## SCAM ALERT

More emails and texts fraudulently claiming to be from Father Bonaventure have been received by some parishioners and staff.

Email and text message scams such as this are proliferating not only in our Archdiocese, but nationwide.

First, the victim receives a fake text or email from a fraudster impersonating Fr. Bonaventure saying, “I need a favor from you,” or similar.

If the victim replies to the text, the fraudster may ask for iTunes or Google Play gift cards or other difficult to trace/easy to redeem methods, for some need that sounds charitable or legitimate. Problem is, it's neither.

### A few ways to know it's fraud:

- ▶ Father B—or anyone on your parish or school staffs—**will never ask you to purchase gift cards and send them the numbers.**
- ▶ **The email address or text number is wrong.** Fr. Bonaventure will only send emails via his parish address: [fatherbonaventure@themadeleine.edu](mailto:fatherbonaventure@themadeleine.edu)
- ▶ **Also note:** sometimes these texts are faked to be from other people you may know...parishioners, friends, etc.

If you are ever in doubt as to whether a request for money or assistance is legitimate, call the School or Parish Office during work hours.

## THE MADELEINE FAMILY REMEMBERS

### Ann Dufour

**Funeral Mass • Friday, November 7, 11:00 am**

A Funeral Mass will be celebrated for Madeleine parishioner Ann Dufour on Friday, November 7, 11:00 am, at The Madeleine.

Angelann Dufour was born in Corpus Christi, Texas on January 30, 1948, second daughter to William and Rosemary McIntosh.

A father in the Navy had Ann rolling at an early age—stops in San Diego, San Francisco and Japan highlighted her adolescent years. Eventually finding her way back to the south, she attended Louisiana Tech University and caught the eye of a confident senior named Bruce Dufour. She always said, “I knew he was the one right away!”

The two were married in April of 1969 and remained inseparable for 52 years. Literally hours after her wedding, Ann was whisked away to start a new life in Cincinnati. A brief layover in Detroit landed her in Cadillac, Michigan, where she successfully raised two children who remain forever grateful for her unconditional love and support. Thirteen years later, a move to Carmel, Indiana sparked a new devotion to opportunities within the Catholic Church.

She was extremely proud of her work as the president of the St. Margaret’s Hospital Guild Decorators’ Show House, a collaborative project showcasing historical houses and local contractors to raise money for people in need of medical treatment.



Ann and Bruce thrived in Indiana, where they shared some of their happiest years together. Retirement saw a brief stop in Florida before settling in Portland to be close to her children. After losing her husband, Ann soon fell victim to Alzheimer’s.

She spent the last four years of her life comfortably surrounded by the most compassionate caregivers one could ever hope for. Ann was fun and sassy, she loved animals, enjoyed a good tennis match, always had a hidden candy stash, and wasn’t afraid to cry during a good song. Until her last days, she could always bring a smile to anyone’s face.

Ann is survived by her son Brian, daughter Nicole, and sister, Cherlyn McIntosh.



# ALL SAINTS

# ALL SOULS



## *We Are Called to Holiness of Life*


For centuries prior to Vatican Council II (1962–65), the common understanding of saints identified those men and women whom the Church had singled out as exemplary Christians and whose names had been listed in the official list of saints. They had been “canonized” and were privileged with the official title of *Saint*.

But the Bishops gathered at Vatican II recognized that through our baptism, each of us was called to be holy (1 Cor 1:2) so we are all meant to be holy women and men—saints. “All the faithful of Christ of whatever rank or status are called to the fullness of the Christian life and to the perfection of charity. By this holiness a more human way of life is promoted even in this earthly society” (*Dogmatic Constitution on the Church*, #40).

