William Glynn Roberson

A Funeral Mass will be celebrated for longtime Madeleine parishioner Glynn Roberson on Wednesday, January 14, 11:00 am, at The Madeleine. A Rosary will precede the Mass at 10:30 am.

William Glynn Roberson Jr. passed away peacefully on December 21, 2025, at the age of 90, surrounded by his family and his wife of 69 years, Mary Alice.

Dr. Roberson was born in San Antonio, Texas, on July 29, 1935, the oldest of five children of Willie Glynn and Florence Roberson. He moved with his family from Dallas, Texas, to Portland, Oregon, in 1949. He is survived by his wife, Mary Alice; children Catherine (Kevin McAllister) and William (Savannah); grandchildren Morgan (Sergio Martinez), Liam, and Caleb Reid; and two great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his brother Clay and sister Joyce.


Glynn graduated from Parkrose High School in 1953, lettering in football, basketball, and baseball. He attended the University of Oregon, where he played football and was a member of the Phi Delta Theta fraternity. He graduated from the University of Oregon Dental School in 1960. Following dental school, Glynn served as a captain in the U.S. Air Force, stationed at Edwards Air Force Base in California. Moving back to Oregon in 1964, he set up his dental practice in Northeast Portland, where he practiced until

his retirement in 2000.

Most of Glynn's friends called him "Garcia" or "Doc," and he loved giving them nicknames as well, especially his Phi Delt brothers. He loved to entertain, and his parties and dancing were legendary. His love of sports lasted a lifetime, with favorites including racquetball, golf, and U of O football. Glynn also loved gardening and tormenting friends with hundreds of emails.

Nothing was more treasured by Glynn than time spent with his best friend, Mary Alice; his family; his friends; and, of course, his wife's Irish relatives.

Active memberships included the Multnomah Athletic Club and Riverside Golf and Country Club, where he served on numerous committees and both boards; The Auld Lang Syne Society, U of O Booster Club, Phi Delta Theta, and the Oregon Dental Association.

Patricia Gayle Gianotti (née Moran), born on December 6, 1932, in Eugene, Oregon, passed away peacefully on December 6, 2025, in Portland, Oregon, on her 93rd birthday. A devoted wife, mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother, Patricia's life was marked by her unwavering faith and commitment to her family and community.

After graduating from Eugene High School in 1950, Patricia pursued a nursing degree from Providence Nursing School, graduating in June of 1954. Her career began as a registered nurse, a role she cherished until she shifted her focus to raising and nurturing her family. Patricia married Wilton Andrew (Bill) Gianotti on November 6, 1954 at The Madeleine, and together they embarked on a journey that included multiple moves across the United States due to Bill's career with Crown Zellerbach. Settling finally in Bend, Oregon, in 1985, Patricia's life was filled with the laughter and love of her 10 children. It was a true blessing to become their Mom, House Manager and Nurse and Pat excelled at it.

Patricia was always involved in her local Catholic Church, where she taught CCD and volunteered with the Red Cross to teach parenting classes. Known for her artistic talents, Patricia enjoyed sewing, quilting, needlepoint, and knitting, often creating

clothes and crafts for her family and community. Her baking skills were renowned, especially her homemade cinnamon rolls, which were a local favorite featured in the Lake Oswego Review. Pat and Bill spent countless hours at the ball parks, fields and courts cheering on the family as they competed in a myriad of activities. She packed countless lunches for a day of skiing on Mt. Hood; planned trips to the cabin in Sunriver for biking, swimming and skiing on Mt. Bachelor; and in later years enjoyed long, peaceful walks in Bend.

Patricia leaves behind a legacy of love and devotion. She is survived by her children, Mike (Sandy), Marypat Friedman (Jay), Paul (Gretchen), Anne Wallace, Nancy Castonguay (Brian), Stephen, Susan, John, Mark (Jennifer), and Kathleen Kadlec (Tim); 21 grandchildren; and 18 great-grandchildren. A Funeral Mass will be celebrated for longtime Madeleine parishioner Sharen Rees on Friday, January 16, 11:00 am, at The Madeleine.

