Note from Fr. Bonaventure: Rectory Remodeling

Dear Madeleine Parishioners,

Some of you may have noticed or may have heard about some construction work going on in the rectory. I have been working these last two years to bring the rectory into a more livable environment for the priest-denizens, since we share the space with offices for our wonderful staff.

One change I am making to the rectory is to add a private kitchen for the priests. To do that, I am renovating the “butler’s nook” next to the main kitchen. We don’t need a butler, but those of us staying there need a personal kitchen. This is a norm articulated by the Archdiocese, and a felt need for the three of us who are grateful to be living here (Fr. Tim, Fr. Nazario, and I).

Secondly, upstairs in the quarters, there are three suites and a guest room. The bathroom that serves the guest room is being renovated into a laundry room, and the guest room will become a private chapel for the residents. Eventually, one of the suites will be reserved as a guest room, so that the residents can have family or a visiting priest stay in the rectory, with some measure of privacy.

I can not express how grateful I am to the Archbishop for letting me stay here, and to The Madeleine parishioners for funding this work. And I am so grateful that we have the opportunity to make the rectory a more sustainable residence for our clergy.

John F. Gossart, Jr. – United States Immigration Judge (Ret.)

John F. Gossart, Jr. is a retired Immigration Judge with over 30 years of experience on the bench in the Baltimore Immigration Court. He graduated cum laude from the University of Baltimore School of Law in 1974. He began his service with the Department of Justice in 1975 as an adjudicator with Legacy Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) and continued as a DOJ trial attorney and Deputy Assistant Commissioner. He was appointed an immigration judge in 1982 and opened the Baltimore Immigration Court. He has served as an adjunct professor for the University of Baltimore and University of Maryland Schools of Law and is active as a speaker at law schools, seminars and conferences. He served his country with distinction in the U.S. Army from 1967 to 1968. Judge Gossart is a Vietnam veteran.

Judge Gossart will be speaking on the topic of immigration law, Catholic Social

Teaching and being Catholic in the legal profession.

THE MADELEINE FAMILY REMEMBERS

Raymond Cianci

A Funeral Mass was celebrated for Ray Cianci on Friday, August 22, 11:00 am at The Madeleine.

Raymond “Big Hearted Ray Ray” Cianci was born on December 16, 1958, and from the very beginning, he had a presence that could fill a room. He was a son, a brother, a father a friend. He lived his life his way.

Raymond Cianci passed away peacefully on August 6, 2025 surrounded by family and friends. He was the son of Victor and Helen Cianci, and the brother of the late Victor Cianci, who passed away in January 2025 and whom Ray now joins in Heaven. He is survived by his brother Donald Cianci and his sister Mary Cianci-Hunter. He was the proud father of his three daughters Katelynn, Emily, and Victoria ~and though life was complicated, they were always his greatest joy. He loved his family, his friends, and the people who shared in his adventures.

Ray grew up with a quick wit, a love for conversation and a head for numbers that seemed to come so naturally. He could talk about sports for hours, tell a story like no one else, and charm his way into and out of just about anything.

He loved Italian food, especially a perfectly made meatball, a crusty frizelle and fresh-caught salmon. And if you were lucky enough to be invited to dinner with Ray, chances are he insisted on picking up the check.

Life wasn't always easy for Ray. The severe pain of rheumatoid arthritis, to the point where he could barely walk, became a constant companion. Still, he never complained. He found ways to enjoy the things that brought him comfort—a good game, a friendly bet, a drink with friends, and Frank Sinatra playing in the background. “My Way” wasn't just a song to him, it was his anthem.



Ray also faced personal struggles that caused him to miss moments and opportunities along the way. But even with his struggles, those who knew him best will tell you his heart was as big as they come.

He had a gift for making people feel seen, heard, and welcomed, no matter who they were.

Ray lived life on his own terms with humor, grit, and a little mischief. He was spirited, generous to a fault, and he could make you laugh even on the hardest days.

He left this world on August 6, 2025, too soon for those who loved him.

His story is one of joy and pain, triumph and mistakes, love and loss—but it is his story.

As the song says:

“The record shows, I took the blows — and did it my way.” Frank Sinatra

He will be missed beyond measure. There will never be another “Big Hearted Ray.”
