John F. Gossart, Jr. – United States Immigration Judge (Ret.)

John F. Gossart, Jr., is a retired Immigration Judge with over 30 years of experience on the bench in the Baltimore Immigration Court. He graduated cum laude from the University of Baltimore School of Law in 1974. He began his service with the Department of Justice in 1975 as an adjudicator with Legacy Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) and continued as a DOJ trial attorney and Deputy Assistant Commissioner. He was appointed an immigration judge in 1982 and opened the Baltimore Immigration Court. He has served as an adjunct professor for the University of Baltimore and University of Maryland Schools of Law and is active as a speaker at law schools, seminars and conferences. He served his country with distinction in the U.S. Army from 1967 to 1968. Judge Gossart is a Vietnam veteran.

Judge Gossart will be speaking on the topic of immigration law, Catholic Social

Teaching and being Catholic in the legal profession.



Brian Dooney

A Funeral Mass was celebrated for Brian Dooney on Friday, September 5, at The Madeleine.

Brian D. E. Dooney, 88, passed away peacefully on August 30, 2025, beside his beloved wife of 65 years, Margaret, his high school sweetheart and lifelong companion.

Born on July 4, 1937, in Portland, Oregon, Brian was the eldest of three sons of Dan and Helen Dooney. He is survived by his wife Margaret; children Mary Ann, Kathleen (Jon Niedermeyer), Tim (Dena), and Michael; 17 grandchildren; and three great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by sons Dan and Sean (Sheri), and his brother Kevin.

Brian graduated from Columbia Prep High School and earned his degree from the University of Oregon, where he was a proud member of Phi Delta Theta. He joined his father-in-law's agency, Leonard Adams Company, later becoming President. Over 6 decades, he helped grow the family business, working alongside his brothers, sons, in-laws, and eventually, his grandson.

Along with his love of skiing, fly fishing, and travel, he was also an avid golfer and enjoyed many years on the course with his friends, affectionately known as the Riverside Rats. He created beloved family traditions, especially at his beach house for 4th of July and at the family cabin for a magical, annual Christmas Eve celebration. Brian relished telling stories that were part truth, part Blarney—but always wildly entertaining. His ability to captivate an audience made every



gathering memorable.

A devout Catholic, Brian never missed Sunday Mass and lived his faith through daily prayer. He and Margaret joined the Madeleine community, enrolling their children in the grade school. A philanthropic man, his quiet generosity touched many lives as he supported causes close to his heart.

Above all, Brian's greatest love was Margaret. Married for 65 years, their devotion was a lasting testament to faith, family, and enduring love.
