THE MADELEINE FAMILY REMEMBERS

Huston Bunce

Funeral Mass • Friday, October 3, 11 am

A Funeral Mass will be celebrated for Huston Bunce on Friday, October 3, 11:00 am at The Madeleine.

Huston Hiatt Bunce Jr. left this world on August 17, 2025, no doubt on his way to catch a Duck game in the sky. Though his departure was unexpected, the joy, laughter and wisdom he shared will remain forever etched in the hearts of those who knew him.

Born in Astoria, Oregon, Huston was a proud third-generation Oregonian. He grew up in Portland's Laurelhurst neighborhood, where he attended All Saints Catholic School, Columbia Prep, and Central Catholic High School. He treasured the friendships he formed in these communities throughout his life.

Huston continued his education at the University of Oregon. While at the U of O, he became a proud brother of Phi Delta Theta fraternity and cheered passionately (sometimes loudly) for the Ducks. However, his most important endeavor while at the U of O was courting the love of his life, Elizabeth Ann Crommelin, and beginning a partnership that would span decades.

After college, Huston swapped green and yellow for Navy dress blues. He proudly served as a commissioned officer, completing two tours in the Western Pacific and several years of stateside duty. He carried out his military service with great pride. He later graduated from the American School of International Management ("Thunderbird"), launching his career in international business.



Known affectionately as "Poppi" by his grandchildren, he was a devoted husband, father and grandfather. He celebrated every achievement, whether on the field, in the classroom or on life's stage as if it were the Rose Bowl. If you needed a cheerleader, a chauffeur, or a life coach with strong opinions, Poppi was your man.

He leaves behind his beloved Elizabeth; his children Kathryn (Tom Hunt), Amy, John, and Sarah; and his grandchildren Tommy, Oscar, Sam, Emmalena, Annabella, Cameron, Henry, and Audrey—each of whom inherited a little of his sparkle, humor, and stubborn Duck loyalty.

In lieu of flowers, the family suggests three tributes Huston would approve of: make a donation to the Monsignor Timothy Murphy Scholarship Program at Central Catholic High School, raise a glass with family and friends, or yell "Go Ducks!" loud enough for him to hear.

TIPS FOR GREEN LIVING

What is the most environmentally-friendly fabric? Clothing is usually made of cotton or polyester. On the one hand, polyester comes from the petrochemical industry; on the other, cotton is grown under very polluting conditions. It requires large amounts of pesticides and water (one pair of jeans can require 10,000 liters of water). The best thing is to buy organically-grown cotton clothing. Other fabrics include linen, hemp cloth, and bamboo. Linen comes from the flax plant, which has been grown since Biblical times, and is very absorbent. Hemp is a robust plant that was grown by our ancestors and does not need pesticides. Hemp clothing is very durable. Bamboo is an excellent substitute for cotton: it grows quickly, without pesticides, is durable and naturally antiseptic. It is particularly good for underwear and handkerchiefs.

Teens & Screens

A discussion of the effects of electronic screen use on young people

Over the past two decades, nearly every measure of young people's wellbeing has declined. Rates of anxiety, depression, ADHD symptoms, and motivational struggles have risen, alongside growing loneliness and social isolation. Between 2007 and 2021, suicide deaths among 10- to 24-year-olds increased by 62%. Increasingly, researchers and practitioners are pointing to a clear culprit: interactive screen use—especially smartphones—plays a significant role in this downward trend. Are screens a key reason so many young people are struggling to flourish? And is it time for parents and schools to change course?

of experience working with young people and their families to reverse the negative effects of screens on their lives. 