While at first we might think that this was a new teaching, we now realize that it was an attempt to re-emphasize the ancient mentality of the earli-

est Christians. From its very beginning, the Church understood the Body of Christ to encompass all baptized persons, both the living and the dead. Christ’s kingdom transcends time and space, and not even death can sever the relationship that the faithful have in Christ. All are united in a mystical communion with Christ (the “communion of saints” that we affirm whenever we proclaim the Creed at Mass) by virtue of baptism (1 Cor 6:11). St. Paul often addresses those to whom he writes as “holy ones” (saints) to designate all baptized Christians (see Rom 1:7, 15:25; 2 Cor 1:1; Eph 1:1; Phil 1:1).

And in fact the call to be holy in God’s covenant community goes back even further to the Old Testament to God’s instruction to Moses on Mt. Sinai to “Speak to the whole Israelite community and tell them: Be holy, for I, the LORD your God, am holy” (Lev 19:2). Thus being in a relationship with God obliges us at its most basic level to be holy, to be saints.



## All Saints' Day November 1

This feast, honoring all the saints of the Church, known and unknown, provides an opportunity to reflect on our personal call to holiness and to celebrate the exemplary faithfulness of holy men and women of every place and time, whose lives and deeds continue to inspire us.

## All Souls Day November 2

This feast remembers the many nameless and forgotten persons like our deceased family and friends who led us to Christ and into the communion of his mystical Body. It purposely follows All Saints' Day to shift our focus from the recognized saints to ordinary people, especially those who might need our prayers. From the earliest times, Christians prayed for the dead and many monasteries adopted the tradition of remembering all the faithful departed. Eventually this custom spread throughout Europe and was included into the Church's liturgical calendar.

## HONORING SAINTS IN THE EARLY CHURCH

Honoring saints began in the early Church by remembering the martyrs who by their courageous witness had imitated Jesus' faithfulness to God's ways even to death. Local churches kept a record of their own martyrs and each year set aside certain days to remember and celebrate their "birthdays," the dates of death when they were "born" into eternal life.

Their practice is illustrated today in the First Eucharistic Prayer of our Mass, which was the standard prayer adopted in the eighth century liturgical renewal of the Holy Roman Emperor Charlemagne. After Mary and the apostles, the prayer recalls the men and women martyrs of the first three centuries, "Linus, Cletus, Clement, Sixtus, Cornelius, Lawrence, Chrysogonus, John and Paul, Cosmos and Damian, Ignatius, Alexander, Marcellinus, Peter, Felicity, Perpetua, Agatha, Lucy, Agnes, Cecilia, Anastasia and all the saints." By the fourth century many parts of the Church had set aside special days to remember not only their distinguished martyrs but also "confessors" (those who had witnessed and been punished for their faith but did not die), virgins and those whose example was especially helpful for becoming better Christians.

The many local lists of these exemplary saints grew and soon included persons from all walks of life—popes and bishops, clergy, religious and laity, men, women, and children (e.g., the holy Innocents Dec 28), single and married. Finally in 1583 they were collected into a single book called the *Roman Martyrology*, the official list of saints venerated by the Church arranged according to the calendar. Additions to the list are made when new saints are officially beatified and canonized and the days for their memorial are determined.



## PRAYING TO THE SAINTS

From the earliest times, Christians believed that members of the Christian community, though separated by death but now alive in Christ, were still able to help one another. "Being more closely united to Christ, those who dwell in heaven fix the whole Church more firmly in holiness. They do not cease to intercede with the Father for us, as they proffer the merits which they acquired on earth through the one mediator between God and humanity, Christ Jesus. So by their fraternal concern is our weakness greatly helped" (*Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, #49*). Thus the importance of the saints as intercessors for us with God became more popular.

The identification of saints as mediators with God introduces their role as patron saints, that is, one to whom we can go when we have specific needs that require help. Saints are designated as patrons or special advocates for nations, churches, places, crafts, activities, jobs, classes, clans, families, illnesses, causes, etc. Most patrons have been so designated as the result of popular devotion and long-standing custom. The Church has officially designated rather few patrons, and most patron designations, especially more recent ones, are unofficial.


