Next Saturday, October 18 • After 5:00 pm Mass • \$10–\$12 Per Bowl

We realize sometimes it can be tough to get the family to Mass on Sunday mornings. On Saturday evening it can be a challenge to attend Mass, then get home and feed a hungry family. We have a solution.

On October 18, we're continuing our wildly successful Madeleine Saturday Supper series, which regularly sells out after our 5 pm Mass. A delicious, cost effective supper for Madeleine families to take home after Mass.

This month, we're offering authentic, Vietnamese Pho, packaged up to take home for your evening dinner. Just \$10 per bowl with tofu, \$12 per bowl with chicken or with beef brisket—all with vegetarian broth. Proceeds this month to benefit our Faith Formation and Sacramental Prep ministries. *A note about the packaging: meals are provided in reusable, dishwasher- and microwave-safe containers.*



Infant Baptisms and OCIC





In Memoriam

THE MADELEINE FAMILY REMEMBERS

Robert W. Burke

A Funeral Mass will be celebrated for Madeleine parishioner Bob Burke on Friday, October 17, 11:00 am, at The Madeleine.

Ninety-six years - oh what a wonderful life Bob (Bobby to his wife and friends) passed into Heaven, early evening on Friday, September 19th at Legacy Good Samaritan Hospital.

A humble, kind, gentle man as well as a gentleman who lived the beatitudes. He was compassionate. He loved his mother very much and with that came his respect for all women. He felt woman to be equal to all men. He did not try to impress, as such, he was a man whose taste was for the fundamental, the genuine, the important things.

Bob graduated from Milwaukie Union High School in 1947, and married me, his high school sweetheart in 1949. The Korean War caught him and he served in the Navy Air for two years after already having two years in the reserves at Swan Island here in Portland. He hopped from San Diego, CA. to Norman, OK. where I joined him, and we traveled to his final battle station at Patuxent River Naval Air Test Center in Patuxent River, Maryland. Upon his discharge Bob was asked to re-enlist for four years which included officer's school. He declined and we came back to Portland and served another 2 years in the reserves. In 1959 he graduated from the University of Portland with a Bachelor of Science in Industrial Administration. We decided to skip graduation and take a trip of a lifetime! Bob and I sailed to Europe on the Italian Ship, Cristofaro Columbo, which was the largest merchant ship in the Italian service. Maria Callas was in first class, while we were with others on the lower decks (google her if you do not know who she is). We left New York just as a big storm was hitting the Atlantic, but it was so calm at first, and I thought "how great is this?" Then the storm hit and we were too far out to return to New York. We headed right into it. Most of the passengers on the ship were ill and Bob, along with 5 other people were the only ones who could make it to the dining room. As the ship creaked and groaned from the pounding it was taking, all I could think of was the voyage of the Andrea Doria, the sister ship, which had tragically sunk only three years before. The older Italians who were on their way home to Italy, vacated their cabins in steerage for the upper decks and slept on the floors along the corridors. A week later, as we sailed past the Azores in beautiful sunshine, we all knew we would make it to our destination, Genoa.

Genoa, a home to our relatives, and Fiats! We purchased a little 500 blue convertible Fiat. A car that gave a walker the uphill Advantage. Yet, for four months, we toured through Italy, France, San Marino, Austria, Switzerland, Germany, Belgium, Liechtenstein, Ireland and England. The Fiat served us well. We Even had it shipped from London to New York and drove it out west to Portland touring for another month in the States. What a trip! And this whetted our appetites to continue traveling ... which we did for almost 60 years and saw the world. Upon our return,

Bob's first post university position was at Montgomery Wards as an Industrial Engineer, in which he discovered that time and motion studies were not his calling. He was hired by Pacific Power and Light in downtown Portland as an accountant. He had finally found his niche. From then on he stayed with accounting. But his career was only second to his life.

In his younger years, golf was his pleasure. We took golfing vacations on the various courses in Portland, going up and down the Oregon coast. When a Spanish exchange student was with us one summer, a lovely young girl and her younger sister, she made a drive longer than his. Bob decided to hang up his golfing glove, which gave him more time to focus on marathons.


During one of his first-time marathons, he was trying to make an impressive finish for his own satisfaction when he spied someone having a difficult time. So, he stopped to help that person, totally forgetting the task he had set for himself. The other person just meant more to him at that time. That perfectly captures his spirit. He had a way of turning even a small moment into something special. Full of joy for the other marathoner.

Not only did Bob accumulate medals from his marathons, he was also recognized for his service with the Lloyd Lions, and awards from the Multnomah Athletic Club. His heart was always with the underdog. Along with his good friends Joe Weston, Bud Reynolds and others from the Lloyd Lions, they would serve food to those unfortunate people who otherwise would not have eaten. Also, he gave approximately 17+ years volunteering for AARP doing taxes for those less fortunate.

Bob kept his personal life and inner thoughts private. I know I said he never wanted recognition, but I could not help but share the Bob I know and love. He was my playful Irish Elf, with twinkling blue eyes and beaming smile. And that beaming smile - the one we all know so well - is a memory I will hold forever, a reminder to find joy even in difficult times.

Each night, our last words to each other were the Italian Buona Notte, Ti Amo, Dormi Bene.

Good night - I love you - Sleep Well.

Teens & Screens

A discussion of the effects of electronic screen use on young people

Over the past two decades, nearly every measure of young people's wellbeing has declined. Rates of anxiety, depression, ADHD symptoms, and motivational struggles have risen, alongside growing loneliness and social isolation. Between 2007 and 2021, suicide deaths among 10- to 24-year-olds increased by 62%. Increasingly, researchers and practitioners are pointing to a clear culprit: interactive screen use—especially smartphones—plays a significant role in this downward trend. Are screens a key reason so many young people are struggling to flourish? And is it time for parents and schools to change course?

of experience working with young people and their families to reverse the negative effects of screens on their lives. Dr. Dunckley will explore the cognitive, emotional, and behavioral problems caused by excessive screen use, especially on young people, and discuss why the month-long "screen detox" she leads her patients through has been so successful in reversing these effects.

She is an internationally recognized expert on the impact of screen-time on the developing brain, and a leading voice regarding screen-time's influence on misdiagnosis and overprescribing in children.


