the regenerative power of Christ. Yet it is in my heart's vision where emotion overwhelms. For in that sea of light my heart stands witness to Christ as he strips the funeral cloth from his eyes to gaze the length of his shrouded body renewed and bursting with life, past his feet and out to the door of

the tomb where, the stone rolled back, the morning sun rises.

Serving as the Master of Ceremony (or MC for short) for last year's Easter Vigil and all the Triduum Services was, for me, an experience whose full meaning I can't adequately describe and yet it's one I can share. SCAM ALERT

More emails and texts fraudulently claiming to be from Father Bonaventure have been received by some parishioners and staff.

Email and text message scams such as this are proliferating not only in our Archdiocese, but nationwide.

First, the victim receives a fake text or email from a fraudster impersonating Fr. Bonaventure saying, “I need a favor from you,” or similar.

If the victim replies to the text, the fraudster may ask for iTunes or Google Play gift cards or other difficult to trace/easy to redeem methods, this time purporting to “surprise some of our wonderful staff members.”

A few ways to know it’s fraud:

- ▶ Father B—or anyone on your parish or school staffs—**will never ask you to purchase gift cards and send them the numbers.**
 - ▶ **The email number or text number is wrong.** Fr. Bonaventure will only send emails via his parish address: fatherbonaventure@themadeleine.edu
 - ▶ Also note: sometimes these texts are faked to be from other people you may know...parishioners, friends, etc.
- If you are ever in doubt as to whether a request for money or assistance is legitimate, call the School or Parish Office during work hours.

Highlights of your Itinerary:

▶ **Assisi**—After arriving in Rome, we begin our Pilgrimage in Assisi, Italy—the heart of the Umbria region and the hometown of St. Francis. With its picturesque cobblestone streets and geranium window baskets, Assisi IS Italy! We will spend 3 nights in Assisi, where we will visit the Basilica of St. Francis, pray at the tomb of St. Francis and view the famous Giotto frescoes depicting his life. We will also visit the Basilica of St. Clare where Francis was called to rebuild his church. Finally, we will pray at the Church of St. Mary of the Angels, which houses the original church of St. Francis. There will be free time to enjoy the spirituality and beauty of Assisi and the surrounding area at your leisure. Optional day trip by train to Florence, Italy.

▶ **San Giovanni Rotondo**—Travel from Assisi to San Giovanni Rotondo for an overnight trip to celebrate the Feast of St. Padre Pio. Join thousands of Pilgrims in a candlelight procession and mass at the Sanctuary of St. Pio. As we travel along the beautiful Gargano Peninsula we will stop for mass at the Grotto of St. Michael the Archangel and other holy sites as time allows. Our Pilgrimage continues in Rome, where we will spend the next several days immersed in this majestic city.

▶ **Rome**—While in Rome, we will celebrate the Jubilee Year of the Church (the Year of Hope) with pilgrims from all over the world. This is an opportunity of a lifetime! In addition to our scheduled itinerary we will have an opportunity to join in special activities specifically for the Jubilee Year. Among our scheduled activities, we will attend the Papal Audience at St. Peter's Basilica, with guided tours of the Basilica of St. Peter and the Sistine Chapel. We will also visit and celebrate Mass at the Catacombs of Priscilla, where the early Christians worshipped. Our Pilgrimage will also include guided visits to The Basilicas of St. Paul Outside the Walls, St. John Lateran and the exquisite Church of Santa Maria Maggiore. It is said that Pilgrims who walk through the doors of these Holy churches during a Jubilee Year receive special graces! We will also have an opportunity to see the Pantheon, Colosseum, Piazza Navona, and throw a coin in the Trevi Fountain before traveling back to the USA or to Dubrovnik, Croatia.

▶ **Optional Extension; Medjugorje & Dubrovnik**—We arrive in Dubrovnik and travel to Medjugorje—nestled in the hills of Bosnia- Herzegovina. Medjugorje is a place of peace and prayer like no other on earth. Our time in Medjugorje will include such activities as daily Holy Mass; climbing Cross Mountain and Apparition Hill for those that are able; attending talks with the visionaries (if available); or just spending time with the locals and sharing in the faith journey of others—a true spiritual experience. From there, the final two days of our optional extension will be spent in the beautiful city of Dubrovnik, Croatia.

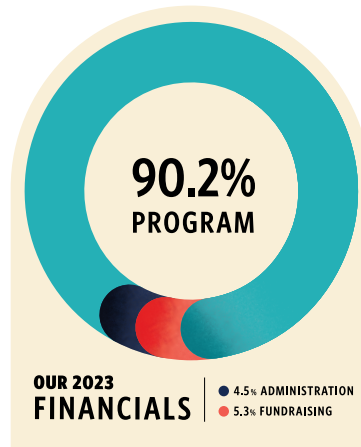

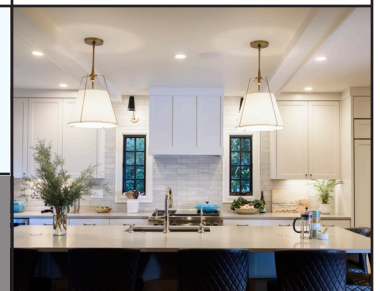