Sharen Lea Rees was born to Robert “Bob” and Sally DuBois on May 9, 1942. The first of 3 children, she is survived by her brother Dan DuBois of Bradford, PA, and preceded in death by her other brother Robert “Butch” Dubois formerly of Toledo, OH.

She married James “Jim” Adelbert Rees on May 22, 1965, in Bradford, PA and gave birth to her sons, Doug, Bob and Brad Rees. She also had four grandchildren she adored, Sidney Leigh, Christen James, Ellie Katherine and Katri Celestine-Slavin Rees. She also had great adoration for her 3 daughters-in-law, Diana, Nancy, and Marci. Jim and Sharen were married for 59 years before Jim passed away on June 7th, 2024.

Sharen grew up in Bradford PA, worked briefly at the city’s hospital before moving to Washington DC to work at a bank and subsequently met her future husband. Sharen always referred to Bradford as “the sticks” and although she missed her family terribly upon moving, she had no desire to raise a family in a rural setting. She quickly embraced city living, the dining, the dancing and the multitude of friends she made along the way. She never had problems making friends despite self-identifying as a recluse growing up.

When raising her family, she eked out just enough time to paint with oils. She produced numerous works of art, that hung in the house during their 53-year run living in NE Portland.

Sharen loved watching sports, particularly her sons playing football, basketball, and baseball. She loved the Blazers and Redskins (now Commanders) too, just as her husband had.

Sharen also sung in the choir at The Madeleine, she had a beautiful voice that rang out when singing God’s praises. Dolly Parton was a close second, however. She loved Dolly Parton and the music and humanitarian work she produced.

After discovering more freedom following her sons’ departures, she worked as a Visiting Nurse for pennies on the dollar, but enjoyed every one of the clients she served, almost to a fault. She made no distinctions between wealth, race or creed, no matter whom she came across, they were children of God.

Her faith in the Catholic church and her parish, The Madeleine ran deep. She participated in bible study and enjoyed the flavorful conversations with her fellow parishioners here. She made a strong effort to attend mass for as long as she was able, with Father Bonaventure giving her a final blessing in late November before passing in the early morning hours of December 6.

The Madeleine's Laudato Si' Circle and Care for Creation Ministry have joined with U. S. based recycler, Terracycle, to offer our parish, school, and community opportunities to responsibly recycle specific items (primarily plastics) not generally handled at curbside. Terracycle has added more manufacturers to its program, and in turn, we have expanded our recycling offerings. Here is a current listing of what we are collecting. Please keep this in mind:

- ▶ Do not include garbage or items not specifically mentioned in the descriptions.
- ▶ Empty containers of contents. No need to wash first; ensure packaging is dry.

SCAM ALERT

More emails and texts fraudulently claiming to be from Father Bonaventure have been received by some parishioners and staff.

Email and text message scams such as this are proliferating not only in our Archdiocese, but nationwide.

First, the victim receives a fake text or email from a fraudster impersonating Fr. Bonaventure saying, "I need a favor from you," or similar.

If the victim replies to the text, the fraudster may ask for iTunes or Google Play gift cards or other difficult to trace/easy to redeem methods, this time purporting to "surprise some of our wonderful staff members."

A few ways to know it's fraud:

- ▶ Father B—or anyone on your parish or school staffs—**will never ask you to purchase gift cards and send them the numbers.**
- ▶ **The email number or text number is wrong.** Fr. Bonaventure will only send emails via his parish address: fatherbonaventure@themadeleine.edu
- ▶ Also note: sometimes these texts are faked to be from other people you may know...parishioners, friends, etc.

If you are ever in doubt as to whether a request for money or assistance is legitimate, call the School or Parish Office during work hours.
