What It Means to be a Master of Ceremonies

The Ceremonial of the Bishops explains that the role of the Master of Ceremony (MC) is to “plan liturgical celebrations in a way that encourages fruitful participation by the people and enhances the beauty of the rites... arrange with the cantors, assistants, ministers, and celebrants the actions to be carried out and the texts to be used.” At the same time, the MC, robed in either alb or cassock and surplice, will “exercise the greatest discretion: he is not to speak more than is necessary, nor replace the deacons or assistants at the side of the celebrant. The master of ceremonies should carry out his responsibilities with reverence, patience, and careful attention.”

In practice, the work of the MC occurs behind the scenes; if all goes as planned, there’s

little for the MC to do as the liturgy unfolds. If anything, the MC shepherds the liturgy, its celebrants, its servers, and its participants, quietly supporting the players in their roles and ensuring green fields seamlessly appear to the flock at their proper time. And when the liturgy is complete, smiles and commendations for a job well done are offered freely to all. The experience is its own gift, given and received.

The Liturgical Year



The Presentation of the Lord

On February 2nd, the Holy Mother Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. It is in fact a combined feast, commemorating the Jewish practice of the purification of the mother after childbirth and the presentation of the child in the Temple. The Mosaic Law taught that, since every Jewish male child belonged to Yahweh, the parents had to “buy back” the child (“redeem” him), with the payment of “five shekels to a member of the priestly family.” In addition, every mother had to be purified after childbirth by prayers and the sacrifice of a lamb (or two turtle doves for the poor) in the Temple. And so, this feast is known as the Feast of the Purification of Mary and, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. It is also known as the Feast of Encounter, because the New Testament, represented by the Baby Jesus, encountered the Old Testament, represented by Simeon and Anna, who had been waiting for the revelation of God’s salvation. Simeon prophesied both the universal salvation that would be proclaimed by Jesus and the necessity of suffering in the mission of the Messiah. The same day we also celebrate the Feast of Candlemas, marking forty days after Christmas. Candles are blessed today for liturgical and personal use and people take part in a candlelight procession, which remind us that Jesus is

our High Priest and the Light of the World. We celebrate all these events on this day as a formal ending of the Christmas season.

Today’s principal feast, “The Presentation of our Lord” reminds us of our presentation in the Church. Every Holy Mass in which we participate is our presentation. Although we were officially presented to God on the day of our Baptism, we are called to present ourselves on the altar before God at every Holy Mass. Hence, we need to live our daily lives with the awareness both that we are dedicated people consecrated to God and that we are obliged to lead holy lives.

Further, on this day the parents are reminded of their duty to present their children in the Church without ignoring the need of instilling the Christian faith to the next generation. Let us pray:

*Lord Jesus, as an infant you were brought to the temple by Your parents out of religious duty. Help all parents to take their duties to God seriously, to inculcate their faith in the next generation by their words and by their actions, so that the faith will be handed on where the faith is first learned—
in the family and in the home.*

Jubilee Year 2025: Pilgrims of Hope

As the Universal Church begins Jubilee Year 2025 (the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord), the USCCB is thrilled to support the Holy Father in this “event



of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church.”

Pope Francis stated in his February 2022 letter announcing the Jubilee 2025: “We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision. The forthcoming Jubilee can contribute greatly to restoring a climate of hope and trust as a prelude to the renewal and rebirth that we so urgently desire...”

The Jubilee Year will offer the faithful opportunities to participate in various jubilee events at the Vatican and in their own dioceses. The great tradition of opening the Holy Door began when Pope Francis opened the Holy Door of St. Peter’s Basilica on December 24, 2024. Other holy doors were opened at the Rome basilicas of St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major and St. Paul Outside the Walls. For pilgrims who cannot travel to Rome, bishops around the world are expected to designate their cathedrals or a popular Catholic shrine as special places of prayer for Holy Year pilgrims, offering opportunities for reconciliation, indulgences and other events intended to strengthen and revive faith.

Highlights of your Itinerary:

▶ **Assisi**—After arriving in Rome, we begin our Pilgrimage in Assisi, Italy—the heart of the Umbria region and the hometown of St. Francis. With its picturesque cobblestone streets and geranium window baskets, Assisi IS Italy! We will spend 3 nights in Assisi, where we will visit the Basilica of St. Francis, pray at the tomb of St. Francis and view the famous Giotto frescoes depicting his life. We will also visit the Basilica of St. Clare where Francis was called to rebuild his church. Finally, we will pray at the Church of St. Mary of the Angels, which houses the original church of St. Francis. There will be free time to enjoy the spirituality and beauty of Assisi and the surrounding area at your leisure. Optional day trip by train to Florence, Italy.

▶ **San Giovanni Rotondo**—Travel from Assisi to San Giovanni Rotondo for an overnight trip to celebrate the Feast of St. Padre Pio. Join thousands of Pilgrims in a candlelight procession and mass at the Sanctuary of St. Pio. As we travel along the beautiful Gargano Peninsula we will stop for mass at the Grotto of St. Michael the Archangel and other holy sites as time allows. Our Pilgrimage continues in Rome, where we will spend the next several days immersed in this majestic city.

▶ **Rome**—While in Rome, we will celebrate the Jubilee Year of the Church (the Year of Hope) with pilgrims from all over the world. This is an opportunity of a lifetime! In addition to our scheduled itinerary we will have an opportunity to join in special activities specifically for the Jubilee Year. Among our scheduled activities, we will attend the Papal Audience at St. Peter's Basilica, with guided tours of the Basilica of St. Peter and the Sistine Chapel. We will also visit and celebrate Mass at the Catacombs of Priscilla, where the early Christians worshipped. Our Pilgrimage will also include guided visits to The Basilicas of St. Paul Outside the Walls, St. John Lateran and the exquisite Church of Santa Maria Maggiore. It is said that Pilgrims who walk through the doors of these Holy churches during a Jubilee Year receive special graces! We will also have an opportunity to see the Pantheon, Colosseum, Piazza Navona, and throw a coin in the Trevi Fountain before traveling back to the USA or to Dubrovnik, Croatia.

▶ **Optional Extension: Medjugorje & Dubrovnik**—We arrive in Dubrovnik and travel to Medjugorje—nestled in the hills of Bosnia- Herzegovina. Medjugorje is a place of peace and prayer like no other on earth. Our time in Medjugorje will include such activities as daily Holy Mass; climbing Cross Mountain and Apparition Hill for those that are able; attending talks with the visionaries (if available); or just spending time with the locals and sharing in the faith journey of others—a true spiritual experience. From there, the final two days of our optional extension will be spent in the beautiful city of Dubrovnik, Croatia.

The Madeleine's Laudato Si' Circle and Care for Creation Ministry have joined with U. S. based recycler, Terracycle, to offer our parish, school, and community opportunities to responsibly recycle specific items (primarily plastics) not generally handled at curbside. Terracycle has added more manufacturers to its program, and in turn, we have expanded our recycling offerings. Here is a current listing of what we are collecting. Please keep this in mind:

- ▶ Do not include garbage or items not specifically mentioned in the descriptions.
- ▶ Empty containers of contents. No need to wash first; ensure packaging is dry.

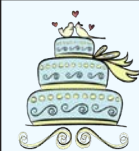

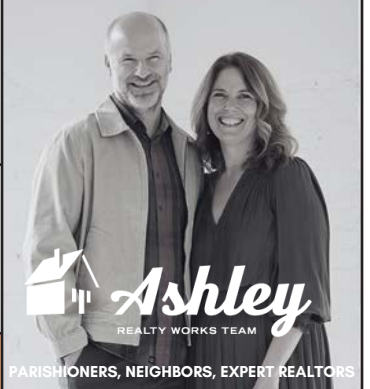

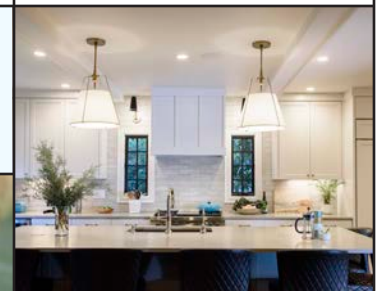
